

EMMAUS AND THE MASS

Emmaus might as well be Brigadoon. We hear of it in this one story—and it's only in Luke—and then it disappears. The journey to Emmaus is one of the most beloved stories about Jesus, and yet the town is probably "mythical" in the truest sense. Like so much of life, this story is about the journey, not the destination. Running away from Jerusalem and their fears, probably going home in disillusionment, two of Jesus' disciples encounter a stranger on the road who, like a rabbi, is able to help them understand their experiences using his deep knowledge of scripture. Later, sharing a meal with him, they recognize the stranger as Jesus, and they return to Jerusalem to tell the others. How like our Mass—we hear the scriptures and an explanation of them, we share a meal, and then we go out to tell the good news.

HOLY EUCHARIST

This sacrament is the heart of the Holy and Ancient Catholic Faith. Christianity makes little sense without this bonding of Jesus to His followers. Holy Communion is His way of giving Himself completely; Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity to God the Father and to us for our salvation. Jesus instituted Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper on Holy Thursday, the day before His crucifixion. When Jesus said "This is my Body", the substance of the bread He held was changed into His entire self even though it remained bread to the senses. When He said "This is my Blood", the substance of the wine was changed into His entire self even though it remained like wine to the senses. By this sacrament, and because He is God, Jesus is incorporated into our body and soul so that we can be admitted into the Holy Trinity Family.

St. Alphonsus Liguori, Bishop and Doctor of the Church, cherished as his most treasured possession a painting of Our Lady of Good Counsel which he placed upon his writing desk, where he completed the vast majority of his writings on theology the spiritual life. Like St. Alphonsus Liguori, may our hearts be united to that of the Blessed Mother and may we seek Her good counsel with confidence and trust.
