Dear Residents:

This year marks the 150th celebration of Hampton Township's incorporation. There will be special events and commemorative mugs available for sale to support the Hampton Township Historical Society at Hampton Day, June 21, 2014, to mark this special occasion. In addition to this event, Hampton Township Fire and Rescue, Inc. will be hosting the Sussex County Fireman's Parade with special events and awards given to the County's Fire and Rescue Services. This ceremony will take place at the Hampton Township Recreation Park on October 4, 2014.

The Township has completed its 2013 Revaluation as ordered by the State of New Jersey and the assessments have been certified by Hampton Township Tax Assessor Joseph Ferraris. On behalf of the Township Committee, I want to thank everyone for being so cooperative to the inspectors who were required to visit your homes and report their findings to Appraisal Systems. The Township Committee adopted the Hampton Township 2014 Budget on April 22, 2014 and the local municipal tax has only increased by \$15.37 for a \$300,000.00 home, which is considered the average assessment for a residential home in our municipality. As always, many thanks to our elected officials and staff who work tirelessly to reduce costs wherever possible while maintaining the current services provided to our residents.

An important issue of concern in our municipality is that not all residents license their dogs in a timely manner. There has already been one case of a rabid raccoon that attacked a homeowner's dog in Hampton Township. The purpose of obtaining a dog license is to ensure the public that individuals have vaccinated their pet with a rabies vaccine, which prevents the spread of this deadly disease. Please be a responsible dog owner and obtain a license as required by the State of New Jersey. Although cat licensing is not a requirement in Hampton Township, it is advisable that cats receive rabies vaccinations as well. The township offers a free rabies clinic for dogs and cats every year on the first Saturday in November.

Well, it seems as if the winter is over and that spring has finally arrived. In the past the township allowed residents to obtain buckets of grit or salt from the municipality. Unfortunately, some individuals helped themselves to more than reasonable amounts, which put our supply at risk and caused the township to incur additional expense. Therefore, salt and grit will not be available to anyone other than the Hampton Township Road Department and the private Associations who pay for this material.

Once again, I'm always available for any suggestions or concerns that you might have, and I want to serve you in the best manner possible.

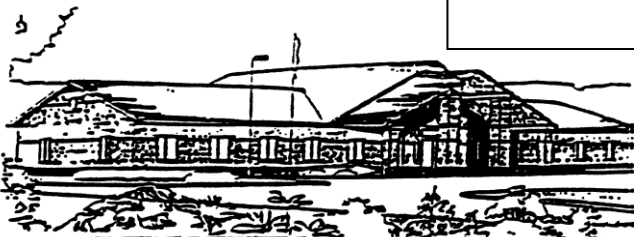

DOG LICENSE RENEWALS

All dogs over seven months of age **MUST BE LICENSED**. In order for a license to be issued, the State of New Jersey requires that the animal is vaccinated against rabies. The rabies certificate must not expire prior to November 1st of the licensing year, if it does the animal will have to be revaccinated. If for some reason your vet doesn't want to revaccinate your dog prior to its expiration date, then please have your vet write a note stating why the pet cannot be vaccinated and then a license can be issued. Dog licenses may be obtained at the Hampton Township Municipal Building between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday or may be mailed to Hampton Township Municipal, 1 Rumsey Way, Newton, NJ 07860. They may also be placed in the brown lock box located next to the Municipal Office front doors, after hours. Any questions please call the Municipal Office at 973-383-5570. **Please provide proof of rabies vaccination, certification of spaying/neutering** (where applicable) and a fee of \$11.00 for a spayed/neutered dog and \$14.00 if the dog is not. If applying by mail please include a copy of a valid rabies certificate. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** A 2014 license will **not** be issued if the current rabies vaccination expires **BEFORE NOVEMBER 1, 2014**. A late fee of **\$5.00** is assessed for each delinquent month for each dog license issued after February 10th of the calendar year for which the license is required effective January 1, 2012.

From the Fire Chief... On behalf of the Hampton Township Fire & Rescue Department, I want to extend our sincere appreciation to the community for the continued support of our Department. It has been a pleasure to be able to volunteer for a community that truly supports its Volunteer Members and Neighbors. In 2013 Hampton Fire & Rescue responded to a total of 207 Fire Calls; consisting of 10 Fires, 56 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 33 Fire Alarms, 108 Miscellaneous calls for assistance that vary from mutual aid to other departments, search & rescue, smell of gas or propane, helicopter landing zones, assisting EMS and more. In this same year, our EMS Squad kept busy under the direction of Captain John Ashworth and responded to 389 calls for assistance. The Department prides itself in continuing education and training for its members. Members now having training in Ice Rescue, Extrication, Rope Rescue and more, and EMS members are taking additional classes through the hospital training program to become more familiar with common calls. None of this could happen without the support of our community! We have made changes to our fundraisers in order to include a variety of activities that might attract a broader interest in our events. We have also done our share to support other organizations' fundraising needs by making Department donations to "Stuff the Bus", parking cars for special events, and donating Christmas trees to needy families. We are always looking for new members who are interested in making a difference in their community. We will train you in the field that interests you most. 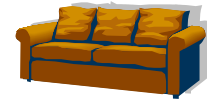

****DO NOT** leave garbage outside during the week. Put garbage cans out on garbage day only.

Just as a reminder...

The current contract with Waste Management states that garbage can be picked up as early at 6 A.M. Please have your garbage out by at least 6 A.M. on garbage day in order to be assured your garbage will be picked up. Residents cannot expect a consistent timeframe for garbage and recycling pick up. If it's out by 6 A.M. it will be picked up.

*Bulk pick-up is for Hampton Township Residents **Only**. Do not allow other individuals to bring their bulk garbage to your residence. This is considered illegal dumping & is a punishable offense.

Disposal Ban of Electronic Devices

Effective January 1, 2011, Waste Management is prohibited from picking up Televisions, Computers, Monitors & Portable Laptop Computers. SCMUA will hold two Electronic Waste Disposal Days. For more information please go to www.scmua.org

Recycling Schedule is a weekly pick-up curbside every Wednesday throughout the entire Township.

NEWSPAPERS AND MAGAZINES WILL BE PICKED UP WITH RECYCLING ONLY

Newspapers, Magazines, & other recyclables will be picked up once a week with Recycling. Do not put newspapers or magazines in paper or plastic bags. Recycling can be co-mingled and **MUST** be placed in containers that do not exceed 30 gallons.

OTHER RECYCLABLE ITEMS INCLUDE: Glass jars & bottles- all colors, Plastic Containers- #1-#7, Tin, Steel, & Aluminum Bakery & Beverage Containers, Mixed Fiber, Newspaper, Corrugated Cardboard & Brown Bags. Cardboard must be flattened & left out on **recycling** day. ****Please rinse all containers**

*****If your regularly scheduled garbage or recycling day falls on a Holiday, it will be picked up the following day!**
