Dear Church Family and Friends,

"September 2020 Revisited"

September is always an interesting time. For many people who have children, grandchildren, or who are involved in the education system in any way, September has always been the time when things get back to "normal." Summer vacation is good, but by the end of August, children and parents are ready for the routine of school, usually teachers, too. This year is different. There is no going back to normal. Everything has changed.

I am reminded of a place that I went to each summer when my children were young. We went to a school of missions at Houghton College. While we were there, we would always take a field trip to Moss Lake. Moss Lake is a protected wildlife area that centers around a naturally formed bog. Moss Lake, being a protected bog, was different than any place our children had ever been. There were carnivorous pitcher plants and many other flora that was unique to this particular place. The fish were so numerous that when we threw bread to feed them, they swarmed and looked almost like you could walk across them on top of the water. A deep layer of moss grows on top of the lake. There are platforms laid down so you could safely walk right out onto the water. Everything around the platforms look solid, but we always warned the kids not to step off the platforms or they would get an unexpected dip in the water that was the home of huge snapping turtles. We always saw a turtle or two and some were as big as 18 inches in diameter. The size of the turtles was definitely a deterrent to any temptation to see if the adults were really telling the truth about the "land" off the platform path. The same was true of the lily pads that were enormous. They also looked like they could hold the weight some of our younger children, but once again – no one tired – thank you for snapping turtles.

As school opens, it will be a lot like a visit to Moss Lake. The world we are in now is like no other time in our lives. There is nothing familiar we can grab onto to get our bearings. We try to find things that seem normal, but even these are different due to social distancing and required face masks. Walking through life is a lot like a walk onto Moss Lake. The platforms in Moss Lake would move up and down because they were floating on the water. It gave one an unsteady feeling. And, one step off the platform can end up in disastrous results. Beginning to see to comparison?

Let's look at this another way. My kids and I always look fondly on the memories of Moss Lake. It had dangers and was different to be sure; but there was so much to learn and so many new things to experience. We can find things about this time that are definitely positive. How many of us have had time to sort through old pictures or files that should have been dumped long ago? What about the technology that nearly everyone has been forced to learn that will be something we can use long after the threat of the virus is gone? I have thoroughly enjoyed Bible study with people that never could have come together without zoom technology and our worship services have reached many more people than we ever could have with in-person only worship.

We will continue to have challenges, and we will never go back to the normal we had before the virus, but God brings blessings every day. We just need to look for them.
