PEARLS OF WISDOM FOUNDATION, INCORPORATED

The Pearls of Wisdom Foundation, Inc. ("Pearls of Wisdom" or "Foundation") (previously known as the Pi Theta Omega Foundation, Inc.), is a 501(c)(3) organization established for educational and charitable purposes. The Foundation provides scholarships to graduating high school seniors and currently enrolled undergraduate HBCU students seeking to attain higher education, provide service to the community, and who promote educational activities.

The Foundation was established in 2004, and since its inception, the Foundation has awarded a significant number of scholarships to students in the Morris County area.

Eligibility Criteria:

- African-American high school senior OR undergraduate currently enrolled in a historically black college or university (HBCU)
- ❖ Reside or attend school in Morris County or be a current or past participant in the #CAPSM (College Admissions Process) or AKA GEMS & GENTS high school programs
- Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher
- ❖ Accepted to a four-year college or university with plans to enroll in Fall of 2023
- ❖ Ability to attend the Pearls of Wisdom Foundation, Inc. Scholarship Awards Presentation tentatively scheduled for Saturday, June 17, 2023

Additional Criteria:

- Active participant in the community
- Pursue a degree in Education, Social Work, Math or Science
- Participate in one or more extra-curricular activities

ONLY completed applications will be considered. Completed applications must include all recommendations with an official transcript postmarked or e-mailed by **Monday, March 13, 2023**. A checklist has been included within the application. **Incomplete applications will not be considered.**

Scholarships Available

There are five (5) scholarship **types** available. Pearls of Wisdom Scholarships may have multiple awardees. **Applicants** only need to complete one application to be eligible for any of the five (5) listed below:

The Pearls of Wisdom Scholarships are awarded to graduating high school seniors who are seeking to attain higher education, who provide service to the community and who promote educational activities. There are multiple Pearls of Wisdom Scholarships which are available to students across all disciplines.

The Marjorie Herbert Scholarship is awarded to a student who plans to attend OR who is currently enrolled as an undergraduate at a historically black college or university (HBCU). The scholarship is named after Mrs. Marjorie M. Herbert who attended and graduated from Morgan State University in Baltimore, Maryland, a historically Black University. During her years at Morgan State, Mrs. Herbert was actively involved with her college community and with the Civil Rights Movement both on campus and in the City of Baltimore. In 2015, Mrs. Herbert received an honorary Doctorate of Laws degree from her alma mater and was recognized as a Morgan State University student "Civil Rights Pioneer". Dr. Marjorie Herbert is a member of The Pearls of Wisdom Foundation, Inc., Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®-Pi Theta Omega Chapter, and she is a dedicated Morris County Community leader. Both Graduating High School Seniors and Continuing HBCU students (rising college Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors) are eligible for this award.

The Princess Anne Millard Scholarship is awarded to eligible graduating high school seniors who have excelled academically, participated actively in extra-curricular and community activities, and who intend to pursue undergraduate studies in education or a related social science area. The scholarship is named after Mrs. Princess Anne Millard, a member of the Foundation, who attended what was then known as Virginia State College (now University) in Petersburg, VA. As a Foundation Member, since its inception, Mrs. Millard served on the Education Committee and held several leadership positions in Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®-Pi Theta Omega Chapter. She is a founding member of the Education Committee, which administers scholarship programs annually. In December of 2008, Mrs. Millard funded the "Princess Anne Millard Scholarship" of the Pearls of Wisdom Foundation, Inc.

The Mitzi Abney Wisdom Scholarship is awarded to a deserving student with a GPA of 3.0 or higher who plans to further his or her education in the areas of math or science, and the student must be actively engaged in one or more extra-curricular activities through school or the community. Examples of activities include sports teams, academic clubs (debate team, student government, language clubs, etc.), visual and performing arts (drama performance, dance, art shows/exhibits), or mentorship and personal development organizations (Boys and Girls Club, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Girl Scouts, etc.). This scholarship is named for Ms. Abney-Wisdom, who graduated from Dickinson College with a degree in Spanish/Education. She has previously served as President of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®-Pi Theta Omega Chapter, a community service organization in Morris County, and is very involved in service to the Morris County community.

The Vera Blossom Scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing a degree in social work or one who has a passion for helping to connect our society across the generations. Ms. Vera Blossom graduated from Benedict College in South Carolina with a degree in biology. She became very involved in community service after graduating, and went on to lead many committees and partnering organizations. As a volunteer and a community leader, Ms. Blossom focused on serving the needs of the community. After a number of years of teaching, and working in corporate America, Ms. Blossom grew more passionate about the connection between younger generations and older adults and decided to pursue a degree in social work. Ms. Blossom received a Master's Degree in Social Work at Rutgers University while also working full-time. Ms. Blossom also served as President of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated®-Pi Theta Omega Chapter, a community service organization in Morris County, New Jersey.

What aspects of social media were most or least helpful?
