#### Pastor's Corner



October is my favorite month for many reasons – some the "typical" ones: the colors of the leaves, the smell of bonfires, the taste of pumpkin spice (yes, I'm one of "those people"), the decorations, pumpkin patches, cornstalk mazes and more. But another reason is less shared – and that is what comes at the end

of the month – Reformation Day. Since 2017 - the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of the Reformation (1517) – each year I've looked back to see what the Reformers were up

to 500 years before. So ... exactly 500 years ago now (in the fall of 1521), Martin Luther was in hiding for fear of his life – as he had been condemned and excommunicated as a heretic at the Diet of Worms after being ordered to recant (he didn't). There was basically a papal blessing to assassinate him. He was being kept safe, hidden within the walls of the Wartburg Castle by his friend Frederick the Wise (also called Frederick the Protector). I visited the Wartburg in Germany a few years ago with Wiebke and her family. And I'm doing now what I did then ... imagining Luther, hidden away, tirelessly translating the New Testament from Latin & Greek into German. To many, this was one of the "less-exciting" parts of Luther's life – out of the public eye, not stirring up debate here, there & everywhere. In one of his rare letters from that time, he writes, "You may think me out of the fray, but I will do what Christian love demands, without regard to the gates of hell, let alone unlearned popes, cardinals and bishops. You need not think Luther is dead. God is alive, and so am I."

People give more emphasis to his fiery words and interchanges – the *troublemaker*. But me ... I think of him doing the painstaking but unglamorous work of translation. Nowhere near enough people realize the farreaching cultural effects of that gift to the German people. It not only enabled study of God's Word by the "common man" – which began to happen like never before in Europe – but it helped "form" the German language from many different dialects into a "common tongue." Luther unified the Germans because they received a unified form of the German language. This changed everything. That literary offering – eventually augmented by the Gutenberg Press – affected almost every sphere of human civilization in Europe – education, government, commerce, economy. And in addition, this paved the way for Bible translation in other countries for generations to come ... This humble work done in dark corners *behind closed doors* would *burst open other doors* – doors for evangelism, social justice and mission. I think of it this way ... as human princes and the social elite were enamored with the artwork and cultural advances of the Renaissance, amidst their preoccupation and "oohs and ahhs," the angels gathered unseen to behold the work of one lonely monk, as he labored out a far more eternal masterpiece, with God as the audience, and Christ the recipient of the glory. Thank you, Martin.





#### A Devotional for you -

Read Luke 9:23 & Romans 12:1-3

Well, I started (in the *Pastor's Corner*) with reference to Martin Luther. It's only right for Reformation Day to end with reference to John Calvin. In his little book, *The Golden Book of the Christian Life*, the title of chapter 7 is: "The Sum of the Christian life: the Denial of Ourselves" [here you will find very relevant application in contrast to

our modern-day emphasis on 'personal rights' and 'individual freedom.'] Calvin writes, "The duty of believers is to 'present their bodies to God as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to him' (Rom. 12:1) ... We are not our own: let not our reason nor our will, therefore sway our plans and deeds. We are not our own: let us therefore not set it as our goal to seek what is expedient for us according to the flesh. We are not our own; insofar as we can, let us therefore forget ourselves and all that is ours. Conversely, we are God's: let us therefore live for Him and die for Him. We are God's: let His wisdom and will therefore rule all our actions. We are God's: let all the parts of our life accordingly strive toward Him as our only lawful goal (Rom. 14:8). So often, consulting our self-interest is the pestilence that most effectively leads to our destruction, yet the haven of salvation it to will nothing through ourselves but to follow the leading of the Lord alone. Let this, therefore, be the first step, that a person depart from himself in order that he may apply the whole force of his ability in the service of the Lord."

Many Americans (probably most) will find this far too restrictive. Even many American *Christians*, though nodding assent to this in the pew on Sunday, will Monday through Saturday keep pace with how our culture defines "freedom" – you only have to start thinking about it and the practical examples of where these two *different* perspectives come into play will start flowing quickly: \*to mask or not to mask ... \*to require vaccinations or not ... \*to promote unbridled freedom of expression or to speak into the fads and fashions with a witness for dignity and wholesomeness ... \*to aggressively climb a corporate ladder ... or to support others to help achieve their dreams. On and on, the daily occasions arise, and we *will* apply either one principle *or* the other. My point, supporting Calvin, is that the consistent and repeated witness of the New Testament is that those who are led by the Spirit will practice self-denial. Jesus in the Gospels and Paul in his letters both emphasize that this is the path to grow in holiness, to be sanctified into the redeemed image Christ came to provide for us. And, to a very large degree, this *self-denial*, this deciding not to stand on personal rights but *think of the interests of others first* (1 Cor. 13, Philippians 2:3-8), this is how the world sees the Church is different. This is how we are a "city on a hill." This is how we become the "aroma of Christ" (2 Cor. 2:14-15). This is how we bring glory to God. May the Lord give us the grace to walk this path each day. Amen.


