Pastor's Corner

Happy New Year! And, closer to my heart, "Happy Epiphany!" The reason I like to emphasize the season of Epiphany is not only because it gets overshadowed by seasons like Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter, but because it is a vital bridge in our calendar, or to put it better, a natural bridge on the path of living out "our story" – the Christian story, with its themes (or "arcs") of *promise/anticipation*, *birth/arrival*, *revealing* (Epiphany time!), *ministry*, *suffering*, *death*, and *resurrection*. So, I encourage you to keep seeing (in the events of Jesus' life) *how* the Word became flesh, *how* the true light was shining in the world, and the times the darkness tried (*but failed*) to overcome it. Epiphany is about opening our eyes to the many and varied ways that God's Word manifested himself (and still does).

As a final note, I want to acknowledge a specific example of God manifesting his light: through all of your love and support to Wiebke and me. Both in the many, ongoing, ways – such as your participation in our ministry teams in 2024 or continued words of encouragement – and in the special times – like the gestures of generosity and material support – I can speak for both of us that we are incredibly grateful to be part of a congregation and faith family that loves God and loves us. I look forward to the ways we can honor God *together* (in the ministry teams and new opportunities to sacrifice for the glory of his name), grow in faith *together* (in small groups and other spiritual development

means), and improve our community and world *together*. Perhaps the best motivation to keep all these things "going," is the gratitude for the grace God shows us, like a fountain that keeps going, and doesn't stop flowing. Peace to you, and *Soli Deo Gloria*.

I have a confession to make ... as Chuck West was giving the happy report on 12/15 about the Capital Campaign reaching its goal and us having paid off the loan, I was tempted to take the fundraising thermometer (moved from the hallway and was right next to me as Chuck gave his great report) and get up and TEAR IT IN TWO! 😊 I wanted to convey the joy and excitement that the Capital Campaign team and Session felt (and still feel) over the achievement – God working through all of you – in a space of 11 months, completing 3 projects (parking lot, roof, and outdoor sign) that were estimated to take 2.5 years to do ... and THEN, paying them ALL off, not in the 5 years anticipated to do so, but in just under one year! We have raised approximately \$140,000, and all that remains is roughly \$7,500 to pay back the Cemetery Fund for the amt. we borrowed to upgrade the power supply as needed. Your continued Capital Campaign gifts and offerings will go to this. You've heard us say it, but it bears repeating (just like the Psalms do) – "God is good" ... "Give praise to the Lord" and "forget not his benefits." I want to thank the Campaign Team (Chuck West - chair - along with Jenn McKay, Deb Artman, Jolene Kostelansky, Tim Eckman, Charlene McKay, along with Kelly Kapelewski for the many office/administrative elements, and the Upkeep Team for their diligent and indispensable oversight with the projects), along with the fundraising team, the many other cheerleaders, pledgers/donors, workers, and various supporters. Finally, thank you for your continued support until the Cemetery Fund amt. is fully paid back. God bless you.

Devotional - - Luke 2:41-52

There's a story between the birth narratives of Jesus and the heralding of John the Baptist preceding the core of Christ's public ministry, the Epiphany story of when he was a boy. When I was boy, I walked to school by myself, well with my twin brother, Chris (sometimes by myself though when we were mad at each other). In the afternoon, we came back the same way. A few times in the darkest part of the winter, we would come home when the light was failing and almost gone. But I never felt unsafe. Now, of course, most children are taken by bus or car. Parents are worried about all kinds of dangers that might be waiting for them. One of the remarkable things about the story at the end of Luke 2 is that Mary and Joseph were happy to set off with their large family group from Galilee without checking that Jesus was with them. *[I wish we still had the kind of close-knit mutual trust this account implies]*. Now, consider the agony of Mary and Joseph – this is more than momentarily losing your child in the store during the Christmas rush; they were searching for <u>THREE DAYS</u>! *[I wonder if there is some symbolism there?]* ... Then contrast this with the calm response of Jesus when they found him. Mary blurts out an accusation tinged with a drop of guilt and a pound of relief: "How could you do this to us?!" Jesus accepts no blame, but in total "chill" as the kids say, replies, "I have been busying myself in my Father's work." Remember how Mary "treasured up things in her heart"? Well this must have been more like a stab in the notebook of her heart. As will be the case *many* more times in the future with Jesus and the people around him, this scene is accented with

surprise; Jesus doesn't do or say what Mary or Joseph were expecting. [I challenge you to count the number of times that happens in just the book of Luke alone!] ... It will be like that with us, too. God in a manger, a boy teaching in the Temple, a convicted Savior on a cross, and about 100 times in between. Every time we relax and think we've really understood him, he will be up ahead, or perhaps staying behind while we go on without thinking. I can't tell you how important it is to consciously and regularly "re-pace" yourself with Jesus, leaving room for surprise, for discipleship always involves the unexpected. One last thought, the Temple is an image pregnant and bursting with meaning. The Temple was meant to be a "symbolic" house for God – not the "real" thing, but pointing to the real thing. Guess what the *real* Temple was? ... It was the little boy seated inside the symbolic structure, astonishing the teachers within. And this true and perfect Temple came so that by his life, death, and reign, he could make us little true temples for God's Spirit. We may want to reflect on whether we have taken Jesus himself for granted; if Mary and Joseph could do it, there is every reason to suppose that we can too. We mustn't assume he is accompanying us as we go off on our own business. If we suspect the lack of his presence, we must be prepared to hunt for him, to search through prayer, Scripture, and gathered worship, and not give up until we find him. And when we do find him busy with the Father's work, remember, he may not say or do what we expect. Happy Epiphany.

I was left with relief for that outcome, but still anxiety for the "financial" ramifications of this event. Though Wiebke was reassuring that we would be okay (with our Financial Peace Univ.



planning for situations like this), it still caused me some anxiety. Here is the place where I see God's hand very clearly: when one looks at the unplanned expenses this accident caused, it is very close to the amount of the Christmas gift. The more that sunk in the more I marvel at God, not only for how he cares and provides for his children, but how he uses his *other children*, the church family, to care for one another ... including in ways they don't fully see or realize. God is truly awesome. I am truly blessed, and you are instruments of grace in his hand. Thank you and God bless you.

2025 ON THE MOVE

Pastor Brian and I have been successful in bringing ON THE MOVE to Puckety Church.

On the Move is a program from the University of Pittsburgh, School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences for improved mobility in older adults. OTM is a group based motor learning exercise program designed to improve walking in older adults.

It specifically challenges the nervous system with stepping and walking patterns. Music is used during the class to facilitate the appropriate timing and coordination of walking.

I have completed my training and certification to instruct this class and have taught at three of the local YMCA's and the RCAC Senior Center in Oakmont (they loved the class and have asked me to continue working with them to maintain their skills). I have a passion for helping older adults to enhance their health and prevent falls and improve balance.

There is a stipend paid for your involvement in this class by University of Pittsburgh which will be explained at the meet and greet meeting before you begin. The class will be held TWICE A WEEK FOR TWELVE WEEKS. They recommend that you attend as many as possible but understand that appointments and obligations will be accepted.

They recommend 8 to 10 people in a class and the classes will be held during the day. Times and dates will be forthcoming. Folks with walkers and canes are allowed.
