

Furniture Care

- We recommend that you leave your furniture in a cool place when it arrives and let it acclimatise slowly to your property temperature and humidity, this will reduce the risk of the furniture cracking because of the changes in temperature/humidity between our workshop and your property.
- Do not place the furniture in direct sunlight or close to a radiator for prolonged periods. Over time this may cause fading and heat expansion cracks to occur.
- Do not allow your furniture to become too damp or too dry. Your furniture is a natural product and will react accordingly.
- During use, surfaces should be protected with coasters and place mats. Do not place wet or hot items directly onto the furniture surface and wipe up spills immediately.
- After a while you may need to polish your furniture; do this with a
 waxed based polish. Note that oil based polishes could make your
 surfaces become sticky and may act as a solvent for the wax
 layers.
