STEWARDSHIP: MY *PROPERTY TAX*

(Is. 5:1-7; Ps. 80:9, 12-16, 19-20; Phil. 4:6-9; Matt. 21:33-43)


Prophet Isaiah's Song of the Vineyard is written in the form of a love Ballard. It is a Ballard of how God loved and cared for His child and friend, Israel. It speaks lovingly of a dear friend who devoted his time and everything to his vineyard. Isaiah sees God in an affectionate relationship with His vineyard, Israel. He is telling Israel that, because love of God and love of others are no longer at the center of their life, there will be serious consequences (which resulted in the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple, and the forcing of the people into exile). Isaiah's poetry tells us that God is in an affectionate relationship with His chosen people - you and me. He spends time pampering and caring for us - pruning and nurturing us. In a similar vein, the Parable of the Tenants in today's gospel also illustrates God's dealings with His people you and me. It tells us about God's trust and confidence in us, and His patience with us even when we strayed away from Him. But most importantly, the parable highlights the fact that there are grave consequences when we deliberately turned our backs on God, and failed to faithfully carry out the tasks He has entrusted to us. You and I are responsible and answerable for the way we carry out the tasks entrusted to our care.

Parents and teachers often sacrifice time, talents, resources and energy to give children the best they have to offer – enroll them in various sporting and/or social activities. Parents send their child to high school and to college, expecting the best from him/her. They expect that their labor - their time, talents and resources - will not be in vain, and will bear fruits. However, their work is not always rewarded. Although, parents always love and often sacrifice a lot for their children, they sometimes feel let down by them. Lack of response can hurt badly: hence Isaiah uses beautiful imagery in his poetry to make God's shock and hurt apparent. Like our parents and teachers, God expects the best grapes and wine from us, His vineyard. There is no reason why we should not produce the sweetest wine, but often He gets sour grapes from us. In His infinite love and wisdom, God has bestowed His riches upon us. As all parents and educators do, God has high expectations of us.

Sometimes, like the tenants in today's gospel, we occasionally forget that God is the true owner of life. While you and I are blessed with many good things, we sometimes choose not to make returns to God - we selfishly hoard things for ourselves. In our society all landowners are expected to pay taxes on their property. The Lord God has made us, owners of land, with the various gifts He has endowed us with; and He expects us to pay *property tax* on them. Stewardship requires you to contribute your time, talent and treasure to God through your church and the needy in our society. As a believer, Tithing is the best way you can show to God that you appreciate all that He has blessed you with, and thus, in return you are bearing fruit by sharing gifts. Too often we take for granted what God has blessed us with. Today's parable illustrates that when we do this, there are certainly consequences - the Lord will take away the vineyard from us and will hand it over to those who will be generous in sharing their gifts.

"Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your request known to God." Count your blessings, one by one, and give thanks to God for what you have. Have no anxiety, because true happiness is found, not in how much you acquire, but how much you share.




