From the Pastor's Pen

"O come, O come, Emmanuel!" It's one of our most beloved Advent hymns, our cry of longing for God to be with us, and for us to recognize the ways God is with us. The season of Advent marks the beginning of our church year. It is a season of preparing to celebrate promises kept, and anticipate the fulfillment of promises for the future. Advent is so much more than "getting ready for Christmas."

While the rest of the world around us is playing Christmas carols, having Christmas parties, and wishing us a "Merry Christmas," the church is singing Advent hymns and inviting us to remember how God has faithfully kept promises of being with us, shows up in our lives today and will come again to fulfill God's will and fully establish God's kingdom.

As the world around us plunges headlong into the celebration of Christmas, I invite you to take a step back, to take a deep, slow breath and savor the season of Advent, the season of anticipation, the season of promises. If you haven't established a daily routine for prayer and reading of scripture, Advent is an excellent opportunity to begin. There are lots of resources for daily devotions based on Advent themes.

Our worship in Advent will reflect the themes of promises made, kept and anticipated. Of all the seasons of the church year, Advent best reflects the "now, but not yet" of our faith lives: the kingdom God is here, among us now, but not yet in its fullness. You'll notice that some of our Advent hymns are in a minor key, their haunting melodies reflecting the longing of our hearts for God's healing presence in our lives and our

world.

When we arrive at Christmas Eve, and the beginning of our 12 day celebration of Christmas, we will joyfully celebrate the promise fulfilled when Jesus first came among us as a human child so many centuries ago. But in the meantime, let's savor the season of Advent, remembering God's promises made and fulfilled, learning how to watch and wait for the ways God shows up now, and anticipating the time when all God's promises are fulfilled and all things are made new.
