

2. Shavings can be pre-purchased, or bought at check-in. Pens are set up on packed dirt floors (brand new packed arena type dirt). **Outside bedding will not be allowed!**

*The wool breeds may use straw, the dirt floor or bring carpet, artificial turf or shade cloth to bed on.

3. All breeding sheep must be registered in the recognized flock books of their respective breeds. Sheep not carrying proper ear identification at time of showing will be barred from competition. The official certificate of registration must be presented, and association ear tags or tattoos must correspond with the certificate. Applications of transfer or pending registrations will not be accepted.

4. Sheep must be registered in the name of the exhibitor by the day of the show.

5. Group classes: All animals in group classes must be owned by the same owner. Entries for group classes also must be shown in their respective single classes. Group classes must be entered at time of class entries.

6. Heelers will be allowed in the breeding show if they are exhibitors in the show as well.

7. Entry for the Chisholm Trail Showdown is limited to Texas only residents, and therefor health papers are not required.

8. Animals showing signs of ringworm, fungus or other communicable diseases will not be allowed to show and must be removed from show grounds.

Rambouillet, Hampshire, Suffolk, Dorset, Southdown, Royal White & ORB & ORWB Rules

- Fitting rules Hampshire, Suffolk, and Southdowns must be shorn above knees and hocks. Rambouillet, Delaine-Merino, Dorset, Royal White and some ORB/ORWB will be shown according to their breed standard. Shropshires and Dorsets can show fitted or slick sheared.
- 2. **Breeding Ages:** For the purpose of this show, the following will apply regarding ages of breeding sheep: Toothing of sheep to determine the age class in which they are shown will be determined by the exhibitor before check-in. Sheep with the following tooth development at check-in time will show in the listed classes. The top 4 placing animals in each class will be toothed at the conclusion of each class. If the toothing does not match the class, the entry will be disqualified. If you are not sure about your animal's age based on

teeth, please find Amanda. She can check your animal's teeth and assist you with making sure your animal is entered in the correct class.

 - c. Aged class 4 to 8 tooth class Sheep showing more than their first set of permanent incisors or have dropped one or more of their milk teeth from the second set of incisors. However, sheep must not have lost any of their 8 adult permanent incisors.

Purpose-this division is open to any registered breed of sheep. The goal is to showcase production females and their offspring, as applicable to sheep production, along with instilling good record keeping skills, money handling skills and public speaking in youth.

Record books of gains and associated costs to produce each animal will be kept and turned in via electronic format no later than October 18th. The production books are done online in google slides. Once entries are received a link to the form will be emailed to the exhibitor. They will have until the turn in deadline to work on the record book. Examples of the slides are listed at the bottom of these rules. Final placing and determination of "Champion producer" will be based off a combined score of the following

Live Show Ewe & lamb (production based) 30% Live Show Ewe & Lamb (placing in the age division) 30% Record book 20%

Interview 20%

This show is open to all breeds of sheep, but they must be registered The ewe and lamb(s) MUST be owned by the exhibitor or an immediate family member.

The ewe MUST have lambed after April 1, 2023 and MUST be the dam of the lamb(s) being shown

Lambs may be wethers, ewes or rams.

Sheep will be shown unhaltered(loose)

Live animals will be divided into workable classes at discretion of the show officials.

An exhibitor may show no more than (2) ewe/lamb projects in this division.

Ribbons will be awarded in each area of the competition thru 6th place.

A champion and reserve champion buckle will be awarded based on the combined score above.

Judging Points

Live Show Ewe & Lamb

Ewes will be properly washed and sheared for this competition, based on major show guidelines for their breed. Ewes can be clipped up to one month out or be carrying little hair/wool. Ewes will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Lambs will be properly washed and sheared for this competition (if weaned from the ewe). Lambs will be judged from a commercial production standpoint. Cull faults will still be penalized as will breeding soundness issues.

Animals will be shown unhaltered (loose). This will also include placing the projects in a 1st – 5th place and awarding points for these placings as well.

Record Book

The record book will encompass data on the ewe and lamb. Weight gains of the lamb will be recorded by the youth in their record book, along with monetary output of care for both the ewe and the lamb. A panel of 2 people will judge the record books on neatness, ease of reading, knowledge of project in relation to a commercial setting and effort by the youth member in maintaining accurate flock records. The two judge's scores will be combined for the final record book score. Record books will be judged, and scores calculated before the start of the show. They will be displayed during the sheep production show.

Interview

A live interview, by a panel of 2 individuals, will be conducted on 10/23 & 10/24 via Zoom. Topics and potential questions will relate to sheep husbandry, agriculture, their own animals, and record books. The four scores will be combined for the final interview score.

Point schedule

1st-7 points. 2nd-6 points. 3rd-5 points. 4th-4 points. 5th-3 points. 6th-2 points. All others-1 point.

CLASSIFICATION TERMS:

Acceptable: Characteristics that represent the breed. Discriminatory: Characteristics that are not reason for absolute disqualification but in combination with other discriminatory visual characteristics could lead to removal from a breed division. Absolute Disqualifications: Unfavorable visual characteristics resulting in removal from a breed division. Scur: Horn growth that is not completely attached to the skull. Birthmark: Dark pigmented skin with dark fiber present within the margins of the pigmentation.

SOUTHDOWN

Acceptable

- Hair color on muzzle should be mouse-colored, gray to brown and match color on legs and pasterns.
- Nostril pigmentation may be black to purplish-gray.
- Head and muzzle should be broad and proportional to body.
- Head of moderate length and in proportion to body.
- Ears of moderate length, in proportion to body, and covered with short hair or wool.
- Black hooves.
- Slight chalk around eyes.
- Slight chalk around muzzle.
- Spots or speckles in the skin only when shorn.

- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge.

WHITE DORPER

Acceptable

- Must be a White Dorper.
- Conformation: long, deep, wide body with well sprung ribs and excellent muscling.
- Color: White Dorper white sheep with black coloring less than the size of a nickle, and brown or red coloring less than the size of your hand
- Must have at least 1/3 hair primarily on belly and forearm.
- 100% hair below the knees and hocks.
- 100% hair forward of poll.
- Moderate size ear with no wool covering.
- Head should be strong, bold with a deep jaw.
- Polled or small horns or scurs.
- Spots or speckled pigment in the skin only when shorn.

Discriminatory

- Tall, leggy, shallow, and/or narrow-bodied lambs.
- A white sheep with brown or red colored speckles in the covering, confined to the head
- and neck.
- Tri-colored sheep
- Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm).
- Wool forward of poll.
- Heavy horns.
- Long, pendulous ears.
- Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute Disqualification

- All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly and forearm.
- Wool below the knees or hocks.
- Wool on the ears.
- Excessive amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth exceeding a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Solid brown, red, rust colored head.
- Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.
- Strong breed characteristics of breeds other than Dorper or White Dorper.
- Surgical alterations other than re-docking.
- Steep hip or tendency to show callipyge gene.
- Evidence of color alterations.
- If the animal is not classified as a white dorper due to coloring they will be moved to the Dorper class, however if the animal is not classified as either a white dorper or dorper they will be moved to the medium wool class.

DORPER

Acceptable

- Must be a Dorper.
- Conformation: long, deep, wide body with well sprung ribs and excellent muscling.
- Color: Dorper white sheep with black limited to head, neck, and forequarters not below the knee or behind the heart girth.
- Must have at least 1/3 hair primarily on belly and forearm.
- 100% hair below the knees and hocks.
- 100% hair forward of poll.
- Moderate size ear with no wool covering.
- Head should be strong, bold with a deep jaw.
- Polled or small horns or scurs.
- Spots or speckled pigment in the skin only when shorn.
- Black spots above the hoof line and below the dewclaw.

Discriminatory

- Tall, leggy, shallow, and/or narrow-bodied lambs.
- A limited amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth not to exceed a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Tri-colored sheep
- Excessive wool covering more than 2/3 of body (belly, forearm).
- Wool forward of poll.
- Heavy horns.
- Long, pendulous ears.
- Long, narrow muzzle.

Absolute Disqualification

- All wool or very little evidence of hair on belly and forearm.
- Wool below the knees or hocks.
- Wool on the ears.
- Excessive amount of dark fibered spots on body and underline behind heart girth exceeding a cumulative total of the size of a softball.
- Solid brown, red, rust colored head.
- Speckling or spots from knee to dewclaw or from hock to dewclaw.

Annabelle's Story


Production ewe M Bar W Ranch 2007 was born on May 20, 2020. This is her first time to lamb. In November 2021 I bred her to my ram "Grambo" (M Bar W Ranch 917), and on April 3, 2022 she delivered twins a ram and a ewe with no help.

The ram lamb weighed 9 pounds 9 ounces. The ewe lamb weighed 7 pounds 8 ounces. At birth they were given a dose of Doc Probiotics. On April 5th we docked their tails, gave them ear tags and their CD&T shot. The production ewe was also given her annual shot at this time.

Annabelle was a show sheep in 2020-2021 and 2021-2022. She was raised on High Noon Texas Extreme feed as a lamb, and then moved to High Noon Charmasson feed during her last show season. When she was done showing she was put into the big herd and moved to pasture only to get ready lamb in the spring of 2022. I will be showing her this year as an aged ewe as well as her two lambs.

Annabelle has been a good mom, and Bonnie & Clyde have been growing very good. They have been very healthy too, and are on High Noon Creep Feed.
