TRANSPORTATION



Freight rates are still above average and trucks are limited. Mexico continues to experience a national fuel shortage. This has not yet affected supply crossing over yet. We will keep you informed as updated arrive

WEATHER



Southeast: Sunny with some rain early in the week. Warmer temperatures expected

Jalisco: Mostly sunny with hot temps during the day and cold nights

Yuma: Partly cloudy to sunny with hot temperatures

Coachella: Mostly cloudy with hot temps throughout the week

CROP REPORT



Apples – Good quality on all varieties. Market is steady but skewed to smaller sizes



Avocado - Markets continue to increase each week as small fruit is tight. CA crop will be extremely light this season



Banana – Market is steady, supplies have normalized, and quality is good



Blackberries – Supplies are light, yields have improved with an even higher increase expected next week



Blueberries – Conventional supplies are light. Imports have ended

CROP REPORT

Grapes – Market has settled; red grapes are keeping up with demand. Green volume is fair. Green market will be active in April



Lemons – Warmer weather is creating higher demand. Small fruit is tight



Limes – Supply is tight due to lower volume coming from Mexico



Melons Cantaloupe – Production will decline next week. Good demand is driving the market and sizing skews to 9cts and larger

CROP REPORT

Melon Honeydew – Production is steady with large sizes and good supply. Small sizes are light



Oranges – Market is steady.

Quality is good to very good with some minor issues due to recent rain



Pears – Supply and quality are good



Pineapple – Market is strong.
Conditions in Costa Rica are dry,
leading to slightly lower volumes
than normal

CROP REPORT



Raspberries – Good supply and quality available from Mexico



Strawberries – A favorable weather forecast should get growers back on track



Watermelon – Seedless is having its final push as the import season closes. Final arrivals are expected to come next week

Asparagus – Quality is good and supply has increased



Broccoli – The forecast in the coming weeks are for much less product

Cauliflower – Supply is very tight as normal winter varieties are not doing well. Growers are also struggling with labor



Carrots – Jumbos are still a concern but we are seeing improvements



Corn – Steady supply and good quality out of Florida



Celery – Fair to light volume from Mexico. Weather has slightly warmed, but sizing is still small. Extremely high prices

CROP REPORT



Cucumber – FL production has begun as Honduras winds down. Supplies are good out of Mexico. Demand is moderate



Eggplant – Good demand from the Lenten season is driving markets



Garlic – Supply is firm and markets are active



Ginger - Chinese markets are mixed, but quality is good. Product is available at higher costs from Brazil, Costa Rica, Honduras, and Peru




Green Cabbage – Markets are mixed this week. West coast supply is low due to yields. Short supply on reds but greens have improved

Green Onion – Quality is fair due to cold weather. Market continues to improve



Kale – Supplies this week have increased




Leaf Green and Red- Fair to good quality, insect damage, oversizing, and dehydration

Leaf Romaine – Poor to fair quality, large insect presence,

oversizing, burn, and cupping

CROP REPORT

Leaf Romaine Hearts - Supply and demand are fair due



Bell Pepper – Green market remains elevated this week with short supplies. Red and yellow market remains strong with very short supply of yellows

Potato – Market has increased, very limited supply on large cartons. Pricing is rising. Sizing remains smaller. Growers are moving to Burbanks

Spinach – Quality is fair with discoloration and mechanical damage

Squash – Good supply from FL and Mexico. Demand is average with good quality

CROP REPORT



AIMI

Tomato - Round: Market is mixed due to declining supply as winter crop winds down. Relief isn't anticipated until late March. Quality is mixed with stem decay and yellowing

Romas: Market is mixed due to declining supply. Good quality

Grapes: Market has increased as FL supply is down. Volume will increase over the next weeks. Quality is fair to good

Cherries: Continues to be steady this week. Supplies are light leading to higher pricing. Quality is fair to good in both regions
