¿Cuál es la Quincena por la Libertad?



Cada año, diócesis de todo el país de los EE.UU. organizan eventos especiales pa-

ra poner de relieve la importancia de la defensa de la libertad religiosa. La Quincena por la Libertad es de junio de 21 al 4 de julio, Día de la Independencia en los EE.UU.

Los cristianos están comprometidos a cuidar a los vulnerables, y los migrantes y refugiados son unos de los más vulnerables. Desde hace tiempo, la Iglesia busca cubrir las necesidades específicas de la "gente que se desplaza", desde satisfacer las necesidades básicas y ayudar con el reasentamiento, hasta ofrecer servicios jurídicos para ayudar a los recién llegados a conocer el sistema de su país anfitrión. En los últimos años, se han propuesto nuevas leyes y normas que tienen el efecto de restringir la capacidad de la Iglesia de ofrecer servicios caritativos. En algunos casos, incluso llevar a una persona indocumentada a misa podría considerarse un delito penal. Estos tipos de políticas no solo son inhumanas, sino que también restringen la libertad de la Iglesia. La Iglesia está llamada a servir a los vulnerables, y el gobierno debería reconocer el derecho de la Iglesia a ofrecer este servicio. *Reza que el Señor proteja a todos los migrantes y refugiados, y que todos los que trabajan con gente que se desplazan, sean libres para servir.*



What is the Fortnight for Freedom?
Each year dioceses across America arrange events to highlight the importance of defending religious freedom. The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21—the vigil of the Feasts of St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More—to July 4, Independence Day.

How to Talk about Religious Freedom?
In this time of increasing polarization in our culture, we can contribute to a better understanding of religious freedom in a way that respects all people.
Drawing from the US Bishops', our parish bulletin is presenting ways to help Christians speak with friends and neighbors about religious freedom and work to clear up misconceptions about it.

May we be God's servants first
It is good to love one's country, but ultimate loyalty is due only to Christ and his kingdom. Nationalism becomes idolatrous when loyalty to the nation is more important than loyalty to Christ. Saints Thomas More and John Fisher show us what faithful citizenship looks like. They loved and served their country. But when they were forced to choose between God's Church and the king, they were faithful to the Church. May their example continue to illuminate the path for us, as we seek to faithfully serve our Church and country.

Freedom to bear witness to Truth We must stand up for the civil right to be free from government coercion. At the same time, we Christians must be mindful that our freedom comes from Christ, and so we are always free when we remain in Christ. When a government attempts to force us to violate our consciences, we must witness to the truth. A state that coerces the conscience of its citizens radically oversteps its proper boundaries. Rather than resist as a revolutionary, the Christian bears patient witness to the truth, even if that witness leads to punishment. The martyrs are great examples of this. Martyrdom is witnessing by one's life to the truth. In this respect, we are all called to be martyrs.

Pray that the Holy Spirit would give us the courage to bear witness to the truth of the Gospel, even in the face of social and legal pressure.

For the freedom of the Church
The Church is the body of Christ, the pilgrim people of God. She is not simply another charitable organization. The Church is called to carry forward the mission of Jesus Christ in all times and places. Much current work for religious freedom asks for exemptions from the state. But we should keep in mind that the government is not granting us rights. Rather, the state is correctly acknowledging the right of the Church to fulfill her purposes. As Pope Francis, echoing Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, has said, the Church is not merely an "NGO" (non-governmental organization). The Church is empowered by the Holy Spirit to carry out the mission of Christ, and a well functioning government will recognize its own limits and allow the Church the space to do her work.

Pray that the Church would have the space to carry out her mission of service and mercy for the whole world.
