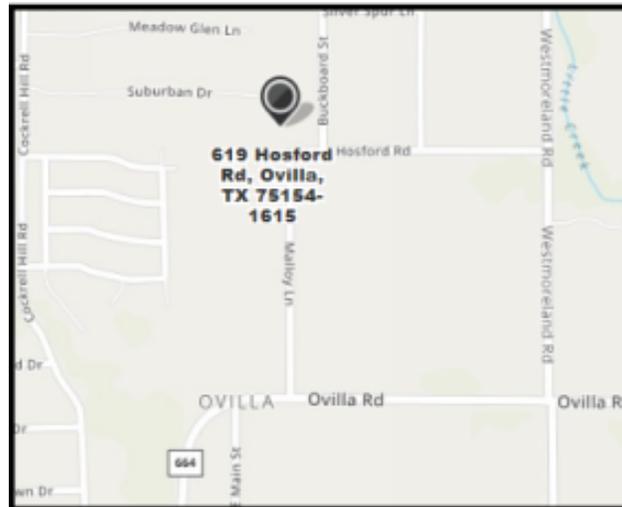
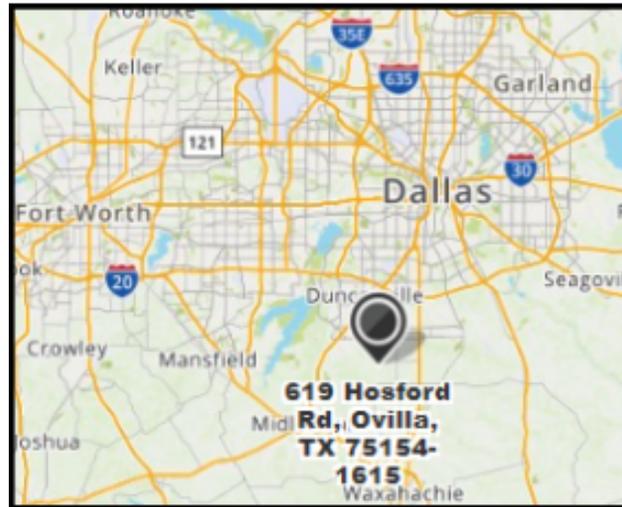

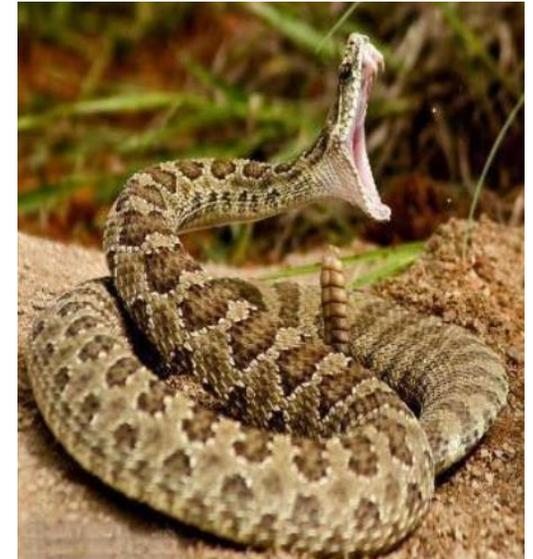

How does a snake avoidance clinic work and what is going to happen to my dog?

Snakes used for the event.

Live diamondback rattlesnakes are used during this event. Prior to the event a professional snake handler milks the venom from the snakes and removes both primary and secondary fangs. The best results occur when the dog uses his natural senses of sight, smell and hearing to locate the snake. This is accomplished by a course with two snake stations.

The first snake station.

The first snake station has a rattle snake with its rattle taped to simulate a dormant snake or cottonmouth. The dog is brought in the vicinity of the snake using a long check chord. After locating the snake, the dog will receive an electric stimulus from the collar. The dog is led out of the area and allowed to settle down. Again the dog is led into the area to see if the dog will again try to locate the snake. If the dog is still curious about the snake, it will again receive a negative response from the collar. This is repeated until the dog does not show any curiosity about the snake.

The Second Snake Station.

The second snake will have its tail available to rattle which will give the dog not only sight and smell but now sound as well to associate with the snake. The steps from the first station are repeated at this station.

The Final Check.

The final check is to have the owner call the dog while the snake is between the dog and the owner. A wide berth around the snake is the final lesson to prove the dog has associated the snake to the stimulus applied.

The Training Application and Precautions

This method of training is not guaranteed to prevent a total accidental contact of snakes, but when the dog is able to SEE, SMELL and HEAR the snake, it will avoid the area and also give YOU a warning that something is in the area.
