## **Langdon Community Association – Annual General Meeting**

March 11, 2018

7:00 pm - Langdon Fieldhouse

Meeting called to order at 7:09pm.

- Introduction of Board Chrissy Craig addressed the attendees with a welcome and an introduction of the attending members of the board: Chrissy Craig- Vice Chair, Funds Development Lead, Langdon Days Lead; Crystal Upstone Treasurer; Nicole Porquet-Seitz Secretary; Corrie Carrobourg Director at Large; Jessica Smythe Events; Renee Durieux Beautification Lead, Scott Pike Recreatoin Lead Absent members were: Jason Walker, Ken Herman Director at Large
  - a) Approval of Agenda: Renee and Jessica
  - b) Approval of Minutes from March 2, 2017 AGM: Jessica and Chrissy
- 2. <u>Chair Report LCA</u> was busy this year completing projects that included: Outdoor rink gates for both Zamboni use and to meet license requirements for Langdon Days, garage building, security camera installation at outdoor rink and in skate shacks which resulted in no vandalism and people being able to use them. We also kept busy organizing many community events including: Langdon Days, Fire & Ice Casino night and Christmas carnival.
- 3. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> Chrissy presented the 2017-2018 Langdon Community Association Profits & Loss. We had a net income of \$13791.69. The 2017-2018 operational budget was presented with expected revenue \$69400 and expected expenses \$66200 for a surplus \$3200. This account is intended to cover all the day-to-day operating expenses of the fieldhouse and should be paid by revenue from rentals of facility. The 2017-2018 capital budget was presented with expected revenue \$167000 and expected expenses \$127700 for

a surplus \$39300. This account is intended to cover projects and event expenses and is funded by grants and fundraising. **2017-2018 Operational and Capital Budgets approved.** 

- 4. <u>Grants</u> The capital budget includes new projects funded in part by grants additional security cameras, new tables and chairs for field house, landscaping by garage and new bingo event.
- 5. Collaboration Chrissy spoke to the LCA collaboration with other service groups such as Langdon Community Collaboartive, Community Garden, Langdon Recreation Committee, Langdon Softball Association, Bow North Recreation, Bow Valley Ag Society, Bow North Community Facility Board, and the Langdon O.K. Seniors Club which has provided us with a bigger scope of the community's needs and developing common intiatives towards community improvements and directives. We have also offered to provide support via free use of the facility for fundraisers and volunteers. Specific collaborations this past year include with LSA in support of new quad ball diamond construction and Bow Valley Ag Society to run Fire & Ice Casino fundraiser for the firefighters and the outdoor rink.
- 6. Bylaw Amendments Proposed bylaw amendments were discussed by Nicole Porquet-Seitz. Corrie had presented several amendments which were discussed and changes made to bylaws. Corrie motioned to accept new bylaw with amendments and motion passed. Note that many of the recommended amendments came from a committee meeting with an expert in not-for-profit documentation.
