He stood up to read, <sup>17</sup>and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: <sup>18</sup>"The Spirit of the LORD is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for

the blind, to set the oppressed free, <sup>19</sup>to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor."

## Reflections from Rev. Amy

At this very moment, I am looking at the newspaper for today. Yes! We still get a hardcopy newspaper, my husband Tim, just CAN'T give it up! My kids say "Dad, you are so old!" Ha haa. He takes it in stride, while putting the newspaper up to cover his face.

Here is what strikes me in the newspaper today, advertisements! Tons of things are being advertised. Now of course, I realize that these places of business set these ads to be run quite some time ago, and it funds the newspaper business, but it got me thinking. While we are all at home for the time being, I can't help but notice how my definition of what is essential is changing. Of course, in addition to being at home, we are worried and afraid of what each day will bring. So frankly, I don't really care about:

" a free 24inch Barre Shelf with Teak Tray with an installation of a Walk-In bath" or a "free estimate and in-home demonstration of Leaf Guard Gutters, complete with a 99cent installation charge".

I am not trying to dump on these particular companies, I am sure that they have quality people and products. And at the same time, it is clear to me that I don't care about those things 'RIGHT NOW'. I can only imagine that for the vast majority of us, our priorities in life have become very clear to us. And bathtubs and new gutters are likely not on our list.

My family, my friends, my church folk..... all so dear to me and truly the priority at the moment. My doctor son, Petter, on the front lines in the emergency room at Hennepin County

Hospital in Minneapolis, my RN sister-in-law with a full patient load at Providence Portland..... My guess is that each one of us could easily create a substantial list of people for whom we hope and pray each day.

In our Scripture passage for today, Jesus heads to his home town and stands before the congregation in the Temple. And he lays out his calling, what is essential to him:

<sup>18</sup>"The Spirit of the LORD is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, <sup>19</sup>to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor."

Jesus surely knows about how much we love our family, friends, faith communities, but he also makes clear that our calling also includes ALL the people. Especially those who tend to get left behind to fend for themselves. The poor, the prisoners, the blind, the oppressed.....

It was shocking and disheartening to me that the federal 'stimulus' aid package got held up by some US senators proposing doing less for low-income workers.

"Their goal was a cruel motive "to block trillions of dollars in aid amid the corona virus pandemic to deprive low wage workers of needed help." "And 3.3 million Americans applied for unemployment benefits were dismissed a 'not relevant' by Treasury Secretary Steve Mnuchin." (Oregonian)

Now truly, I have been told on a number of occasions," to stop being a bleeding-heart for others when we should just take care of our own." (quote from my brother.) I believe in the calling of Jesus in our lives. And I believe that "our own" is the <u>ALL</u> of creation.

God's power and love are most clearly seen in what we do for and with others. It shines when it builds people up, when our love, resources and actions help everyone, especially the least among us. The chief power of Jesus is to declare that God sees ALL of us, not just those that "the world" sees as important. We all count, we all matter.

Our calling is about the common good. We have an opportunity in the midst of this time, to see, not what is mine, but what is ours, not that my cupboard is full, but that yours is too. Let us ponder this Scripture and calling in our hearts as we listen to this incredible music by Anthem Lights.
