



VALLEY NEWS From the Secretary's Office

Brethren,

By now you are all probably aware that the Governor of Texas has lifted all State mandated COVID-19 restrictions effective March 10, 2021; however, businesses and other establishments can set their

own restrictions. In response, the Sovereign Grand Inspector General of Texas has directed that **to avoid any** confusion, the COVID-19 protocols that he has required after discussions with the Orient Executive Committee will continue to be enforced in our Scottish Rite buildings and at our Scottish Rite meetings until further notice.

Entry checks, hand sanitation, mask wearing, and social distancing will continue in spite of the State changes or any relaxation of the Grand Lodge requirements. His view is that we must continue to be vigilant in maintaining health and safety protocols in our activities. Now is not the time to become lackadaisical in our approach to keeping our members safe and healthy from COVID-19. The measured approach our Orient has taken over the last year has served us all well as we have slowly opened our activities but maintained safety protocols. **Our Temple building will remain closed to the general public until further notice.**


