# Save a Life: Join a Bible Study

It's the feel-good story of spring, and a welcome respite from the usual stories of shootings, shortages, and political schemes. It's the story of Darren Harrison, who safely landed a Cessna 208 airplane when the pilot passed out.

It all happened on Tuesday, May 10. Darren and another passenger were returning to Florida following a fishing trip in the Bahamas when the pilot suffered cardiac arrest, passed out, and slumped against the controls, sending the plane into a nosedive. At first, Harrison and the other passenger tried unsuccessfully to get the pilot to respond. When that didn't work, they quickly pulled the pilot from his seat and Darren took the controls, even though he had no flying experience whatsoever. With the plane plummeting toward the ocean, Darren contacted air traffic control who told him how to pull out of the dive and use the Florida coastline as a guide for staying level until air traffic controllers at Palm Beach International Airport could take over.

That responsibility fell to traffic controller Robert Morgan, an experienced flight instructor who taught him to fly on the fly. With his help, Darren landed the Cessna safely at the airport.

One week later, Darren sat down for an exclusive interview with NBC's Savannah Guthrie; a portion of that interview aired on *The Today Show* on Tuesday, May 17. Noting that he had to remain calm during the crises, Savannah asked, "Is that your temperament? Are you one of those 'cool-in-a-crises' people?"

"Oh, no, I'm not. I used to be one of the hottest-headed persons—fly off the handle, you know, very intense." Darren responded. "I've been working on it for a few years. My dad says I've come a long way. I work with my dad every day, so I said, 'Well, it's probably due to the Bible study I've been attending every Tuesday."

That caught my attention. A Bible study helped change Darren's temperament for the better. A changed temperament helped him to remain calm in a crisis so he could save three lives: his own; the other passenger's; and the pilot's, who was taken to the hospital where he was treated and released a week later. But it all began with a Bible study which was conducted in the context of a Christian community, rather than alone.

We could use more Bible studies—and Bible studiers—at Aledo UMC. More temperaments would be changed and more lives would be saved. We might even learn to fly. Not an airplane, of course, but we would learn to "soar on wings like eagles" (Isaiah 40:31). All we need are some folks who would be willing to help us take off. You don't need to be a biblical scholar; you just need to be willing to get the conversation started. How? One way is to use *The Upper Room* as a resource. Every Wednesday, *The Upper Room* features not only a devotion, but also questions for discussion which are found at the back of the book. All you need is a Bible and the *Upper Room*.

Another way is to go to our church website (myaledoumc.com) and print copies of my sermon from the previous Sunday and then use it as a springboard for discussion.

Darren Harrison made an impression on NBC's Al Roker. Following the interview, he observed, "Right now, lots of people are Googling, 'Bible studies near me." It would be so nice if more folks from our community found Aledo UMC when they were looking for meaning in God's Word.

# **FLAG DAY**

In the United States, Flag Day is celebrated on June 14th (a Tuesday this year). It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened that day, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress, in 1777. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday, though on June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first (and only) U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday. The longest-running Flag Day parade is held annually in Quincy, Massachusetts, which began 1952 and will celebrate its 69th year in 2021. The largest Flag Day parade is held annually in Troy, New York, which bases its parade on the Quincy parade and typically draws 50,000 spectators. The week of June 14 is designated as "National Flag Week." During National Flag Week, the president will issue a proclamation urging U.S. citizens to fly the American flag for the duration of that week. This year, remember the freedom that our flag represents, and thank God for that freedom- including the freedom to worship.



On Sunday, June 19th, we celebrate Father's Day. It was first celebrated as a church service at the Williams Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church South in Fairmont, WV, in 1908. (The first Mother's Day was celebrated 2 months earlier in Grafton, WV, 15 miles away!) Grace Golden Clayton is believed to have suggested the service to her pastor to commemorate 361 local men killed in a mine explosion. It was not made official until 1966 by President Lyndon Johnson. If you are able...spend some time with your dad that day. If you can't, but can call him...do that! If you are unable to do either of those things, take a moment to say a prayer to God, thanking Him that your dad helped bring you into this world.

# **Summer Solstice**

Have you ever heard of the Summer Solstice and wondered what exactly that was? The word "solstice" derives from a combination of two Latin words: "sol" meaning "sun" and "sistere" meaning "to stand still." As the days lengthen, the sun rises higher and higher until it seems to stand still in the sky. The Summer Solstice marks

the longest day (and the shortest night) of the year. In the Northern Hemisphere, Summer Solstice begins on Sunday, June 21, 2021 at 4:13AM.



# **Connecting with the Word**

Recently I conducted a class on "Leading Worship" as part of the Lay Speaking ministry of our Spoon River District. Our resource was *Worshipping with United Methodists* by Hoyt Hickman. And I learned something through teaching the class.

Traditionally, I've read my sermon text and then offered a brief prayer before I launch into my sermon. Hickman points to the "Prayer of Illumination" which is found in our hymnal and suggests that it be offered by a layperson before the entire sequence of scripture is read. This emphasizes "the unity of scripture and preaching." Plus, if it is offered by a layperson or the congregation in unison, "the pastor feels upheld by the prayers of the laity" before preaching (pg. 80).

You may have noticed we've followed that pattern for the past few weeks. I'm not sure how long we'll include it in worship, but for the moment, it's working.

I invite you to offer the "Prayer of Illumination" as you read these passages in preparation for each Sunday worship experience:

Sunday, June 5: Acts 2:1-21; Psalm 104; Romans 8:14-17; and John 14:8-17. Communion will be served.

Sunday, June 12: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31; Psalm 8; Romans 5:1-5; and John 16:12-15.

Father's Day, June 19: 1 Kings 19:1-15a; Psalm 42; Galatians 3:23-29; and Luke 8:26-39.

Sunday, June 26: 2 Kings 2:1-2, 6-14; Psalm 77; Galatians 5:1, 13-25; and Luke 9:51-62.

**Prayer for Illumination:** Lord, open our hearts and minds by the power of your Holy Spirit, that, as the Scriptures are read and as your Word proclaimed, we may hear with joy what you say to us today. Amen.
