

COMMUNITY NEWS FROM TUCKER! City of Tucker Launches 2021 Road Resurfacing Program

Contractors began chipping away at the pavement on Smithsonia Drive on a Tuesday morning, in March officially kicking off the City of Tucker's 2021 road resurfacing campaign. The \$4 million project will see 62 of the City's most poorly conditioned roads get repaved between now and the fall. Tucker's Mayor and City Council voted unanimously on Monday night to approve the resurfacing contract with Pittman Construction.

"This is another huge step toward creating a better quality of life for our residents," said City Engineer Ken Hildebrandt. "You'll see construction crews working on roads across the City for the next several months. We'll do our very best to provide advance notice to those who will be impacted. There will be some temporary inconveniences, but we promise that in the long run it'll be worthwhile."

The majority of the resurfacing project will be funded through SPLOST revenue. More than \$2.1 million will be generated by the penny tax, which was approved overwhelmingly by DeKalb County voters in 2017. The tax will continue to be collected through 2024. An additional \$360,000 for the road resurfacings will come from the Georgia Department of Transportation, while the Mayor and City Council allocated \$1 million in general fund money.

The City of Tucker's Parks and Recreation Department announced Monday that they will host a day camp for students over Spring Break. The camp, which will run April 5-9 during the DeKalb County School District's Spring Break, will be based at Tucker Recreation Center.

"With many of our Tucker students heading back to the classroom this month, we thought the time was

right to offer parents some support during the upcoming break from school," said Parks and Recreation Director Rip Robertson. "We've studied what the schools are doing to keep students and teachers safe and we are very familiar with the CDC recommendations and protocols. It's for those reasons that I feel confident in the safety of everyone involved in our Spring Break Camp."

The camp will be sports-based, with campers getting several hours outdoors competing in various sports each day. All campers and counselors will have their temperatures taken upon arrival, all will be required to wear a mask throughout the day and hand sanitizer will be readily available. 

Tucker Rec Announces Summer Camp

Children will have a fun, safe place to enjoy their summer vacation in the City of Tucker this year. The Tucker Parks and Recreation Department this week opened registration for their 2021 Summer Camp program to be hosted at Tucker Recreation Center. The camp will be overseen by professional staff with decades of experience in supervising and engaging with children.

"We are excited to welcome students back to Tucker Recreation Center this summer," said Recreation Leader Jen Young. "With all the proper protocols in place, we know this is going to be the best summer we've ever had." Parks and Recreation staff have taken several important steps to ensure the safety of campers this summer. First and foremost, they reduced the camp's weekly capacity to better accommodate the need for social distancing. Additionally, there will be daily temperature checks, hand washing stations and campers will be encouraged to wear masks throughout the day. Tucker Recreation Center is also having a UV air filtration system installed to go along with a previously installed air ionization system.

"In studying the CDC guidance and talking with camp directors across the state about their protocols, I can confidently say Tucker is going to run the safest camp around," said Parks and Recreation Director Rip Robertson.

As in previous years, Tucker's Summer Camp will have a heavy focus on engaging children in STEM activities, crafts and athletics, including regular swim time at one of Tucker's public pools. The cost for the camp, which begins on June 1, will be \$125 per week, and parents may sign their children up for as many of the nine weeks as they would like. Staff will have more information on federal financial assistance opportunities for families who may qualify. Camp is open to boys and girls ages 5-12 and is not limited to residents of the City of Tucker. Families can sign their campers up at www.tuckerga.gov/parks.

The winter and early spring had so far passed with no hint of ice or snow. Would we transition smoothly into the next season, or would the harsh cold winds come back to punish us before hot weather arrived? In this part of the country, you never know. A Sure Way to Reduce Taxes on Your Primary Residence

Have you heard about the "Homestead Exemption?" It excludes a certain dollar amount, or percentage of home value, from your property taxes. It's called a "homestead" exemption because it applies to your primary residence, not a rental or investment property. You must live in the home to qualify for the tax break.

A homestead exemption is available to everyone who owns and resides in a home in DeKalb County! Now is the time to apply - even if you missed the April 1 deadline. Applications are accepted year-round. Applications received after the deadline will be processed for the following year. And, you won't need to reapply for the homestead exemption, unless you move.

Applicants must own and occupy the home as their primary residence as of January 1 of each year to qualify for or retain an exemption, have all vehicles registered there, file taxes from the property, and not have an exemption anywhere else. For all exemptions, eligibility and document requirements, you can go online to www.dekalbtax. org/exemptions.

In addition to the basic homestead exemption available to all homeowners, special tax exemptions are also available for eligible senior citizens ages 62 and older, disabled residents, disabled veterans or surviving spouse, surviving spouse of a U.S. service member, and surviving spouse of a peace officer or firefighter. Age and income requirements must be met to qualify for all senior exemptions.

Basic homestead applications may be submitted online at dekalbtax.org/file-homestead-exemption, by mail, drop box, or in person. Applications for senior and disabled exemptions must apply in person, by mail or by drop box, and present Federal and State income tax forms, social security 1099 forms, proof of age and/or proof of 100% total and permanent disability.

The popular "Click2Skip" program now includes scheduling for property tax customers applying in person. Visit dekalbtax.org/location-and-wait-times and look for the Click2Skip Property Tax button, select an available appointment and a confirmation will be sent to the email address provided. Appointments can also be scheduled by calling (404) 298-4000.

A Diet Primer: The Websters Dictionary Version

Are you wanting to get healthier, or possibly lose weight and are confused by all the diet choices available? Just what is the ORNISH diet? The Keto diet or the Zone? Choosing a diet can be so confusing because there are so many choices. And all the choices come with very persuasive advertising. Today, I want to give you the 'Webster's dictionary' version of common weight loss or "healthy" diets. These are only the definitions and main claim of the diet. Perhaps later, I'll write an article on evidence versus claim.

Atkins: CLAIM: rapid weight loss without hunger. It is a high protein, high fat diet. It initially restricts carbs to 20 grams a day to produce ketosis and then gradually adds carbs back to your diet at your own personal maintenance level. This is the level at which you do not regain weight. The diet was conceived by Cardiologist Dr. Robert Atkins.

Ornish: CLAIM: Switching to their eating pattern will cause weight loss and reverse many chronic diseases. It also 'reverses the aging process at the cellular level'. It is a very low fat (10%), mainly plant based diet that allows egg whites, soy products and limited fat free milk products. (Dr. Dean Ornish- physician and researcher)

Paleo: CLAIM: Eating as our hunter-gatherer ancestors who lived 1000 years ago did is more healthy and can help you be leaner. The diet restricts processed foods, dairy, legumes and many grains. (No hunting or gathering required).

Zone: CLAIM: Eating their 30% carb, 40% protein and 30% fat diet will put your body's hormones in the 'zone' to decrease inflammation. They claim inflammation is the cause of weight gain, many diseases and aging, and claim certain foods promote this. You can check your 'zone' balance by checking your Hemoglobin A1C, Omega fat ratios and Cholesterol ratios.

Keto: CLAIM: a low carb, high fat diet can lower blood sugar and insulin levels. It causes the body to go into ketosis, which means the liver uses ketones to metabolize fats for energy, rather than metabolizing carbohydrates for energy. This means you preferentially burn fat for energy. (70% fat/20%protein/10% carbs. Or the 'high protein' keto: 60/35/5).

Some athletes add carbs around work outs and some do a 'cyclical' keto diet. The last two types are not studied as well as the standard or high protein diet.

Low Carb: CLAIM: Eating low carb will help you lose weight. The 'low carb diet' pre-dates the Keto diet, but is not specific about how few carbs you should eat. It usually emphasizes quality carbs (whole grain).

Hypoglycemic Diet: Six small meals a day. instead of 3 large meals a day will prevent hypoglycemia and keep you from feeling hungry.

Vegetarian: a vegetarian is someone who does not eat any meat, poultry, game, fish, shellfish or by-products of animal slaughter. One of the main focuses is having a minimal carbon footprint and compassion for animals and living beings.

Vegan: A vegetarian who avoids all animal and animal-derived products

Pescatarian: Vegetarian who eats fish.

Ovo-Lacto vegetarian: Vegetarian who eats eggs and dairy

Flexitarian: A parttime vegetarian

Intermittent fasting: CLAIM: You will feel better and lose weight if you fast. This is not a diet per se but is a pattern of eating. There are several variations, with the most common being 16 hours of fasting and 8 of normal eating anything you like. Or another variation is to fast 24 hours twice a week. A third variation is called 5:2. Eat normally 5 days and limit calories to 500-600 cal. the other two.

Acid-Alkaline diet: CLAIM: eating alkaline foods is better for your health and prevents cancer.

Blood type diet: CLAIM: An individual's blood type (or group) determines the optimum diet they should be on, because their blood type shows their genetic pattern from the past. Popularized by naturopath Dr. Peter D'Adamo.

SouthBeach Diet: The South Beach Diet is a lower-carb diet that emphasizes lean meats, unsaturated fats and low-glycemic-index carbohydrates. It was created by Cardiologist Dr. Arthur Agatston.

Mediterranean: Based on observations of food types eaten by those living in Italy and Greece who are notably healthier, long lived and have less heart disease. This way of eating is generally rich in healthy plant foods and relatively lower in animal foods, with a focus on fish and seafood.

More definitions to come on commercial meal plans. Then a few evidence-based studies on what works. Keep reading! HEALTHLINE has excellent, evidence-based reviews on all the diets mentioned above. If you want more information, go to Healthline.com.

Researching and writing about virtual reality (VR) intrigued me to the point I broke down and bought the starter version, the Oculus Quest 2. My son's higher-end system requires being connected to a powerful computer to drive it, which means you are restricted to the space near the computer. I like the fact that the Quest can be used anywhere. It is completely self-contained, so you simply put it on to enter the virtual universe. And what a universe it is! I have only tried the demos and a few TV shows so far but admit it is immersive and a bit addicting.


In my first hour in virtual reality, which felt like minutes, I did participate in some amazing adventures. My first was jumping from a helicopter high above the snowcovered Alps in a wingsuit and flying thousands of feet to land in the backyard of a Swiss home. Then I watched my own rocket launch for outer space and performed a spacewalk looking down on the cloud-covered blue marble we call earth. Looking for something closer to the ground, the roller coaster was thrilling, made so real by the swirling sound effects of clanking gears and screaming riders. Next, I swam with a Great White Shark off the coast of Australia, which was terrifyingly realistic. That was just about as frightening as the next demo of being processed into a Texas jail and hanging out with the prisoners for a while.

Because I have connected the Quest to our WiFi and Amazon Firestick, I can also just watch my favorite TV shows in places where there is no TV, like outside on the patio when the weather is nice. So far, I have found that touring Europe with Rick Steves is much more realistic using VR than watching him go there on TV.

Now, some advice for the serious VR users from my son, Stephen, who uses his system primarily for gaming.

VR gaming experiences can be categorized as being for stationary, or 'seated' experiences, or ones that expect you to get up and move around. Among the ones that expect the user to be seated, there is a surprising variety. Puzzles, such as "I Expect You To Die," requires quite a degree of out-of-the-box thinking that may not be available in other mediums as the player is given the ability to be far more hands-on with tasks. Flight simulations, such as "Elite Dangerous," benefit from the in-cockpit experience being amazingly true to life. The controls can be challenging to set up without a dedicated 'flight-stick'—a type of controller anyone with an interest in flight sims likely already has on hand. There are even adventure games, such as "Moss," which are designed to be experienced from a seated, 'overhead' perspective.

Anyone looking for a more active VR experience has plenty of options. "Beat Saber" was mentioned previously for its popularity not only as an enjoyable musical experience, but also as a workout routine. You will work up a sweat swinging your two sabers at cubes that fly at you at dizzying speeds. Among shooter games, the VR perspective is a huge improvement over ones played on the computer or other game systems. One of my favorites is the

story-driven experience in "Half-Life: Alyx," that blends the Half-Life series' famous environmental storytelling and puzzle design with the true, first-person experience that only VR can provide.

For those looking for a less mellow experience—and having especially strong stomachs—there also exists the genre of 'grapple games' such as "Jet Island," a game that uses VR to let players experience the feeling of skiing down a world-sized skate-park ramp with a jetpack and grappling hooks. If the premise of watching the world fly by while you race towards the ground at terminal velocity sounds terrifying, you'd be right, and this might not be for you. However, it's certainly an experience that cannot be found outside of virtual reality.

Gardening: What NOT to Plant!

April is a great time to plant in Georgia! The soil is warming up and the spring rains encourage growth and the milder temperatures tempt you to get out and enjoy the day!

Please consider what you are planting because some plants are pests in the garden. This column will focus on many common invasive plants and how to control them in your yard or greenspace. We consider plants invasive when they spread or reseed too rapidly to manage effectively. Most invasive species are not native to our area.

English ivy or Hedera helix L. is very common in Smoke Rise and it is a problem plant for many reasons. It is listed as a top five invasive vine in Southern forests along with kudzu, Japanese honeysuckle, oriental bittersweet and non-native wisteria.

English ivy thrives in moist, open forests and can tolerate deep shade. That is certainly why so many gardens have ivy, as it grows where little else will grow and be evergreen. If it is properly maintained and contained, it can serve a purpose to prevent erosion. Unfortunately, it is a vigorous grower and must be managed to prevent it from climbing trees and expanding the boundary you set for it. Ivy can grow up to 90' with aerial roots. The weight of the vine can be an issue with wind storms and it amasses on diseased trees which are subject to falling or breaking under the weight.

Ivy also holds moisture and is a breeding ground for mosquitos which in turn are a health issue for us. The dense undergrowth is also home to snakes and other unwanted pests.

What is the best method for controlling ivy? The most effective way to control ivy is to hand pull it. It is labor intensive, but it works. Keep ivy from climbing your trees by cutting the vines away from the trunk of the tree. You can use a screwdriver to leverage the vine away to make the cut easier. Next you need to remove it from the ground about two feet away from the tree trunk. The vines on the tree will die eventually and fall off, but may take some time. Keeping that perimeter at the tree base clear of ivy will prevent vines from finding their way again to the tree trunks.

You can use "RoundUp" or glyphosate on the ivy when it is freshly green and growing for best results. A string trimmer is a great tool to cut the leaves up and then spray with the glyphosate for improved effectiveness. You can also mow the ivy and then cut the vines and pull them up. Do not compost ivy. Goats and sheep can be rented to consume the ivy but it should be noted that they only eat the leaves and unfortunately, the vines will re-sprout.

My best advice is to not plant it in the first place. Control it if you have it, or remove it. Good luck! Next month we will tackle privet and nandina!

By looking at your bare bones garden now, you will be able to easily see the areas you have for planting. Plan to buy your plants next fall and determine that you will plant them by Christmas.

Many of the earliest bloomers are bulbs and will require some cold time in the soil to bloom. Daffodils (also known as Narcissus or Jonquils), Crocuses, Spanish Bluebells are in this category. There are dozens of varieties of daffodils: miniature cuties through large blossoming ones. They come in many colors too: pure white, peach, yellow and deep yellow and bicolored with dark centers. Some are double petaled and some are fragrant.

Daffodils bloom throughout spring so check when yours will come up. Most will naturalize (multiply). A trip to Gibbs Gardens in Ballground, Ga will get your creative juices running. They have a stunning display of thousands of daffodils that you can enjoy from February through late April.

Spanish bluebell bulbs also bloom early and are very easy to grow. They even like the shade/ part shade.

Snow drops are dainty white flowers that also love the shade and thrive at the edge of the wood.

Many Iris are early bloomers. Three large clumps in your landscape will bring such interest and will come back each year. Some are rebloomers.

Lenten rose could be counted as an early bloomer, though they technically bloom in late winter. They keep going until it starts to get hot in May. The leaves are evergreen, so they are a permanent part of the garden.

Marsh marigolds appear with beautiful, low to the ground mounds of yellow flowers. They disappear when it gets hot but will be back again next February.

Daphne and forsythia bushes are harbingers of spring. The Daphne odora is a bit picky, but flowers with beautifully fragrant pink flowers in February. Put it close to a pathway, in a sheltered location and everyone will ask what that fragrance is. Forsythia and quince bloom before they put out leaves.

All of the plants above are perennials. They will return each year.

Early spring is also the time that your violas and pansies will do best. While we saw them all winter, they were mainly at a standstill. From February to May they will flush out and thrive. These plants are annuals, so will need to be planted new each year.

Note the prized "handed down" dessert recipes that Rick shared with us this month. He was kind enough to pare them down from servings of 100 or more to an average family size. The Rizogalo (rice pudding) and Koulourakia (butter cookies) are traditionally served at Easter.

Stuffed Roasted Pork Loin

2 or 2 ¹/₂ pound boneless pork top loan roast salt and Freshly ground black pepper.
1 ¹/₂ teaspoons Greek seasoning.
One 12-oz jar roasted red bell peppers, drained.
¹/₂ cup crumbled feta cheese (about ¹/₂ cup)
2 cloves minced garlic.

Butterfly pork loin by making lengthwise cut down the center of the roast, cutting to within $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of the opposite side. Spread open. Make a parallel cut on each side of the original cut. Open meat to lie flat (you will have 4 sections, all joined). With meat mallet, pound each section to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thickness. Season with salt and pepper. Sprinkle Greek seasoning on pounded side of pork. Split peppers down middle to lie flat and remove seeds. Place on meat. Combine feta and garlic. Sprinkle over peppers. Starting from side of roast, roll up pork and tie with 100% cotton string at $1\frac{1}{2}$ intervals. Sprinkle with additional salt and pepper. Place roast on rack in a shallow roasting pan. Insert oven thermometer in center of roast. Roast at 325° for 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours or until thermometer registers 155° . Cover with foil and allow to stand for 15 minutes.

Tzatziki Sauce – serve over meat, or with salads, or vegetables. 2 cups full fat plain Greek Yogurt

 $\frac{1}{2}$ cucumber, cut lengthwise, peeled, seeded, & shredded

1 tsp. Kosher Salt

2 Tablespoons extra virgin Olive Oil

- 1 ¹/₂ Tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 Tablespoon fresh chopped dill

2 cloves fresh minced garlic.

Strain yogurt by pouring into fine mesh strainer or coffee filter and set over empty container. Shred cucumber and place on separate strainer. Let set overnight. To mix, in medium bowl, stir strained yogurt, cucumber and other ingredients. Cover and chill for 1 hour. Serve chilled. Makes 6 servings.

Rizogalo (Rice Pudding)

One-quart whole milk

- ³/₄ cup sugar
- ¹/₄ cup short grain rice1 Tablespoon grated lemon rind
- 2 Tablespoons butter

2 eggs, beaten.

Mix all ingredients except eggs in saucepan. Boil slowly until rice is done. Slowly add a small amount of rice mixture to eggs, beat. Return to saucepan and stir constantly over medium heat until thickened and creamy. Pour into individual serving bowls and refrigerate before serving. Serves 6.

Koulourakia (Easter Cookies)

2 cups unsalted butter
1 cup whole milk
1 ¹/₂ cups sugar
6 heaping teaspoons baking powder
6 eggs
1 tsp vanilla
4 cups sifted flour – sift more flour to add to dough as needed.

Cream butter and sugar until lemon colored. In separate bowl, beat eggs well – add to sugar and butter mixture, beating continuously. Sift baking powder with 4 cups flour. Add vanilla to milk. Add flour and milk alternately to butter mixture. Add more flour, as needed, to make a soft dough – not dry. Knead dough for 15 to 20 minutes. (KNEADING IS A VERY IMPORTANT STEP!) Pinch off walnut size portions of dough and roll into long strips – 5" long and less than $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick. Roll or twist into desired shapes of figure 8's, pretzel, braids or swirls. Place on cookie sheets about 1 inch apart. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes or until golden brown. Yield: 8-10 dozen cookies.
