# "EARLY GOINGS" - By Pastor Mike

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

(Matthew 28:18-20 NIV)

2000 years ago, Jesus told us to *GO!* And for a while, we did. Church historians tell us that early American Methodism experienced phenomenal church growth. As we look back at the early Methodists, we can find at least two attributes that contributed to their success:

#### • A DEDICATION TO THE TASK AT HAND.

As early Americans migrated to a rugged West, the Methodists went with them. The early circuit riders were servants of Christ dedicated to the notion that the Church's primary task is to save lost souls. They weren't content to wait for lost souls to come to them. Instead they determined to go where the lost souls went. And in their "goings" they sacrificed many of the comforts that we now enjoy.

Early Methodist congregations worshiped in plain buildings designed for the purpose of reaching lost souls wherever lost souls could be found. The congregational cry of their hearts was deafening: "Salvation for the lost and holiness for the church." Every church member was a missionary and every paid minister was unacquainted with the notion of a 40-hour work week.

#### THE CONSTANT PURSUIT OF GOD'S BLESSINGS.

While diligent work and sacrificial ministry are always rewarded with success, American Methodism's expansion was enhanced by the prayers that saturated the work. God blessed the work because God's blessing was continually sought.

As members of a declining denomination it behooves us to embrace the attributes that led to the success of our predecessors. The pressing question for us today is whether or not we are willing to exchange the comforts we now enjoy for the blessings that God promises. If we will return to the prayerful dedication of our predecessors, we will certainly find the same blessings that it brought to them.


#### Dear Chapel Hill Ladies,


