Zoo Raptor Rehabilitation Update



Dr. Victoria Milne, senior veterinarian at the El Paso Zoo, will present an update on the Zoo Raptor Rehabilitation Program. The Zoo has been the primary location in the El Paso region for injured and orphaned raptor care since 2015. The Zoo treats 150-200 raptors per year, with injuries ranging from fractured bones to electrocutions, and illnesses including West Nile Virus and lead poisoning.

Dr Philip Lavretsky is an assistant professor at the University of Texas at El Paso. Dr. Lavretsky will draw from his extensive molecular research with various waterfowl species in presenting our November program.

AT FEATHER LAKE

In September, the Feather Lake basin got a couple of modest shots of storm runoff, each enough to flood maybe half the basin. Each time, the water lasted only about 4 days. Unfortunately, both of these brief periods with water present coincided with weekends when scouts from Boy Scout Troop 4, under the leadership of Eagle Scout candidate Patrick McGrail, were scheduled to remove accumulated trash from within the basin. During the second weekend (Sep 22-23), the scouts worked both days removing a lot of trash from areas that were dry and accessible. But the central part of the basin, site of the most extensive trash accumulations. was flooded and inaccessible.

Our next workday at Feather Lake will be **Sat.**, **October 6**, starting at **8 a.m.** Provided we have a dry basin, Troop 4 will return to do battle with the trash in the central area. Come on down and help them out! Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.





Feather Lake Special Report

October 6 was the third and final session of the project Boy Scouts from Troop 4 carried out to remove trash from the Feather Lake basin.

During the first two work sessions, the central part of the basin – where most of the trash accumulates – was flooded and inaccessible; the scouts worked on removing older trash from the dry areas.





On October 6th, the whole basin was dry and accessible. The scouts did an excellent job removing all of the trash washed in with the most recent storms in September.

They also removed all 5 of the sofas that had washed in last year.



Birding Trip - South Texas

We are happy to announce this trip to one of the birding meccas in the US. The dates are **November 2-6, 2018** (these dates do not include travel days). We will offer 5 days of birding to as many of the best spots in the area as we can get to. Come for all or any of the excursions. The fall migration is wonderful and some of the birds that can be seen are: Plain Chachalaca, Least Grebe, Anhinga, Little Blue Heron, Tricolored Heron, White Ibis, Roseate Spoonbill, Hook-billed Kite, Green Jay, all three kingfishers, White-tailed Kite, Crested Caracara, Aplomado Falcon, American Oystercatcher, Dunlin, terns, gulls and skimmers, Common Pauraque, Great Kiskadee, Tropical Kingbird, "Mangrove" Yellow Warbler and many more.

Some of the areas we might visit are Bentsen State Park, Anzalduas Park, Old Hidalgo Pumphouse, Quinta Mazatlán, Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge, Valley Nature Center, Frontera Audubon Society, Estero Llano Grande State Park, Harlingen Thicket, Laguna Atascosa National Wildlife Refuge, Resaca de la Palma State Park, South Padre Island, Brownsville Landfill, and Sabal Palm Audubon Center.

Participants will be responsible for their own travel arrangements and hotel reservations. Harlingen will be the headquarters for the trip. Detailed itineraries will be provided at a later date to those interested.

Costa Rica Birding Tour

El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon is planning a Costa Rica Tour for March 2019. The places we will be going offer some great bird watching. The estimated price will be \$1,817.51 with the field trip guide paying his own way. The optional boat trip offered on Saturday, Mar. 17, will be an additional \$30.00. The trip cost quoted is for land-based tour. Roundtrip airfare to San Jose, Costa Rica, is the responsibility of each participant.

Some of the possible birds to be added to your life list include the following; Spotted Wood-Quail, Costa Rican Pygmy-Owl, Resplendent Quetzal, Collared Trogon, Buffy Tuftedcheek, Ruddy Treerunner, Ochraceous Pewee, Barred Becard, Zeledonia, Golden-browed Chlorophonia, Volcano Junco, Talamanca Hummingbird, Green Violetear, Gray-tailed Mountaingem, Volcano Hummingbird, Scintillant Hummingbird. Fiery-throated Hummingbird, Violet Sabrewing, Flame-colored and Slaty flowerpiercer, Lattice-tailed Trogon, Yellow-eared Toucanet, Streak-crowned Antvireo, Tawny-faced Gnatwren, White-throated Shrike-Tanager, Ashy-throated Bush-Tanager, Tawny-crested Tanager, Emerald, and Blue-and-gold tanagers, Keel-billed Toucan, Great Green Macaw, White-winged Becard, Sunbittern, Acadian Flycatcher, and Wood Thrush. Rarities seen here on occasion include Rufous-fronted Wood-Quail, Red-fronted Parrotlet, Rufous-vented Ground-Cuckoo, Black-crowned Antpitta, Gray-headed Piprites, and Sharpbill.

Additionally, \$200 of each person's trip price will be donated to the El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon Society to help us fund important local bird conservation activities. Please contact Scott for details regarding the itinerary and schedule. There are only 10 spaces. We need to get a sense of who would be interested in going on this trip.
