

Every year The Willoughby Outdoor Market begins on the first Saturday in May and runs rain or shine every week through the last Saturday in October.

Some of you may remember the classic nursery rhyme:

To Market, To Market To buy a fat pig. Home again, home again, Jiggety-jig.

According to Wikipedia this nursery rhyme dating back to the 1,600's refers to the rural activity of going to a market or fair where

agricultural products would be bought and sold.

The markets of today offer greater variety than ever before! Each Saturday in Downtown Willoughby's City Hall parking lot you'll find uncommon varieties of local and seasonal produce, plants for your vegetable and flower gardens, local honey and maple syrup, grass-fed beef and pork, artisan breads and home-baked goods, fresh flower bouquets, soaps and lotions, handmade crafts and more.

From the very first market this year on Saturday May 2nd until the last one on October 31st you'll find a convenient shopping destination in Downtown Willoughby with the freshest local and seasonal products plus a place to meet up with neighbors and friends.

The Willoughby Outdoor Market also offers you the opportunity to meet the folks that produce these high quality goods. Many of the growers and makers will be there at their booths, literally standing behind their product, eager to share with you their passion for what they grow, raise, bake or craft.

Like many folks these days, you want to know where your food comes from, how it's grown, what's in it, and how it's made.

When you shop at The Willoughby Outdoor Market you can ask these questions and get answers straight from the source.

Find out if your grower practices organic or sustainable growing methods if that is important to you. Ask them when the produce was harvested. Find out how the animals were raised, whether the plants you fancy do best in sun or shade, how to store eggplant, and what to do with kohlrabi?!

Our market vendors look forward to meeting you and are already at work, some of them months before the market begins, starting seeds, grazing beef, boiling maple syrup, trying out new recipes for breads and sweet treats, creating unique hand-crafted items, and preparing to hit the ground running when market season begins.

accurate sources for information regarding COVID-19.

We are also encouraging our residents to continue to support our businesses by "buying local." It is an incredibly difficult time for Willoughby businesses, and they need our help. Over the next weeks, I am asking that you join me in helping local businesses throughout our community when you can.

The City is also taking precautions to manage this pandemic. For the safety of our community and employees, we have suspened public interface at City Hall and closed the Senior Center. Offices will maintain normal operating hours, but the buildings will not be open to the public. We've postponed

all events, trips, activities and programs scheduled through our Senior Center and Parks and Recreation Department at least through early April. Our buildings and grounds personnel have initiated an aggressive daily disinfectant policy as have our police and fire departments. While we are exercising these measures, we want to assure our residents that essential city services such as police, fire and service will continue.

The coronavirus pandemic has been challenging, but I am encouraged how our community has responded during the crisis. Businesses have voluntarily curtailed hours of operation, allowed work from home, and eliminated unnecessary meetings. The use of technology has been an essential asset in enabling this. Our residents have shown the spirit of community by volunteering to help others. I have heard stories of a high school student willing to watch children for working parents during her time away from

school, a young man willing to do household chores for highrisk residents, teachers and students ready to communicate with seniors to help them cope with social isolation. These are incredible acts of kindness and show the heart and spirit of

Willoughby.

Over the next weeks, I ask everyone for patience, understanding, and cooperation as we continue to navigate this challenging situation. I am confident that we will get through this and return to normalcy.

# **Audubon Offers Solutions to Plastic Pollution**

Blackbrook Audubon will present "The Problem with Plastic" by Jill Bartolotta 7:00 p.m. Tuesday, April 21 at Penitentiary Glen Reservation.

Jill is the Ohio Sea Grant Extension Educator for Ashtabula and Lake Counties. Her research focuses on single-use plastics and barriers to reusable alternatives.

Ninety-six percent of the trash found on beach cleanups along the Great Lakes is plastic, most of it identified as single-use. Its presence is wreaking havoc on ecosystems, the safety of our food and drinking water, and the economy.

"The Problem with Plastic" will take an in-depth look into our decades-long use of plastic, its effects on us and the environment, and provide simple steps to break free from plastic.

Blackbrook serves coffee and tea, but asks attendees to bring their own cups or mugs to cut down on single-use cups.

# Bankruptcy 10

Overcoming the Fear of Filing Bankruptcy

Filing bankruptcy is scary on many fronts. I know because I'm a bankruptcy lawyer and I talk to bankruptcy clients every day. I also have had financial problems like most everyone else and I was scared at the time. I thought about filing bankruptcy. I must admit it was a very frightening thought. I really believed that my life for all practical purposes would end in humiliation and despair. I believed that everyone would look at me and talk and snicker. That it would be in the newspapers and my parents would disown me and that I would die lonely because no one would ever speak to me again. Forget about ever getting another date. They probably wouldn't even let me adopt a cat.

At that time, I couldn't put my finger on why the thought of filing Bankruptcy was so HORRIFYING. Since that time, I have had the opportunity to speak with many people who have gone through the bankruptcy process and now I know why the idea of bankruptcy is so scary. I also know now why it is such an irony that the solution to so many scary things causes us such apprehension. The reason is simple. It is an assault on our pride. A blow to our ego.

There is no other reason to fear such a remarkably effective solution to real tragedy (like, say, having your wages garnished, being sued, losing your home, not having money to eat, dying from stress, going insane, etc.) Pride is one of the seven deadly sins because it causes us to do things that we should not. It also causes us NOT TO DO THINGS THAT WE SHOULD.

Based on my conversations with many people I have concluded that bankruptcy is looked at in the negative. I know people are reading this last line and thinking "duh-yeah!" But in my world, I don't think it is so straight forward. Because I see fearful, distressed, stressed out, suicidal, miserable, guilt ridden, angry people made better by bankruptcy. Not just a little better, either. A lot better. The "I can't believe it, but I actually have peace of mind!" kind of better. I run into people at the grocery store who tell me life has never been so good. I wouldn't normally believe them because I knew them. They were our clients. They were people who came into our office eight months earlier depressed, hopeless, despondent, fearful and beaten. But now their faces, their demeanor and their attitudes are hardly recognizable. They have been restored to sanity.

They have been healed and they know peace. That past life that was so unmanageable, painful and, seemingly, spiraling downward out of control did not crash and burn. Something took the controls and managed to pull it back up seconds before the fiery fateful collisionmoments before they came to that dark place that is not known but dreaded. That something was the law of Bankruptcy!

It was probably something greater that took them to the acceptance that bankruptcy was the only thing that could right their lives at this point. But that is beyond this discussion. Everybody's bottom is at a different level. The only question is how much suffering a person endures and makes their family endure until they embrace the solution. I am a simple man. I think financial problems have a simple solution. That solution is bankruptcy.

So, no, you are not a loser if you need bankruptcy and use it. You will be a winner. Trust me, I know. We are not dealing with kids or irresponsible adults who went crazy at the mall and want to skate out of debt. Not in this world. Not now. In these times, people are struggling to eat; to drive to work; to live. And, no, you are not the only one who is in this much financial trouble. You only think you are because they don't make television sitcoms about the pretty people living in California hanging out at the beach filling out their bankruptcy petition. YOUR FINANCIAL PROBLEM IS TEMPORARY. YOU WILL RECOVER. You just need a little breathing room. If you let it cause you health problems- those may be permanent. General Motors is a prime example. They went bankrupt in 2009. In 2011 they made record profits.

So, what's my point? Don't listen to other people's opinions because they are only parading their ignorance. Don't be proud because pride is the mask of a fool. Don't be afraid because there is a solution to financial distress. Don't think you're the only one because that's just other people lying to you. Don't be idle because if you are, you'll never be free from the financial craziness, harassment, emotional turmoil and debt collector head games. And do be positive because winning is a state of mind not a state of financial wealth. Get your peace of mind back!



# **National Diabetes Prevention Program**

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, 88 million approximately American adults—more than 1 in 3—have prediabetes. Of those with prediabetes, more than 80% do not know they have it.

It's important to talk to your doctor about getting your blood sugar tested if you have any of the risk factors for prediabetes, which include but are not limited

- Being overweight
- Being 45 years or older
- Having a parent, brother, or sister with type 2 diabetes
- Being physically active less than 3 times a week
- · Had gestational diabetes or gave birth to a baby weighing more than 9lbs.
  - Having polycystic ovary

If you have prediabetes, the CDC's National Diabetes Prevention Program has a behavioral change program that can help you make lifestyle changes to prevent or delay type 2 diabetes and other serious health problems.

The program begins with 16 core sessions offered in a group setting over a 6-month period. In these sessions, you will receive training to make realistic changes in your diet and exercise and provided with strategies to control your weight. A specially trained coach will help motivate

Once you complete the core sessions, you will have six more months of follow-up sessions to help you maintain healthy habits

and an additional twelve months of ongoing maintenance sessions if you meet certain weight loss and attendance goals during the first year.

The program is limited to Medicare Part B beneficiaries who meet the specific guidelines for the program. You can find details at www.cdc.gov/diabetes/ prevention and ask your health care provider to provide you with a referral. If you are eligible, you will pay nothing for these services.



we must talk to teens about the dangers and consequences of unsafe and distracted driving," Ohio Department of Insurance Director Jillian Froment said. "I urge parents to establish rules that will help keep their teen drivers and those around them safe while on the road."




