Is the season half over already?!

Wow how the time flies! July is behind us; with only one month left of the Peak Season. The weather has been mighty dramatic this year; heat waves, droughts, and then finally torrential downpours, we really have seen it all. Mother Nature still rules!! While we start to reflect on this summer, we have some very exciting news for next summer. For some time now, we have been considering transitioning out of the short term rental business, and converting to a strictly **Seasonal Site Only Campground**. That transition has now started!!

We are no longer taking bookings on "E" sites for the 2019 season, and have created 11 new seasonal sites for that area, with 5 of them being waterfront!!

We will be offering our Northlander and General Coach trailers as your first option to secure one of these sites. Simply order your new trailer now (deposit required) and it can be on site and set up for the May Long Weekend 2019 (balance owing due in the spring of 2019).

As further incentive, we will be offering a 10% discount off of the price of your new trailer if you order it by September 30 2018. So if you have been pondering purchasing a new trailer, contact Eric or Wes for all of the details!

This transition continues with the sale of two of our Rental RV units. RVE02 and RVB03 will be available to purchase as of this fall 2018. Keep your eyes on the website to see when those become available, as both are prime waterfront locations!

As we continue to transition over the next few years, the next phase of our plan is to include the demolition of cottages 7, 8, 9, and 10. Phase 3 will see the fall of cottages 11 and 12, and finally we will convert the "D" sites into long term seasonal sites.

Coming to a close, we would like to thank all of our overnight campers who have stayed with us over the years, and we are so grateful that we have been able to provide your families with memories that will never be forgotten. To our seasonal guests, we hope that you share in our excitement about this new journey we are embarking on!

Tents on Site for the Volleyball Tournament

Every year on Volleyball weekend (August 10-12 2018), Cedar Cove Resort allows the seasonal guests to pitch a tent on their site for their volleyball players. Each site is able to pitch **1** tent on their site for up to 4 adults for \$20/night. Seasonal guests must contact Reception by no later than Friday August 10 8pm to register the tent for their site. Seasonal guests are responsible for any guests staying in a tent on their site, and ensure that their guests follow the Rules and Policies of Cedar Cove Resort and respect curfew and quiet times.

Hydro Bills

Hydro bills were out on July 7th and are due to be paid by Tuesday August 7th. You are able to pay your hydro bill in Reception by cash, debit, credit, or personal cheque OR you may choose pay over the phone by Visa or MasterCard by calling 613-623-3133.

Past due bills will incur a late fee of the greater amount of \$3 or 3%.

The next hydro reading will be done in early September.

DO NOT REFUEL YOUR BOATS WHILE IN YOUR SLIP!

It has been brought to our attention that some boaters are fueling up on their slip. Although the likelihood of the static actually creating an explosion is minimal, it could happen. If you are not concerned about your own safety, be concerned about the safety of others. Please feel free to moor to the gas dock to refill from your jerry cans. That dock is well grounded and specifically designed to handle flammable fuels.

Firewood

Bagged Firewood is available for purchase in the **Store** for \$10/bag (taxes included).

Facecords of Firewood may be ordered in Reception before the Sunday of any given week.

Orders placed **Sunday before 11am** will ensure delivery of the wood by the following **Saturday**.

A full facecord of wood costs \$130+tax (comes to \$146.90).

Renewals 2019!!

You are able to renew at any time during our hours of operation while Carol or Kayla are in the office! Getting your renewal done early is great; you may be eligible for an early payment discount on your seasonal rate AND you can enjoy your whole summer without having to worry about renewing before you leave in the fall!

There are **3** ways to renew!

1- You may choose to pay in full by cheque, debit or credit (credit transaction incur a 4% charge on renewal fees).

From June 29 to July 31 you could receive a discount of 3.5%-3.9% .

2- You may wish to pay with 3 equal cheques!

The first cheque is dated for the date that you renew, the second for January 1st, and the third for April 30th.

3- You may also choose to pay by pre-authorized debit, where we split your total site fees and other renewal charges into 12 equal payments that comes out on the 20th of each month from October 2018 to September 2019.

You can choose any of these options for your renewal! If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask us in Reception!

The deadline to renew is **September 15**, but please try not to leave your renewal until September.

Renewals done after September 15th 2018 will incur a \$50 late registration fee.

This year when you renew, we will go through a new/updated License of Occupation.

Campfire Safety Rules

This year we have been on and off of a Fire Ban. The grass is still dry in most areas, and the risk is still there. We take fire safety very seriously, as we lost our old lodge to a fire in 2011, so we appreciate our guests taking extra care and caution while having a campfire. There have been so many forest fires in Ontario this Summer, and we do not wish to join that list. We are guests in this beautiful forest that is home to so many magnificent animals!

Here are some ways to use care while having a campfire:

- If it's too windy, don't have a fire! Wind gusts can be unpredictable and even a small breeze can cause a fire to spread quickly to dry areas or YOU.
 - Keep a "circle of safety" around the campfire. This area should be about 4 feet around the campfire and children should not be allowed inside the "circle of safety". Take a minute to explain to children that fire is dangerous and the campfire area is not a playground.
 - When it is time to end the campfire fun make sure to apply enough water so that the entire pit and its contents are cool.
- Smokey Bear says "If it is too hot to touch it is too hot to leave".
- Never leave your fire unattended, or leave children or pets unattended with a fire.
 - NEVER USE FLAMMABLE LIQUID TO IGNITE YOUR FIRE! Please avoid gasoline, lighter fluid, diesel fuel or any other flammable liquids to prevent serious accidents and injuries. Keep all aerosol cans of Bug Spray at a safe distance from your fire.
- "Quick-Wicks" are available for a very reasonable price in the **Store**.
- Keep a bucket of water and a fire extinguisher nearby in case of emergencies and teach children to stop, drop, and roll, if their clothing ever catches fire. This can happen when a hefty amount of bug spray is on your clothing, the heat from being too close to your campfire can cause your clothing to ignite.
 - Keep your fire at a **manageable size** (suggested size is 2ft x 2ft x 2ft).
 - **Never** burn household garbage in your fire pit.

Please note the signs that have been posted in and around the Wash House. Washing machines are **cold wash** only. Bleach is not permitted in any of our washing machines. Washers take 1 loonie 3 quarters, driers take 1 loonie 1 quarter.

When our "Closed for Cleaning" sign is out, please be respectful of our staff and use the **Pool Washroom**, or wait for our staff to complete the tasks that they have been assigned.

Cleaning the Wash House should not take more than 45 minutes. We appreciate your patience and understanding!

Just a few reminders...

These reminders are important for all guests of Cedar Cove Resort, both Seasonal Guests (old and seasoned) and all of our overnight campers!

- **Quiet hours** are 11pm to 9am every night with the exception of Saturdays; 12midnight – 10am Sundays. *“Youth’s under the age of 19 and other persons who are not the Principal Occupants of a site are to be under the direct supervision of the Principal Occupants during “Quiet Hours””* – Long Term Brochure.
- Keep your septic system happy ☺ be sure to pour SEPTO-CLEAN down your toilet! For sale in the **Store!**
- Be sure to **watch your speed** in the park! The speed limit is **15km/hr!!** This time of year children will be playing outside, biking and running around, and we need to be watchful!
- *“By law, every cyclist under age 18 must wear an approved helmet. **Riders under 16 years old:** a parent or guardian must make sure their child wears a helmet.”* Service Ontario Publications.
- **Open Alcohol:** Cedar Cove Resort is not a licensed facility, so open alcohol is not permitted off of your site at any time, so please refrain from walking around the park with alcohol (in the bottle or in the can).
- Use only **1-ply toilet paper** during your stay at Cedar Cove Resort! We have rolls for sale in the Store.
- **Drinking and Driving:** Cedar Cove Resort does not tolerate drinking and driving in any motorized vehicle (this includes golf carts and boats). For the safety of the children, pets, and other adults in the park, please **never** drink and drive. We do not want to have any accidents.
The police patrolled the water quite often last year, and we hope that they will be out again this year, ensuring the safety of people on the water as well!
- For safety reasons, please **wear shoes or sandals** if you are leaving your site.
Shoes and shirts should be worn to enter the Store, Lodge, and The Lakeside Grill.
- **No fireworks, firecrackers, or floating lanterns are permitted on Cedar Cove Resort property at any time.**
- The Ottawa Sun and The Ottawa Citizen are available in the Store 6 days a week! (No Sunday paper).

- Please help yourself to the **FREE MULCH** at the other end of the park! Follow Cedar Cove Road (main road) to the boat trailer storage area! You will see our beautiful pile of mulch that is yours to take, free of charge!
- Purchase your **Radio Bingo** card in the **Store**. Bingo takes place on Thursdays at 7pm on 98.7 Valley Heritage Radio.

- Pete’s RV Sales and Service is available for roof repairs!

- **FREE Compost** is available at the Leaf Pile! See Map of Cedar Cove for location!

- **Poop-bags for pets** are available for purchase in the store. Please use the garbage can at your site, at the dump, or the outdoor garbage cans located in front of **Reception** and the **Store**.
Do not use the garbage can in the Wash house, as this makes the entire Wash house smell like poop.
- **FIRE BAN INFORMATION** Although we are not in a fire ban at the moment (as of August 3rd), we want to remind our guests of the fire ban rules. **In the past** we were able to allow our campers to have campfires during a fire ban if they followed a certain set of rules that the fire chief had put in place. Lanark Highlands now has a new fire chief, who has set in place new rules.
We are no longer able to allow our guests to have a campfire during a fire ban. If there are any guests who do not comply with this rule, Cedar Cove Resort can receive a fine of up to \$1000. The guest who is found to have disregarded this rule, will then be fined the same amount by Cedar Cove Resort. On top of the fine, failure to comply could result in financial responsibility for any costs incurred in fighting a forest fire, if one does occur, as well as a sentence of 3 months in jail.
When a fire ban is set in place, signs are posted on each door of the lodge, at the wash house, at the gate, as well as posted to the website (www.cedarcove.ca) and our Facebook page!
We want all of our guests to have a phenomenal stay with us at Cedar Cove Resort, and understand that having a campfire is one of the great things about camping, but during a fire ban we are unable to allow you to have a fire, period . For more information please visit www.ontario.ca.
