- o The road to joy: Is a road of conflict, self-denial and then victory. Joy is at the end of the road, the long and dark night will end in joy.
- o Why does the world hate the believer? (You might want to review the lessons from March 9th and 16th on opposition from the world.)

<u>THE PROBLEM</u>: vs. 15-16; Jesus prays about an age-long problem; how may God's people remain in the world and not be contaminated by it!? (Paul dealt with the same problem in 1 Cor. 5:9-13, 2 Cor. 6:14-7:1).

o Note Jesus' request in vs. 15.

THE ANSWER: To be "transformed" rather than being "conformed" (Rom. 12:1-2). The Christian becomes a "new man" and thus does not set his mind on the things of the world (Col. 3:1-17).

o Jesus prays for protection, not escape!
