ORGANIZATIONAL CHART EXPLANATION IN BRIEF... (See Separate Page for Chart)

Alamo Rec-Veh Park's Organization (Org) Chart is designed for everyone who is involved in any way with a specific event, activity or group. It will give all park residents a sense of how everything works and who to contact if they have questions or concerns.

There are no longer boards or clubs *except* the Alamo Rec-Veh Park Activity Club Board. Almost everything falls under this board's jurisdiction.

For example, on the Alamo Rec-Veh Org Chart: If the gun range and RC tracks, copters or boats group members have a question or a problem, they would first go to their respective coordinator. If he or she could not resolve the issue or answer the question, that coordinator would go to David Langseth. If for any reason he could not solve the issue, then <u>he</u> would come see the park manager.

Top coordinators will give a report to the Activity Club Board on the second Monday of the month. (On the Friday before that meeting, the coordinators are required to turn in their written report to the Activity Club Board President Bob Hurd.) At the Monday meeting the coordinator of each group will come to the meeting to review their written report with the Board, and then they will be excused. This way if Activity Club Board members have questions, they can get an immediate answer, and everyone will have a better idea of what is happening.

We believe this org chart is an excellent tool to advance our park's organization. We are not finished with it yet, so watch for updates. There will be more to come.

- Jan. 9 -- 1st Clue given for "Mystery Quilt" -Bring your supplies and be prepared to start work on this project. The goal is to get your quilt top done before you go home for the summer. Mystery quilt (approx. 42"x50") is great for large prints to be fussy cut into 6-1/2" blocks. Avoid one-way designs. Supply list to bring: 1-1/4 yards large print or Focus fabric, one yard coordinating fabric that reads solid, one yard light background fabric, ½ yard contrasting coordinating fabric for small border.
- Jan. 16 -- ID Holder by Linda Albin Bring one fat quarter, one 5"x3-3/4" clear 8 or 10-gauge plastic, and one 7" zipper that matches the fat quarter. I have some clear plastic I will bring to share.
- Jan. 23 -- Short Sleeve Sweatshirt by Candy **Schuster** – Bring one sweatshirt in your size, four large buttons (at least 1" in diameter), four smaller buttons (1/2" to 3/4" in size), three small pieces of coordinating fabrics (at least 8"x8" in size), a small piece of doublesided fusible interfacing such as Heat and Bond.
- Jan. 30 -- Wreath by Nancy Afeld Bring a 12" or 16" wire wreath ring, one roll of 6" or 10" wide mesh, one roll of coordinating ribbon, one large pkg. matching pipe cleaners, ruler, rotary cutter or scissors, and decorative pieces such as floral stems to decorate your wreath. (Hobby Lobby has a nice selection of

mesh and everything you need. The mesh is usually ½ *price there.)*

- Feb. 6 -- 2nd Clue given for "Mystery Quilt" -We will be working on the quilt for this session.
- Feb. 16 -- Pillowcase Bring 9" x width of fabric (at least 42" wide) for cuff, 27" x width of fabric (at least 42" wide) non-directional fabric for the pillowcase, 3" of contrast fabric for trim if desired.
- Feb. 20 -- Earrings by Gelene Logsdon Make these cute button earrings. Bring two earring hooks, 26 jump rings, ten 2-hole or 4-hole buttons (may be a little larger than the 4-hole small buttons) and ten 4-hole small buttons. (Hobby Lobby carries a nice selection of everything needed for this project.)
- Feb. 27 -- Final Clue given for "Mystery Quilt" and revealing! – We will finish the quilt top or work on any other unfinished project.

Don't forget to bring your Challenge Project with you to display at the Quilt & Hobby Show. This year's challenge is "Spring Fling." Create a project with anything to do with spring. This could be projects such as Easter, St. Patrick's Day, Flowers, etc. We would like to have a large display of your creations at the quilt show.

You may work on your own quilting project, woodcarving item, scrapbooking, or needlework each Monday afternoon – or just come to visit and see what we are doing.
