Clinic Column

I hope you enjoyed your summer and are ready to dive back into the railroad room. Last season, Aaron Filter of Nobel Knights was unable to be with us but he will be here for our September meeting. To refresh your memory, we have all undoubtedly seen the fantastic work done by military modelers and war gamers. The detail and techniques they employ often go far beyond what we model railroaders produce. Phil Hottmann has mentioned Nobel Knights at some of our meetings and the Youth Group has held some meeting at their facility in Fitchburg. For our first clinic this month, Aaron Filter, HR Manager/Process Improvement Coordinator for Nobel Knights will introduce us to their vast array of product offerings, most of which are not common to the model railroad community. A former scale modeler and now American Flyer collector, Aaron is familiar with our hobby and will show us some of the techniques and products the military and fine scale modelers use to make their dioramas look so real and can help us with our own modeling.

I am dubbing this clinic season as The Year of the Operator. I will begin with a follow-up clinic to Aaron's comparison of model railroading and war gamers. Some of us do operate on area railroads; others just run trains in their basement. There is a lot to be said for "operations" but what does that mean and how and why does one approach operations and what does it involve to get started? Throughout this season, we will have presenters discussing their railroad operation—the why and how, nuts and bolts—to give you an idea of the varied way we can grow from running trains in circles to actually modeling what a real railroad does. This month, I will set out some things to think about in preparation for seeing how others interpret operations and how you might begin to set your railroad up for moving freight and passengers to serve your model communities.

- 3. Categories shall be determined by the Contest Chairs and published in the Bad Order in advance.
- 4. Each member present at the meeting may vote for their favorite model and photo, as appropriate in each subclass. A first, second, and if necessary, a third award will be given to entries receiving the most votes in each subclass.


For those who attended, I hope you had a good lunch and a good time at the Park. For those who couldn't attend, there will always be next year!

A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with 3 introductory puzzles to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.


The listserv is a one-way email broadcast to you, not a social media type service. The emails are sent in bulk, but as a BCC: type email.


OPS Puzzles




