

Excerpts from 'Love Thy Neighbor'



Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

30th Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 22:34-40

"Clear off your desks and get out a clean sheet of paper." Oh, here we go! When I heard that as a young schoolboy, my heart would skip a beat, as I tried to remember the tricky words in our weekly spelling word list. Or the vocabulary list! Then the teacher would say, "First thing, write your name on the top left-hand line, and number the lines # 1-10." That direction may have been the trick to the quiz, because it was funny that the teacher always started off with that command to write our names on the top of the page, but still at least once a week, when handing our graded papers back to us, she would say, "I have two papers with no names today." That was the first test – following directions. And why not get those easy points, since we all know our names! But today, Jesus faces a much harder pop-quiz!

In fact, this whole 22nd chapter of Matthew is filled with tests/quizzes thrown at Jesus. And the stakes seem to get higher with each successive challenge posed to Him by different religious/political groups within Judaism. I see three different test questions thrown at Him. First, the Pharisees team up with the Herodians, and come at Jesus asking about the lawfulness of paying taxes or not, to Caesar (*Last week's Matthew 22:17-22*). Secondly, the Sadducees have a go at Jesus by questioning Jesus about a conundrum regarding multiple marriages on earth and how that will sort out in heaven (which husband sits with which wife at the heavenly banquet) (Matthew 22:23-33. Then third and finally, the Pharisees try to get in a good parting shot, and approach Jesus again, testing him to isolate the most important of all religious laws that must be followed (*Today's gospel-Matthew 22:34-40*). Of course, Jesus passes each test superbly. Matthew takes special note of how Jesus 'Aces' each test, when he records first, how the crowds were 'amazed'(Matt 22:22) and then the fact that they are 'astonished' (Matt 22:33) at Jesus' consistently wise responses. (Realize too, the crowds know the Pharisee questions are 'tricky'!)

We don't read the whole of chapter 22 at Sunday Mass(because of time constraints), but I love how at the end of Matthe chap. 22, Jesus cleverly takes advantage of this 'question-and-answer period' to throw back a question to the Pharisees! It is like Jesus replies, "Since everyone is in the 'asking questions' mood, I have one for you, too!" In Matthew 22:44, Jesus asks them about what they think/expect of the coming messiah. They respond with a popular response, that the messiah is the 'Son of David'. Yet Jesus turns and tests their knowledge of scripture and rhetorical skills, by quoting to them Psalm 110:1, where David writes, "the Lord said to my Lord...." Who is who? Well, we translate that psalm as David saying, "God the Lord (Most high) said to my own lord (Messiah-Master)." If the Pharisees are right, shouldn't David have said, "The Lord said to my Son"? But David said, 'My Lord' as if the Messiah is someone historically previous in time to him, instead of later in time as a son would be to him a (son being born after the father of course). Psalm 110 uses the past tense indicating the Messiah is someone living ahead of the psalmist in time. But this question begs another one altogether such as like, "Which Son of David?" I know this suddenly became technical and precise (but that is Jesus' point). Sometimes we can try to twist and tighten religious doctrine so much that we contort the meaning right out of the words! (kind of like trying to put an exact number on how many times we must offer forgiveness! Matt 18:21-22). So, Jesus redirects them to go back, reread and study again their own scriptures. In a couple places in the gospels, with verbal exchanges between Jesus and the Pharisees, we actually hear Jesus tell them they don't know their own scriptures as well as they think they do. In Matthew 22:31, he says, "Have you not read what was said to you by God" and he quotes to them Exodus 3:6. Again, in John 10:34, we hear that "Jesus answered them, "Is it not written in your law, 'I said, "You are gods", quoting to them Psalm 82:6. Also, Jesus had gently reprimanded Nicodemus in John 3:10 hinting that Nicodemus didn't know his scriptures, when Jesus said, "You are the teacher of Israel and you do not understand this?" Also in John 5:39, Jesus in a general way sent the Pharisees back to do their homework, to reacquaint themselves with their own bible when he told them, "search the scriptures......they testify on my behalf." So, Jesus' wisdom cannot be matched by any Pharisee, Sadducee, Herodian or anyone. Of course, He is the 'Word of God' Himself (John 1:1 & 1:14). And Matthew emphasizes how Jesus stumped these argumentative crowds when Matthew ends chapter 22 saying, "No one was able to answer him a word, nor from that day on did anyone dare to ask him any more questions (Matt 22:46). We all sit at Jesus' feet to learn and understand what He wishes to teach us by His Word! Be sure to spend a little time every day listening to Him teach, reading some from any one of the gospels.
