Board of Directors Meeting 5/11/22

Meeting call to order: 1:05 pm, in attendance: Katy Kay, Sue Brock, Gloria Poirier, Bill Aldinger, . represented Clearview Mgt., Jim Reuschlein & Stacey Klaback

MANAGEMENT REPORT:

- 1. The vinyl siding continues with buildings 104, 84, 95, 93, 91, 91, & the clubhouse.
- 2. The scope of work for concrete will be determined later this month around. \$30,000 has been budgeted for 2022.
- 3. The scope of asphalt replacement will also be determined later this month, \$80,000 has been budgeted. When complete the striping will be done.
- 4. Four buildings have been budgeted to have roofs replaced this year.
- 5. The pool concrete deck will be extended this month to allow for more seating around the pool.
- 6. The brick facia for the LED sign will be completed by the end of May
- 7. Goose egg collection & nest destruction has been completed for 2022
- 8. Buildings 106, 107, 108, 109, 136, & 137 will be power washed this June

FINANCIAL REPORT

A motion was made to approve the financial report by Mike G., 2nd by Katy, all approved.

APPROVAL OF MARCH MINUTES

Motion to approve made by Katy K.. and seconded by Bill A.., approved unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS —

- **1.** The awnings must be fabric material, NO metal.
 - 110-3 We are in favor, our back deck gets sun all day
 - **65-5** How will we attach if we can't go thru vinyl? *Jim: we are discussing, Resident would have to agree to be responsible for any future damage/leaks behind vinyl.*
 - **59-**5 Can we do a pergola over our back deck, not attached? *Jim: would require a plan submittal to Clearview Mgt.*
 - **117-5** This should be made responsibility of current & future residents. *Sue, this is in discussion with the Board.*
- 2. Re: proposed barrier to block new sub by the train tracks. Sue is investigating via the city of South Lyon to see if the builder is responsible. If not we may want to think of planting a barrier, possibly with Residents donating a memory tree. This is still in progress.
- **3.** Proposal B won for adding four new colors to the existing ones for painting your front door. The 4 new colors are *King's Red (CW335), Whipple Blue (HC152), Hale Navy (HC154), & Palace Green (CW520).* These are Benjamin Moore paint (color code in parenthesis). No one has to paint their door, these are just a few more color choices if you do paint.
- **4.** The pool deck expansion along the north side of pool should be happening by the time the pool opens. Pool is tentatively schedule to open Memorial Weekend. This depends on finding workers & getting the expansion completed.
- 5. No community garage sales are allowed in Colonial Acres Phase V

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Paul says the sprinkler water has been turned on for the season. Should start watering around the beginning of June.
- 2. DO NOT park across from the mail boxes. When the mail truck is there or cars parked to retrieve their mail it blocks the whole street.
 - **87-1** Can visitors park across from mail boxes. **NO**, no parking anytime across from mail boxes.
 - **56-6** Where can visitors park? *Sue: everyone has 2 parking spots, visitors* **must** park on Heritage Drive or in one of your spots.
- 3. Natural stones are allowed outside of your courtyard in lieu of the lava stones. No one has to change the stones but if individuals want to they may use natural lava stones.

BOARD BUSINESS:

73-6, the wall in front of the courtyard needs brick repair. *Jim: the brick deteriorated due to water damage from dripping water off bus stop. Sue: this is on the schedule for brick repair.*

MEMBER ISSUES:

- **73-6** I see people go thru the stop signs all the time. Sue: we have tried to make people stop, what else can we do?
- 73-6 I see all people turning in here from the subs to cut thru to Pontiac Trail
- **81-1** Why don't we put the gate back we used to have? Sue: this has been discussed at prior meeting this year & we have investigated the possibility of a solar one since there is no electricity. Due to the cost & predictability of it working when there's no sun the majority of Residents were against it.
- **58-6** Why aren't we poisoning crab grass? *Jim: based on soil temp we are due for another weed treatment.*
- **58-6** Next to me is a little grass & mostly weeds. I called Rose but they won't come unless Clearview calls. *Jim: they are scheduled for a5 treatments per year*.
- 57-6 The hill behind me needs more areas weed treatment
- Sue: to John McGraw, when will fountain go in the pond? John, Memorial Weekend
- **110-3** Can I put rubber tiles on our back cement area? *Jim: Yes Sue: you should all put cement blocks under windows outside of sun room to protect vinyl from the weed Wacker's*
- **59-5** On our back patio there's a river after it rains. Can we plant grass? Jim: we'll have someone look at it.
- **108-1** When will power washing start. My windows were just cleaned & I don't want the power wash. Jim: OK
- 57-3 Wants to move Rose of Sharon bush to off back patio. Jim: Paul will let her know where the sprinklers are.
- **78-1** requested to plant a tree. Jim: Paul can let you know where to plant. Can courtyard fence be painted? Jim? Will check.

FROM THE BOARD,

The asphalt sealant & repair and handicap ramps will be happening soon. Look at our digital sign for dates. Many other repairs are under way. Please call Clearview if you have a question or want to report an issue.

Wildlife and bird feeders are not allowed in the common area. You can, however, have bird feeders inside your courtyard. This year the DNR has asked us not to put out birdseed anywhere. The Bird Flu is here. It is easy to spread this disease when you have feeders. Remember Bird Flu can be transferred to humans.

Remember to check your decks. Small animals like to live under your decks. It won't be long before they burrow into your homes. An ounce of prevention will save you heartache later. The stench from the skunks was terrible this Spring. We do not have the budget to live trap the small animals. One animal trapping and removal costs approximately \$375.00. Please close off your decks!

Bonfires must not be in a permanent ring. The fires should be 30 feet from the buildings or trees. Bonfires should never be between buildings. A hose and fire extinguisher should be present at the bonfire.

The Board will not be removing any WOW boxes. It is too costly and the likelihood of cutting wires and power is great. If you decide to remove it on your own, contact Clearview first. Remember you must make the box accessible to workman. It cannot be completely covered.

CLUBHOUSE MINUTES

Minutes Clubhouse Meeting May 5, 2022 Meeting called to order at noon.

FINANCIAL REPORT

- Checkbook balance is \$25,224.30 of which \$16,000.00 is Operating reserve. From this total will be the expense of printing updated resident directories.
- Joe's report on solar speed signs indicate a range of \$1,348.85 to \$2,875.85. It was decided that this is not a prudent expenditure at this time.

REMINDERS

- Paint class at the Clubhouse on May 11 at 6 pm. Tickets must be purchased in advance. All supplies are provided at a cost of \$20.
- Ladies Tea at the Clubhouse on May 20 at 12:30 pm. Cost \$5.00, must be purchased in advance. Bring your special tea cup and wear a hat if you'd like.
- Atty. Phil Weipert will be here to speak about important estate planning issues at 6 pm on May 25th
- New, more specific pool rules for the season have been posted. Please familiarize yourself with the new rules and hours. Some tiles need attention and some new maintenance equipment is needed. These issues will be handled by the Board.
- We will not be having community wide courtyard sales so as not to diminish our Annual Clubhouse garage sale, which is scheduled for September 10 th .
- We ask that there be no feeding of animals of any kind. Bird flu has hit our area and is very transmissible.

MAINTENANCE

- Spring walk around indicates numerous wood decks in disrepair. Wood decks need to be flush with the ground to prevent animals from burrowing under them, and subsequently finding their way into your unit. Clearview is not responsible in this case. Mothballs or ammonia are possible solutions.
- Our security cameras have been fixed again.
- There has been an update on software for front door keys.
- Thank you to George B. for fixing the old furnace grates, thereby eliminating the unpleasant odor.
- Notice improvements to our deck area: new chairs and a bike rack. A pool deck expansion is planned.
- More sound baffles have been added.

FUTURE

- Don't miss the next Pancake Breakfast being planned for June 18th by the Aldingers and the Giordanos. Watch for further details in the newsletter, as well as on the bulletin board.
- Our annual Garden Walk is planned for June 25. Participants should meet at Judy Keeling's at 10 am. (Note date has been changed to June 18 at Clubhouse after the meeting.)
- It has been called to our attention that our Senior Center provides free bus rides to the Detroit Institute of Arts once a month.

- Discussion of Clubhouse Committee members getting a break on the cost of one rental per year was postponed for further discussion.
- The Board is working on creating a master list of unit owners, who have voting rights vs renters who do not.
- Results of vote for front door colors has been determined. We now have the choice of four more colors, in addition to tan, cream, white and brown. If you wish to paint your door, stop by the clubhouse see the new colors by Benjamin Moore. Approved color samples are identified by specific numbers.
- Discussed the possibility of planting "Memory Trees" (donated by residents) along our border with the new subdivision. The expectation is that a row of trees will muffle sound as well as provide some privacy for those along that border. Efforts will be made to see if Charlton Park may be willing to put up a fence. It is not known if they can be required to do so by the city.
- Judy Keeling will check on the availability of the Island Queen boat ride at Kensington.

ELECTION

If interested in running for Clubhouse Co-chair or Treasurer, please notify the Board by June 2nd. Election to be held on July 7th. Think about whether or not you have the skill set to fill one of these positions. Currently we have Donna Tilley running for co-chair and Nancy Page and Barb Kibler for treasurer.





½ Tlb Olive oil ½ Cup chopped onion ½ tsp Garlic Powder

1 – 14.5 oz Fire roasted diced tomatos

½ cup plus 6 Tlb chicken broth

1 tsp Basil Leaves ½ tsp Sugar 1½ Tlb Milk

Cook onions till tender, add all ingredients except milk & simmer for 15 minutes. When cool puree in a blender & return to sauce pan. Add mile, heat, & serve.

Serving suggestions: add a grilled cheese sandwich & enjoy!






Cucumber, Lemony, Dill, Cream Cheese Tea Sandwich's
