- 10. How do the laws of teshuva form the basis of ALL Jesus' teachings on forgiveness?
- 11. In which stories and parables does Jesus teach God's basic teshuva principles?
- 12. How does Jesus address and invert all four rabbinical laws of teshuva in Matthew 18?
- 13. Why can Peter's question and Jesus' answer about forgiving 70×7 ONLY be about forgiving offenders who are repenting, even multiple times?
- 14. How does the Bible make clear distinctions between the two types of New Testament forgiveness: aphiemi and charizomai?
- 15. Why do Jesus and Paul use different words for forgiveness?
- 16. Why is this statement false: If you do not forgive all offenders, God will not forgive you?
- 17. Why did Jesus NOT use this definition of forgiveness: To let go of anger and bitterness?
- 18. What is the definition of forgiveness that Jesus used?
- 19. Why are forgiveness of sins and reconciliation never separated in the Bible?
