From the Pastoral Associate: How has your Lent been? Someone once asked St. Bernard of Clairvaux what the three most important virtues are. He replied, "Humility, humility and humility." This Lent has certainly been an opportunity for us to enrich our lives with this very important virtue. The changing of our lives with combating the Coronavirus reinforces the Christian principle that the only one you can depend upon is God. We need the government, military, science, medicine, financial structures, and other things, but they are not where we are to rest our hopes, our security, our life. Furthermore, while we are now concerned about our lives and the lives of those around us, for many in the world chaos and concern about death has always been close at hand, not because of the virus, but because of the lack of water, food and safe shelter. May our current situation soften our hearts to their suffering. If prayerfully living through this Lent, has helped us to be more open to God's action in our lives and more dependent upon God, then it has been a good Lent indeed.

This Sunday begins Holy Week, the Church's most solemn week of the year. This is a time when we celebrate Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at His last Passover, we reflect on His painful suffering and death, His total giving of His life for our salvation and humbly being obedient to the Father's will. Then we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death with His Resurrection. This year for the first time in all of our lives Holy Week will be different. Father Popp PRIVATELY will be celebrating simplified, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Services. These will be available on our website and YouTube for everyone to view. 7. Something to reflect on in prayer. We too can betray, deny, or ignore, or proclaim Jesus by our actions or inactions, words or silence. What have I done with my life recently?

8. Three hours of suffering on the cross before death for us, for me. What sacrifices am I/we willing to make to observe, remember and cherish the events of Holy Week this week, given the restraints of combatting the virus?
