Traffic Safety

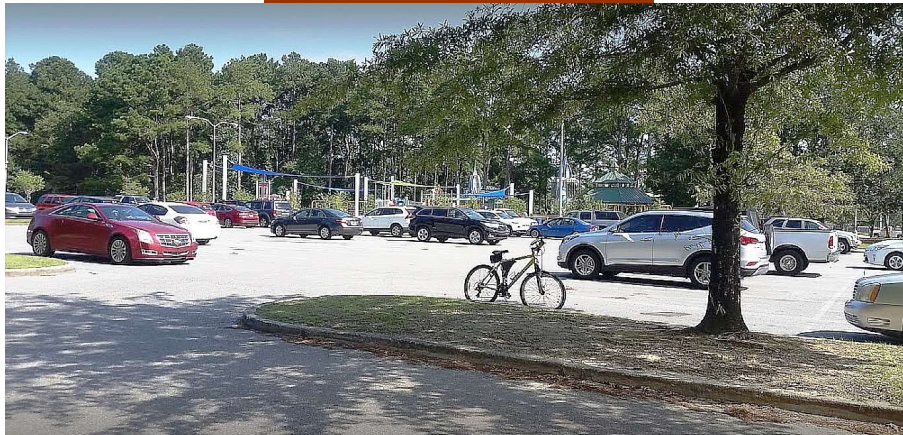
