#### **June Tournaments**

As Kurtis said in his comments the dog days of summer have set in and the results from the two June tournaments are proof. The first tournament was a Wild Card on Monday June 13th. Twenty-four



members fished catching only 37 bass for a total weight of 65lbs 4 ounces. The first and second place anglers were the only members to bring in 5 bass limits. Kirk Bixler won 1st place with 11 lbs 4 ounces using a jig and trailer (lower left). Dave Keith was 2nd catching his 5 bass limit on jig head with a salt & pepper dead ringer (lower center). Other baits that proved successful were deep diving crank baits (upper center) and Lucky Craft Gunfish (top

right). Fishing didn't improve in the next tournament June 27th on Lake Balboa with 25 members catching 24 bass with a total weight of 41.5 pounds. First place angler Mike Crews was the only participant to bring in a 5 bass limit that weighed 11 lbs. 8 ounces. Baits that seemed to work were Texas rigged worms (lower right) in redbug (shown), green pumpkin and watermelon red along with Carolina rig with a variety of plastic baits (upper left) and Lucky Craft Gunfish.
