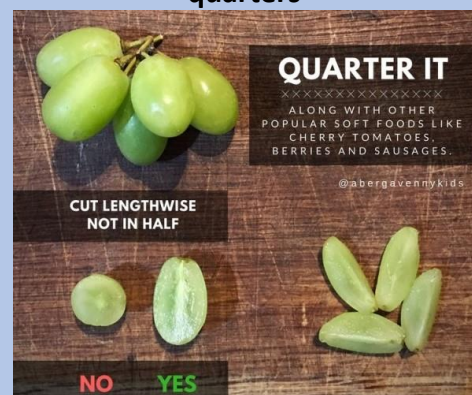
Bella the Blue Tit
