There a few bills yet outstanding, but the goal once these are settled is to keep \$10,000 in the account and transfer the balance to the general account. He also reported that the Belvidere American Legion will operate a food booth at Little Hershey next year.

At this point a charitable giving discussion popped up. The consensus (no vote) was to make decisions for 2023 charitable giving by the Club at the November 1, 2023 meeting, so be prepared to lobby for your favorites (old and new) at that time.
