NOVEMBER 20 - WORLD DAY OF YOUTH: Instituted at the conclusion of the International Year of Youth and in conjunction with Saint John Paul II's World Youth Day gatherings, Palm Sunday has included this observance since 1985. Pope Francis, in addressing the youth, says, "Young people must say to the world. It is good to follow Jesus! You bring us the joy of faith and tell us that we must live the faith always with a young heart".

NOVEMBER 21 - MEMORIAL OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: This feast originated as a commemoration of the dedication of the Basilica of St. Mary's the New in Jerusalem in 543. An apocryphal source recounts that Mary's parents brought their three-year-old daughter to the Temple in Jerusalem to offer her to God, as was the custom. Inspired by a priest's vision, they left her there to serve God. This custom continued for centuries. The feast entered the Western calendar in 1585. Today, the feast celebrates the recognition of Mary as a temple where God lives.

Report on the Synodal Process



It was with gratitude to Pope Francis that the Diocese of Grand Falls began its Immaculate Conception. Based on responses heard and recorded, it was decided to create two reports: one to be forwarded to the Δtlantic Boxistary. at our own diocesan and parish levels. In the coming weeks, in the Sunday bulletin, you will be provided with the second report (condensed version) of the parish responses that

were forwarded to the Atlantic Region.

3. Social Justice

- We need to acknowledge scandals such as indigenous issues, atrocities of residential schools, sexual abuse, and the need for associated settlement agreements.
- We need to be more accepting and welcoming of all peoples: LGBTQ2 community, the homeless. the needy, the poor, the marginalized.
- Concern was expressed over the wealth of the Vatican while small churches struggle for survival.

NOVEMBER 22 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT CECILIA, VIRGIN, MARTYR: Cecilia is patron saint of musicians. Her association with music stems from a story that at her wedding feast she sang to God in her heart. It is recorded that while the profane music of her wedding was heard, Cecilia was singing in her heart a hymn of love for Jesus, her true spouse. Cecilia, her husband Valerian, as well as his brother Tiburtius, were martyred for their faith. She is one of seven women, besides the Blessed Virgin Mary, commemorated by name in Eucharistic Prayer I.

NOVEMBER 24 - MEMORIAL OF SAINT ANDREW DUNG-LAC, PRIEST, AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS: In the 16th century Christian missionaries went to live among the people of Vietnam. From the 17th to 19th centuries, some 130,000 Christians were martyred. Andrew Dung-Lac (born 1785) and Peter Thi, Vietnamese priests, were beheaded on December 21, 1839. A letter written in 1843 by Paul Le-Bao-Tinh, an imprisoned martyr, describes his faith in God's love and mercy: "I, Paul, in chains for the name of Christ, wish to relate to you the trials besetting me daily, in order that you may be inflamed with love for God and join with me daily in his praises, 'for his mercy is forever.' The prison here is a true image of everlasting hell: to cruel tortures of every kind - shackles, iron chains, manacles – are added hatred, vengeance, calumnies, obscene speech, quarrels, evil acts, swearing, curses, as well as anguish and grief. But the God who once freed the three children from the fiery furnace is with me always..." In June 1988, Pope John Paul II declared 117 Vietnamese martyrs saints of the Church.
