# 2015: A YEAR OF REGENERATION Major Effort Launched to Increase Membership in St. Casimir's and PNCC

In compliance with the Phase I—Action Plan for Polish National Catholic Church (PNCC) Parishes in 2015: A Year of Regeneration, as established by the Future Direction Supreme Council Subcommittee: Based on the 2014 General Synod, St. Casimir's has formed a Growth Committee charged with implementing the first of five themes that were developed at the 2014 Synod, namely:

- I. Growth and Membership
- II. Increase Spirituality
- III. Lifelong Learning
- IV. Sacred Vocations
- V. Community Involvement

Recently, St. Casimir's executed the first step in a plan to stimulate growth and membership in its parish by mailing a brochure with an invitation to "Come, Worship With Us" to more than 100 individuals. The brochure includes a brief description of the features and benefits available as a member of St. Casimir's Parish and the PNCC.

The message in the brochure was the basis for the creation of a Welcome Booklet that answers some of the questions that might be asked by someone interested in knowing more about our church and the PNCC as an organization.

We recognize that our church is not only a place of worship, but also a place to develop wholesome social relationships. To that end, starting on Sunday, August 2, a pair of parishioners will be stationed at the church entrance to provide a personal welcome and assistance to everyone who comes to Sunday Mass.

Other plans to stimulate interest in our church include changes to our web site, expansion of our newsletter and possibly an upgrade to our shut-in service that provides a live video presentation of the Mass over the internet who are unable to attend; perhaps adding videos of parish functions and activities.

The Action Plan also suggests the acquisition and distribution of promotional items to advertise the parish and its invitation to worship.

St. Casimir's is already quite active in the area of Community Involvement and the leaders and members of the various parish organizations, including the youth group, have agreed to increase efforts to assist groups such as St. Paul's Soup Kitchen, Centralville Neighborhood Action Committee, Operation Christmas Child and other charitable programs.

#### In Memoriam

Charles (Chuck) A. Wojcik, 86, born in Wakefield, MA, died June 4, 2015. In 1934 he moved with his parents, Stanley and Josephine, to Lowell, MA, where Chuck graduated from Lowell High School. He played baseball and ran track. His team tied for the NE Scholastic Championship, where he won the 600-yard dash and participated in the relay. He attended Lowell Textile Institute for one year then transferred to



Michigan State University, earning a B.S. in chemistry. While at MSU, he was in R.O.T. C. and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the US Army Reserve upon graduation.

Chuck began work for E.I. du Pont de Nemours in Jan. 1952. In April he was activated and served 2 years during the Korean Conflict. His assignment took him to Mt. Washington, NH, and Yuma, AZ, to test military gear in extreme weather. Upon discharge, Chuck resumed his career with the DuPont Explosives Department. During his 41 years with DuPont he was involved in production, sales, and the startup of several chemical plants in the Midwest and Southern United States. His last transfer was to Jackson Laboratory, NJ. He retired Oct. 31, 1993.

Chuck is survived by his wife of 56 years, Phyllis, his 3 sons, Martin (Colleen), Michael (Andrea), Russell (Susan), and 6 grandchildren: Andrea, Mikaela, Blake, Denae, Sarah, and Matthew. He was very proud of his family and their accomplishments.

Chuck was a man of strong character and integrity demonstrated by his love of family, friends, neighbors, and others. He made the world a better place with his humor and kindness. His memory will be cherished as he has passed to be with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Chuck will be interred in Lowell, MA, with a service at St. Casimir's Church. A celebration of Chuck's life was held on June 20 at the DuPont Country Club in Wilmington, Delaware.

## Ambitious Progam Planned by Members of St. Casimir's Growth Committee

After only a few short months, the newly formed Growth Committee has already started to execute its plan to promote St. Casimir's Parish by inviting people to "Come Worship with Us On Sunday." A brochure using that phrase as a theme was mailed to approximately 130 individuals in the greater Lowell area. At the present time there is no method by which to determine the results of that mailing; unofficial observations have indicated three or four visitors may have come.

Beginning on Sunday, August 2, everyone who enters the church will be welcomed by two greeters and given a copy of the weekly bulletin, a song sheet and a welcome booklet.

Other actions being considered by the committee include visual improvements to our newsletter, website, and other promotional material; improvements to our internet Mass for shut-ins, and access to video programs of parish functions and events are also being planned.
