Dear Friends,

WEEKLY PASTORAL LETTER (28) – 22nd October 2020

'Wait for the Lord. Be strong. Let your heart be strong. Yes, wait for the Lord'. Psalm 27:14.

Our society has been especially designed to exclude waiting. The advertising industry seeks to persuade us that everything can be obtained instantly: instant credit, instant satisfaction, instant rewards. One of the first credit cards had as its slogan, "Taking the waiting out of wanting" and that's not a bad summary of how our society works. The psalmist had an altogether different approach. For him, waiting was something good and he encourages his fellow worshippers to wait for the Lord. The truth, of course, is that the most valuable things in life require waiting – and often a great deal of it. There is no way in which you can instantly acquire maturity, a godly character or a strong and trusting relationship. They require years of patient, thoughtful, prayerful development.

At times it looks as if God takes a long time to get round to answering our prayers. He doesn't conform to the requirements of our instant society and that can be extremely frustrating. Surely, if he is omnipotent he should be able to respond with speed and efficiency to our requests. He sometimes keeps us

waiting for years. Why does he do this? Above all it is because he loves us and he knows that it is only as we slowly build up a trusting relationship with him that we will ever really grow up in our Christian maturity. This is a hard word for our modern world. It isn't what people want to hear. They want blessings today, and miracles to order. But God wants followers who will trust him whatever happens. He wants us to be people who have built up a strong, resilient relationship with him that will be able to stand up to any challenge, discouragement or disappointment.

This is yet another illustration of the upside down nature of the Kingdom of God. God loves us so much that he wants to rewire our thinking and help us to see that waiting is the surest way possible of helping us to grow. My question is: Are we good at waiting for the Lord? If not, how are you going to learn to develop this skill?

Closed....Reopened....Closed and reopening again.....

I would like to express my since thanks to most of our churches responded promptly for the District Chairs' strong recommendation for the churches to pause for a short period and also for being willing to re-look and review the existing risk assement and amend them in line with Tier 2 / 3 guidence / changing Government regulations before reopen again!

As you may aware that Government Covid 19 latest guidence say that places of worship play an important role in providing spiritual leadership for many individuals, and in bringing communities and generations together. However, their communal nature also makes them places that are particularly vulnerable to the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19). In our areas (Havering & Essex) subject to "COVID alert level – high" restrictions, we must not mix outside of our household or support bubble indoors, including within a place of worship. We always guided by the Conference & District as they keep in touch with the Government Officials regularly and they are doing what we can to respond to a rapidly changing situation. District main aim in sending the email a week ago was to support us as there is a general understanding that the Church must not be in a position of putting people at risk. The fact that so many of our members, adherents and associated groups' members are in higher risk categories means that we have a pastoral responsibility not to arrange anything which might heighten that risk and the safety of our congregations and building users has to be our first priority.

However, If local trustees choose to remain open, they will need to pay very careful attention to their risk assessments again and will need to consider the

fact that we are in a context of high risk of transmission of the virus. This does not mean you shouldn't open, but should church trustees make the decision to remain open, it is with the very clear understanding of the risks associated with this and to ensure that you have robust risk assessments in place before we reopen.

As we have been informed by the PM that the country has moved to a tiered system for lockdown. The Government's current advice is that churches in England can remain open. Each church will need to consider the missional imperative in deciding whether or not to remain open or to reopen for worship. The safety of those coming into the building must be paramount and consideration given to the practicalities involved. Each decision will be individual to each local area and the decision and responsibility lies with the Managing Trustees (the Church Council) which should be chaired by a presbyter with the notice of 14 days calling a meeting. All decisions and delegations may be made by a simple majority vote.

We know that these are far from easy decisions, however, please know you have my support as you work with others in choosing the most appropriate way to respond to be in safer environment at your church buildings. I would like to encourage the churches and ministers who are offering on line services to continue to do so in the future, meantime, I would like to encourage the churches to see whether you are ready to be back in your church buildings to worship in person in a couple of Sundays time (on 8th November) with robust risk assessments and a very clear understanding of the risks.

As MCH & District will monitor the regulations produced by governments and to update the guidance, so we hold all those who have to interpret and implement decisions in our prayers and we ask you to continue to pray for the Government, MCH, District, Circuit and Churches and for each other.

Preachers available chart

In the light of current situation, I will not take steps to make the tradional quarterly preaching plan for the next quarter(December 2020 to February 2021) but Cathy Simmons and I jointly will arrange the preachers' available chart. Thank you for all LPs, WLs and Ministers for you available dates which you have passed them to us. In the current Covid virus situation, we are only planning dates one month at a time. The available chart will be centralised for the operational purpose. Please do contact me directly any churches need preachers / ministers for their services either in person or on line / zoom / YouTube services. Please note that a couple of our staff and a few Local

preachers are in isolation currently. Some LPs have decided to do on line services only due to their health conditions.

All the requests should come to the Superintendent so, I will allocate the preachers for your Church services monthly. This will be kept under constant review. How each congregation emerges out of lock down will vary immensely How worship will happen when we can gather, could be very different. We know that sustaining the former tradional number of services and churches is not possible and maybe not desirable. Congregations need to meet to discern what has been learned through this time and how their identity and practice might be radically different in the future. couple of our circuit churches have decided to continue to meet on line and other 2 churches have postponed reopening of their building for some time.

Whether you reopen your church building for worship in person or continue to worship on line or not to open at all, may you all know the quiet assurance of God's love and his peace in these unsettling times. Let us keep each other in prayer over the next few weeks, and let us pray that as this new chapter in our churches and the Circuit open, that all of us together will be able to continue that great mission we have been entrusted with of building God's kingdom. Join us to pray for the current situation we all face and to pray for those who work within and/or are affected by the Coronavirus (Covid-19). And, let's continue to pray that we take steps forward which are safe and full of grace, as we slowly work out how best to do things.
