Minutes of the Interlaken Village Board of Trustees meeting held on Thursday October 10, 2019 at the Village Hall 8369 Main St., Interlaken, NY

MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Richard Richardson; Trustees: T Del Plato, J Pepper, K Barr and C Kempf.

OTHERS PRESENT: N Swartwood, Clerk-Treasurer, C Lysiak, Records Mgmt. Clerk, W Ahouse, DPW Super., J Border, Fire Chief, L Anderson, Police Chief, K Dinardo, Police Officer.

Mayor Richardson called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm with the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion to accept the September 12 and 26, 2019 meeting minutes by T Del Plato, second K Barr, carried.

PUBLIC TO BE HEARD: Karen Crane asked about the tree stumps at the water tower site. Mayor Richardson indicated they would be removed.

Chief Anderson introduced Office Kyle Dinardo to the Board. Completed training and is set to proceed on his own.

LIBRARY: No report sent. Board of Trustees want the Village to be listed as additionally insured on their policy.

FIRE: Chief Borden:

- 6 calls for October
- Air bottles came in and are in service
- Forestry equipment is all here, Ranger Williams will inspect and send paperwork in Monday or Tuesday
- Members did a water rescue training at Lodi State Park. County received a grant to put a small
  rescue boat with equipment for use at the south end of the lake. We will be putting a crew to
  work with Lodi and Ovid. Boat will be housed at Lodi.
- Air pack demo is postponed until after the first of the year
- Truck repairs will start next week
- Fire Prevention Week demonstrations at Elementary school on October 7, 2019
- Need to get the roof fixed asap. Damage is being done to items upstairs.

Wes said he has contacted Hubbard's. Chad Hubbard is having a hard time finding the right manifold to run the heat exhaust out the wall. Cooley is working on a price, but feels we would be better off going out the wall and says the roof isn't pitched enough so it will probably leak again if we go with roof mount. Wes also left a message with KangaRoof.

Wes said that Chad Hubbard is willing to work with the DPW to replace pipe and install new flashing.

Mayor Richardson indicated that the vents cannot be place elsewhere.

WATER: W Ahouse

- Water Tank Project- contractor went to tap 10" main on September 13<sup>th</sup>, pipe cracked (no blocking under valve). Had to shut down the Village water supply for approximately 2 hours to make repair. New 12" line passed pressure test and bacteria test. New tank foundation has been started. Service lines being run up 96A. Bore rig vibration loosened Dale Ellis service line (saddle rotten); hit main to Caravalho.
- Well levels very low
- Hunt Engineers started survey for lake line
- Read water meters
- Shut off unpaid accounts
- Trees cut and removed from water tower site
- Staked out several UFPO's

Mayor Richardson indicated Contractor will be pouring the floor next week. Contractor maintains schedule for operation of new water tank to be end of November. The water tower may come down this year.

#### SEWER: W Ahouse

- Getting lots of towels again
- Brewer's did an extra load out the plant
- Ordered new heater for the plant
- Changed mixing drum
- Installed new injection pump
- Installed manhole risers on Seneca St

Mayor Richardson indicated the new sewer project on hold for now, need to get through one capital project at a time. Would like to have Lodi pump their sewer to Interlaken. There are grants available. County sewer plant in Willard is not up to code. Would be advantageous to put in waterline should funding for sewer come through

### STREETS: W Ahouse

- Traffic control for milling on Seneca St and other areas in Village
- Should be paving Seneca St and Village Hall parking lot October 11th
- F250 tie rods and axel seals are complete at Borst's
- Brush pickup Dial-A-Truck is suspended. Should consider no brush pickup as there is no place to put it

### POLICE: Chief Anderson-no written report handed out

- 5 complaints
- Dodge fully operational
- Ford ready to go to Auctions International
- Solar panels on radar trailer expensive-need to make sure they are fully charged
- 4 square radar signs are \$5,500.00 and can be moved around the Village
