Then we were finalizing the plans for the Birthday Party. We have some work ahead of us this year and I think we're ready for it.

Our annual donation to these worthwhile charities may be late this year, but it's an important part of our commitment as an Auxiliary to help our Marines and our Veteran community.

Many years ago, our Auxiliary made a permanent motion to help with the cost of convention ads. The MCL & MCLA Convention is coming up, June 11 & 12, 2021 at the Gateway Centre, so we confirmed with the Detachment that we will be contributing half of the cost of the ad. We're always glad to do our part.

We have two tentative dates for our Rose Program and the Detachment's Flag Program. This is an important outreach for us. It makes us visible to the community, gives us a chance to recruit new members and at the same time, we can raise funds. The dates are April 17 and May 15. As mentioned, these dates are tentative, but mark your calendars now because we will need volunteers at the tables. Times and locations will be confirmed soon. A letter has been put together to present to merchants and vendors for donations. We'll discuss how best to approach this task at our upcoming meeting. As part of our annual giving, the Auxiliary set aside \$200 for the Detroit VA Hospital's annual baby shower for women veterans. The shower takes place the last Saturday of September, so we have time to work on this. I spoke with Bill Browning at the Detroit VA hospital to see if we made a cash donation for this event, would the VA get more "bang for the buck" than if we went shopping ourselves. Since the VA must buy from government approved vendors, it's very possible we could do better ourselves. This is another agenda item at our next meeting.

Another question about donations to the VA hospital came up at our last meeting. Is the VA

accepting paperback books and playing cards? With the COVID restrictions, books were not being accepted for a number of months because physical access to the VA hospital was limited. That's why they are in demand. We'll go over this at the next meeting and see about collecting books and cards and making a trip to the VA.

#### HISTORIAN'S CORNER

As some of you may know, I spent a year of my enlistment as a Sea Going Marine, as part of the Marine Detachment on the heavy cruiser USS St. Paul, a World War II era ship. She was outfitted with three turrets each with three 8" guns, and five turrets with twin 5" guns. I was aboard on her last deployment to Vietnam in 1970.

All of the Marines had undergone a month's



training at Sea School at MCRD San Diego, learning naval terminology, getting fitted for dress blues, and

really learning how to shine our brass, press our clothes, and look like a recruiting poster Marine. The new Marines assigned to the ship were required to be inspected by the St. Paul's Captain in our dress blues.

After the inspection I was told I was chosen to be the Captain's orderly. WOW, that was a nice surprise. One of the benefits with this assignment was that you had no other responsibilities but to be at his beck and call at all times, and did not get caught up in all of the other duties of the rest of the Marine Detachment.

So, every morning I would report to the Captain's cabin and remain outside his office. He would call for me during the day, often to go find one of his officers to report to his cabin. When he would walk throughout the ship, I would follow behind a few steps, ready to do whatever was needed. There were times he would tell me my services were not needed the rest of the day, and I was essentially off duty. I was never required to serve him food or coffee! He had his own personal Filipino steward to do that.

One day as we were sailing across the Pacific, I was on the bridge with the Captain while he was interacting with his officers. His Filipino steward came up to the bridge with a silver serving tray with coffee cups and a thermos of coffee. These were the officers of the deck. As they helped themselves to the coffee, the Captain turns to me and asked if I would like a cup, and of course I said yes sir! I remember turning around and the sailors watching me, shaking their heads and rolling their eyes (envious or disgusted?). Their looks made my day!

Unfortunately, I was not the Captain's Orderly for the entire deployment. I was to find out that our Captain of Marines liked to assign the job to other Marines after a month or so. I ended up when we were on the gun line off the coast of Vietnam down in the magazine passing 5" shells up a conveyor belt to the 5" turret manned by our Marines.

Being a Seagoing Marine was very special for me. My Dad was in the Marines in the late 1940's and was also Seagoing. He served on the USS Duluth, a light cruiser. Our ships ironically were both named for cities in Minnesota. Some coincidence!
