Clinica la Amistad 2016 Annual Report

Clinica la Amistad, or Friendship Clinic, is located in the community of Monte de los Olivos or Mount of Olives, a small village of 28 families in El Progreso, Honduras.

The name of the clinic signifies the relationship between the Americans and Hondurans working together to provide much needed health care to this impoverished area of Honduras.

The clinic is staffed by Hondurans, with oversight and funding from Corpus Christi Church and Little Friends International. The clinic is open 2 days per week on Mondays and Thursdays, 52 weeks per year. 25-40 adults and children are being treated each day.



Clinica la Amistad is thriving! In 2016, 2,526 people were seen; 925 males and 1601 females from 12 different villages. Total expenses for 2016 were: \$32,927.44, which includes \$20,766.75 for salaries, \$11,728.96 for medications, and \$431.73 for supplies.

-Most common diseases treated for adults and children, were respiratory infections, gastrointestinal diseases, parasites (intestinal) and dermatological conditions, including infections and scabies.

-Hypertension, Diabetes, urinary infections and musculo-skeletal diseases are also common among the adults.

--Most commonly prescribed medications were: Acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, low dose Aspirin, Multivitamins, Omeprazole, Lisinopril, Metformin, parasite medicine and antibiotics.



Minor surgery was done on a 5 year old girl, who had a small worm embedded in her forehead. An 8 year old boy, who was burned by hot cooking oil, was treated for second and third degree burns to his hand, arm and abdomen.

In October, we did a medical brigade with our Honduran team in a village called June 22nd. Over 100 people were seen and treated during this very successful collaborative effort with our friends from Hope Through Him.
