ENTRY AGREEMENT

All classes will be judged according to the specifications outlined in the HHSa prize list class descriptions and in accordance with United States Hunter Jumper Association (USHJA) Rules.

Competitors, trainers, horses, and horse owners must be current members of the HHSa in order to qualify for show championship and year end awards, with the exception of those riders entered only in the Short Stirrup / Opportunity Division. Riders wishing to accrue USHJA Outreach points must be members of USHJA for their points to count.

I have read the HHSa and USHJA rules and the specifications as printed in the Prize List for this Competition and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to the current HHSa Rulebook and the stated rules of the competition. By entering this competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the HHSa, USHJA, and the rules of the Competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the USHJA, HHSa, and of this competition. I will accept as final any decision of the Judge, the Show Steward, an HHSa Board Representative, and/or Hearing Committee on any question arising under any of these Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the HHSa, the USHJA their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS, OWNERS, PARENTS, AND TRAINERS

THE HHSa IS PROUD TO OFFER THE USHJA OUTREACH PROGRAM CLASSES

HHSa is both a USEF Alliance Partner AND a USHJA Affiliate Organization. The 2016 FALL CLASIC horse show is a USHJA Outreach competition Offering USHJA Outreach Classes, which qualifies our riders, who are members of USHJA, for Outreach Year-End awards for the state of Hawaii.

What does USHJ Outreach Competition mean?

The USHJA Outreach Program is open to both Juniors (17 & under) and Adult Amateurs. Riders need not be members of USHJA (United States Hunter Jumper Association) to compete in these classes, but if they are, their points will accrue, and they will qualify for zone year end awards. The advantage of this Outreach competition is that all HHSa members receive a discount on the yearly USHJA membership. This Outreach USHJA membership is only \$15 annually. Members will receive *Instride* Magazine plus all the rights and privileges of USHJA membership for that year. As a USHJA member, points accrued in Outreach classes will be sent to USHJA and Riders will qualify for USHJA zone year end awards.

To comply with this program, classes, which were formerly specified as HHSa medal classes, are now additionally USHJA Outreach Gold, Silver, or Bronze medal classes.

PLEASE READ THE APPROPRIATE CLASS SPECIFICATIONS FOR DETAILS AND CLASS REQUIREMENTS

This is a great opportunity for HHSa members to be able to join USHJA at a huge discount.

USEF and USHJA hold and provide no regulatory function regarding the competition or association. Because these competitions are not sanctioned or licensed, neither USEF nor USHJA will hear grievances or become involved in the regulatory process of the competition, association or their participants. General Rules and Information

No other persons besides show management or their representative may approach the Judge during the show. Approaching the Judge prior to the completion of the last class may result in disqualification from the show and/or a possible fine to be determined by the HHSА Awards Committee.

Dogs: Dogs on the show grounds must be on a leash at all times.

Eligibility: Ribbons won in Hunter Seat Classes **NOT** to jump shall not affect a rider's status in classes over fences. Eligibility to enter Green Horse/Green Rider classes should be checked with the HHSА Records Keeper and/or show secretary.

Entry Fees: Entry fees for all classes are listed under order of events. There will be a \$20 fee for all returned checks.

Post Entries: MUST BE MADE PRIOR TO THE CALL FOR THE PREVIOUS CLASS. Exhibitors submitting an entry blank after the closing date may post-enter **at the regular fee plus \$10 per class**, including both equitation and performance classes, providing the same horse and/or rider are listed on the original entry blank. In classes requiring individual work, post entries may be placed first in the starting order.

Note: A separate entry blank is required for each horse-rider combination.

Hat Rule: It is compulsory for all persons at HHSА hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is required when riding on the flat and jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. The Judge must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

HHSА Membership: Competitors, trainers, horses, and horse owners must be current members of the HHSА in order to qualify for show championship and year end awards. Current membership numbers must be included on entry blanks. Parents or guardians signing as trainer or coach do not have to be current members. **Exception: Competitors and horses in the Opportunity Classes - Short Stirrup Division are not required to be members of HHSА.**

USHJA Membership: This is a USHJA Outreach competition offering Bronze, Silver, and Gold medal classes for Juniors and Adult Amateurs. For Zone award points in these classes to be accrued, the rider must be a member of USHJA.

Volunteer Requirement for Year-End Awards: To qualify for 2016 year-end awards, each HHSА competing member must contribute at **least six (6) hours** of volunteer work at HHSА-sanctioned events during the 2016 show season. A rider under 14 years of age may have a parent or other sponsor volunteer at least 6 hours on his or her behalf. For a horse to be eligible for year-end awards, the rider or owner must volunteer at least 6 hours. Please contact the **Show Manager, Angela Woods 383-8743** for volunteer opportunities associated with this show.

Kickers: Horses that kick must be marked with a red ribbon on the tail.

Numbers: There is a \$5 fee for numbers not returned by the end of the show.

Prize Money: Checks will be mailed/postmarked within fourteen days after the close of the show. Checks will be payable to the **owner** listed on the entry blank.

Show Hours: The first Warm-Up class will begin promptly at 8:00 a.m. In the case of public address system malfunction, it is the rider's responsibility to be on time for each class.

Refunds: After the close of entries, refunds (less \$10 for handling expenses) will be mailed only upon written certification of unsoundness by a veterinarian (or judge during the show), or in the case of personal illness, by a physician. Certifications **must be received within three days after the close of the show. No exhibitor may withdraw his/her horse from the show without permission from the Show Secretary. If he/she does so, he/she may be disqualified for the remainder of the show and his/her fees forfeited.**

Tack: Correct tack must be used in all events. Regulations are stated in both the HHSA and USHJA Rule Books. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to be familiar with and comply with HHSA and USHJA rules.

Ties: In the case of ties for Championships, winner will be the horse that has accumulated the most points over fences. Should a tie still exist, dual Championships will be awarded and no reserve championship will be given.

Warm-Up Classes WU-1, WU-2, WU-3: Non-judged warm-up rounds will be available for a \$12 fee in the main arena. There will be **three** (3) specific warm-up sessions based on fence height. Fences will be available at the minimum height in each warm-up. This is a **non-judged** warm-up round. The designated warm up round that all warm up competitors will ride will be the posted Course A. Riders and horses may enter the Warm up multiple times with the same rider or different riders. NOTE: There is a limit of 5 rounds per horse per division. **See class listing for schedule of warm up classes.** An announcement will be made when the show arena is open for schooling.

NOTE CHANGE For Opportunity/Short Stirrups Classes: There will be no individual warm-up rounds for Opportunity/Short Stirrups. Instead, after the course is set for the 18" cross rail class, the arena will be open for at least a 20 minute period where Opportunity/Short Stirrups competitors may school with their trainers and warm up over the course or on the flat. There will be no charge for this warm up opportunity.

Schooling fences will also be set up in the warm up arena. Specific schooling regulations will be posted at the secretary's booth and must be observed by exhibitors. **NOTE: Exhibitors MUST WEAR HARD HATS while schooling or riding on the grounds.**

Jumping Order: Will be assigned according to the receipt of entries by the Show Secretary. Entries received last will be placed first in the jumping order, starting with post-entries.

IF ENTRIES WARRANT, CLASSES JUMPING THE SAME COURSE AT THE SAME HEIGHT WILL BE RUN TOGETHER. Prizes will be awarded separately according to the class entered.

Stabling: A limited number of stalls are available. See the stabling application form for details.

Directions: Malu Olu Ranch located at 41-426 Hihimanu St., Waimanalo Hawaii 96795 (808.225-0961): From Honolulu take Pali Hwy to Waimanalo via Kalaniane'ole Hwy and at the stoplight take a right onto Poalima St., and then a slight left onto Hihimanu Street.

Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. ***The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.*** Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions by HHSA against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

ATTENTION: In order to qualify for HHSA show championships and year end awards, rider, horse, and owner must be current members of HHSA. Proof of membership will be required. It is suggested that you attach a copy of all current HHSA membership cards for rider, horse, and owner, with your show entry forms. If you are riding a horse that you do not own, then the owner must be a current HHSA member and provide a copy of their membership card. **BE PREPARED TO PRESENT REQUIRED MEMBERSHIP EVIDENCE TO THE SHOW SECRETARY AT REGISTRATION.**

NOTE: Adult Amateurs will need to attach a copy of their USEF/USHJA Amateur Certification to participate in Adult Amateur classes and to qualify for show and year end championships and USHJA Outreach point accrual.

NOTE: OUTREACH competitors who wish their points to be accrued for USHJA Bronze, Silver, or Gold Medal Classes must be members of USHJA. Competitors may fill out application at registration and pay the USHJA Outreach show fee and yearly membership of \$15 at the competition for their points to count for that show.

Class Descriptions

Performance Working Hunter Division

All Hunters will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Fences shall simulate obstacles found in the hunting field, such as brush, stonewall, white board gate, rail, or fence, natural rail, chicken coop, or other natural obstacles. Performance Working Hunter Division is available at 2'3", 2'6", and 2'9" Classes are open to all riders (Children, Amateurs and Professionals) unless specifically noted. A Performance Working Hunter is a horse of any age, which is not restricted by previous showing in any division. No more than 50% of fences may be at the maximum height. Need not be jogged for soundness.

Performance Working Hunter – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3", 2'6", or 2'9" respectively.

Performance Working Hunter – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'3", 2'6", or 2'9" respectively.

Performance Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the Horse's mouth is required. Horses should be alert, obedient, responsive, and move freely. They should not be eliminated for small errors. Horses may be asked to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring, at the discretion of the judge. No more than 8 horses will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be eligible for this class horses must have been shown and judged in Performance Working Hunter, Course A or B at the respective height.

Adult Amateur Working Hunter

Low (2'6") and High (3'0") Adult Amateur Working Hunter. To be ridden by adults who meet the HHSA & USHJA eligibility requirements for Amateur status, and have USHJA amateur certification. To be judged on performance and soundness over a minimum of 8 fences. Fence heights not to exceed 3'0" for High Adult Amateur and 2'6" for Low Adult Amateur, spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. No more than 50% of the fences may be at the maximum height. Ponies may be ridden by an adult, suitability to count. Entries need not be jogged for soundness. **No cross entry between Low Adult Amateur Hunter and High Adult Amateur Hunter at the same show**

High Adult Amateur Working Hunter – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height.

High Adult Amateur Working Hunter – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height.

Low Adult Amateur Working Hunter – Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height.

Low Adult Amateur Working Hunter – Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height.

High Adult Amateur Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be judged as in Open Hunters. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in High Amateur Adult Working Hunter, Course A or B.

Low Adult Amateur Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be judged as in Performance Hunters under saddle. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Low Adult Amateur Working Hunter, Course A or B.

NOTE: Adult Amateurs must present a USEF/USHJA card stating Amateur Certification.

Children's Working Hunter

Low (2'6") and High (3'0") Children's Working Hunter - Open to horses and ponies to be ridden by a Junior Exhibitor (17 years and under). To be judged on performance and soundness (but need not be jogged in). In all classes, **manners will be emphasized and extreme speed will be penalized.** No more than 50% of fences may be at the maximum height. **No cross entry between Low Children's Working Hunter and High Children's Working Hunter at the same show.**

High Children's Working Hunter– Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height.

High Children's Working Hunter– Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height.

Low Children's Working Hunter– Course A: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height.

Low Children's Working Hunter– Course B: A minimum of 8 fences not to exceed 2'6" in height.

High Children's Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be judged as in Performance Hunters under saddle. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in High Children's Working Hunter, Course A or B.

Low Children's Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be judged as in Performance Hunters under saddle. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Low Children's Working Hunter, Course A or B.

Miscellaneous Hunter Classes

Green Horse or Green Rider

Green Horse or Green Rider Working Hunter – Course A: Open to a horse or a rider who has not jumped any course of fences (hunter or jumper) higher than 2'3" in a USEF, USHJA or HHSA Recognized Show. (Either horse or the rider need to qualify for Green, not the entire combination). To be judged on performance and soundness over a minimum of 6 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. Changes of lead through the trot will not be penalized. Need not be jogged for soundness. Horses or Riders may stay in this section indefinitely, if eligible, but may not win the Year-End Championship more than once. No more than 50% of the fences may be at the maximum height.

Green Horse or Green Rider Working Hunter – Course B: To be judged as in Course A.

Green Horse or Green Rider Working Hunter Under Saddle: To be judged as Performance Hunters under saddle, but not to gallop. To be eligible for this class, horses must have been shown and judged in Green Horse or Green Rider Working Hunter, Course A or B.

English Pleasure Horse Division

The English Pleasure Horse may be a stallion, mare, or gelding of any type or breed. It is imperative that the horse gives the distinct appearance of being a pleasure to ride and display a pleasurable attitude. To this end, all gaits must be performed with willingness and obvious ease, cadence, balance and smoothness.

Open Bridle Path Hack: To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring and to back easily and stand quietly. Emphasis shall be placed on actual suitability to purpose.

Open Hunter Under Saddle: Open to horses and ponies of all ages. To be shown at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. A hand gallop may be requested. Emphasis shall be placed on suitability of purpose.

Open English Pleasure Horse \$100 Stake: Open to horses and ponies. To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. There is an emphasis on manners and ability to afford a pleasurable ride. Money awarded to first place only.

Note: *The year end award for the pleasure division will be a cumulative total of the above 3 classes for all shows in 2016.*

Equitation Division

USHJA Outreach / HHSA Medal Classes

Open to riders 17 & under and Adult Amateurs with USHJA Amateur Certification. Children and Adult Amateur Medal classes are run together but if there are at least two riders per section, the classes will be pinned separately.

Bronze, Silver and Gold Medal Outreach Classes test a rider's ability to navigate a course consisting of a minimum of six obstacles and one or two changes of direction. Classes are offered at three levels ranging from 2'3, 2'6", and 2'9". Additional tests may be required and may be incorporated into the over fences round **or** done collectively after the over fences round at course designer, show management, and/or judge's discretion.

The Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medal classes are open to Adult Amateurs and Juniors 17 years of age and under. Competitors in these classes may qualify for year-end awards in two ways:

- Competitors who are HHSA members can accrue points toward HHSA Year-End Medal Awards;
- In addition, Juniors, who are USHJA members, and Adult Amateurs can accrue points toward USHJA Outreach Program Year-End Awards.

Amy Rich Memorial / USHJA Outreach Bronze / HHSa Medal Class (2'3")

Riders may not cross-enter into any class exceeding 2'6" at the same competition. No combinations or oxers are allowed at this height. Open to Juniors 17& under and Adult Amateurs. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately.

Amy Rich Memorial: Riders 13 and under who are also members of HHSa will accrue points for the end of year Amy Rich Award in this class. This memorial was established to give incentive to the very young and to honor the woman who devoted her life to the encouragement and instruction of young people in the care and riding of horses. This Amy Rich Year End Award is only open to riders 13 years of age and under. Riders lose eligibility for consideration if they compete over a course in any competition where the height exceeds 2'3". This class will be held concurrently with the USHJA Outreach Bronze Medal Class and the HHSa Medal class. Riders 13 and under may also accrue HHSa Medal points in this class and, if they are members of USHJA, can accrue USHJA Outreach Bronze Medal points as well.

Juniors not qualified for Amy Rich may accrue HHSa Medal points in this class and if they are members of USHJA may accrue USHJA Outreach Bronze year-end points as well. Adult Amateurs may accrue both HHSa Medal year-end points and USHJA Outreach Bronze Medal year-end points in this class.

USHJA Outreach Silver / HHSa Medal Class (2'6")

Riders may not cross-enter into any class exceeding 3'0" at the same competition. No in and out combinations are allowed at this height. Riders may not have competed in a national medal class at 3'0 or higher during that competition year. Open to both Juniors 17& under and Adult Amateurs. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately. Juniors may accrue HHSa Medal points in this class and if they are members of USHJA may accrue USHJA Outreach Silver year-end points as well. Adult Amateurs may accrue both HHSa Medal year-end points and USHJA Outreach Silver Medal year-end points in this class.

Victor Hugo Vidal / USHJA Outreach Gold / HHSa Medal Class (2'9")

Riders may not cross-enter into any class 3'3" or higher at the same competition. Combinations and further testing are encouraged but not required. Open to both Juniors 17& under and Adult Amateurs. If there are at least two riders in each section, the class will be pinned separately.

Victor Hugo-Vidal Medal: This is an HHSa year-end award in loving memory of Victor Hugo-Vidal. He was a fair judge with a great love of the "underdog" who rose to the occasion. This year-end award is open to both Juniors and Adult Amateurs. Juniors may accrue Victor Hugo Vidal Medal year-end points in this class, HHSa Medal points in this class and, if they are members of USHJA, may accrue USHJA Outreach Gold year-end zone points as well. Adult Amateurs may accrue both Victor Hugo Vidal Medal year-end points, HHSa Medal year-end points, and USHJA Outreach Gold Medal year-end points in this class.

NOTE: There is no cross entry between any medal section (Bronze, Silver or Gold) in a show, however, riders may change from one section to another in subsequent shows.

Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump (13 years & under): To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion.

Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump (14 to 17 years): To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion.

Adult Amateur Hunter Seat Equitation Not to Jump: Open to riders who meet HHSa requirements for Amateur status with USEF/USHJA certification. To be judged at the walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Additional USHJA tests may be requested at the judge's discretion.

Note: Cross-entry in other Equitation age divisions is not permitted.

Opportunity Classes - Short Stirrups Division

Open to riders of all ages. These classes are designed for the less experienced rider who wishes to gain show experience that has shown for no more than two (2) show seasons (partial seasons to count).

Short Stirrups/Opportunity Hunter Seat Equitation (walk & trot) not to jump: To be judged at a walk and trot both ways of the ring.

Short Stirrups/Opportunity Hunter Seat Equitation (walk, trot, canter) not to jump: To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring.

Short Stirrups/ Opportunity Hunter Seat Equitation Over Cross-rails: To be judged over a maximum of 5 cross-rails not to exceed 18". Cross-rails may be taken at the trot or canter. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless they are the fault of the rider.

Short Stirrups/ Opportunity Hunter Seat Equitation Over Fences 2'0": To be judged over a maximum of 5 fences not to exceed 2'0. Fences may be taken at the trot or canter. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not considered unless they are the fault of the rider.

NOTE THE CHANGE IN WARM-UP FOR OPPORTUNITY/SHORT STIRRUPS FOR THIS SHOW. As soon as the course is set for the 18" cross rail class, there will be open schooling for opportunity competitors. Trainers may be present in the ring.

Special Classes

TURKEY DERBY

Low Turkey Derby \$100 Stake 2'3" - 2'6"

High Turkey Derby \$100 Stake 2'9" - 3'0"

This is a two-round format utilizing the open numerical system to score competitors in the Classic Hunter Round (first round) on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. In addition, the base score in the Handy Hunter Round (second round) reflects brilliance of pace and handiness. In each round, after the judge's base score is given, one point will be added for each high-option fence jumped up to a maximum of two. The point must be added even if there is a refusal, rail down, or a loss of good jumping style at that fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height fence option. Obstacles are reminiscent of the hunt field and must offer a variety of appearances, such as natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs and/or natural foliage. The Handy Hunter Round should simulate riding over hunt country and incorporates options such as tight turns, clever options for jump approaches, hand galloping and trotting a fence.

Fences for the Low Derby are set at 2'3, with two high-option fences set at 2'6".

Fences for the High Derby are set at 2'9" with two high-option fences set at 3'0".

Horses scoring 60 or above after the first round are eligible to return for the second round. The pair with the highest two-round score is declared the class winner. The top three riders split the prize money 1st \$45, 2nd \$30 3rd \$25. Ribbons are awarded to eight places. **At least three riders must compete for the class to be held.**

EQUITATION CHALLENGE

Low Equitation Challenge 2'6"

High Equitation Challenge 3'0"

Open to Juniors (17 & under) and Adult Amateurs. Competitors will ride a posted course over 8 fences with all of the fences at the maximum height. Class is judged on the rider. Jumping faults of the horse are not to be penalized unless they are the fault of the rider. When all competitors have completed the round, the competitors will go back into the ring for further testing by the judge. Riders may compete either in the Low Equitation Challenge or the High Equitation Challenge, not in both. Ribbons will be awarded to eight places. **At least three riders must compete for the class to be held.**

FUN CLASSES AT THE END OF THE DAY NOTE: Riders must have a signed show waiver to enter

RIDE A BUCK – Competitors enter the arena with a dollar bill under each calf. Riders follow the judge's instructions. Riders not following the judge's instructions are eliminated. Riders losing both of their dollars are eliminated. The last remaining rider with at least one dollar held by their calf wins all the money.

EGG AND SPOON – Riders pay the \$10 fee at the gate to enter the arena and receive their egg in their spoon. Riders must follow all the judge's instructions. The last rider with their egg still in their spoon wins all the entry money from the class.
