BEE KEEPING

When the equipment is in place package bees will be purchased and flown in. Ted will accompany the bees to make sure all the colonies are set up properly. (savannabee.com)

We are also in touch with a U.S. organization that propagates fruit trees from cell cultures. (treesthatfeed.com) We are hoping to make an initial purchase of 72 small trees - a few inches each, and grow them on in our shade house until they are big enough to distribute to farmers.

The bees and the trees should be here by November.

SOCIAL OUTREACH



We are presently involved with several families who do not have functioning bathrooms. In the situation pictured here an elderly lady managed some years ago to get a cesspit dug and then could not complete the job. We should have a functioning facility finished by the end of August.

We continue to be involved with the Emergency Shelter in Rolleville in maintaining the property and managing the use of the units.

Starve Poverty are collecting shoes for a shipment in September which will restock our shoe bank. A clothing bank now also operates and has recently had many clients. Our thanks to everyone who has donated clothing.

HOPE INTERNATIONAL



The organization Hope International, represented in Exuma by Ed and Kim Beneby, held a summer camp for children for two weeks at the campus. This is the third year of the camp. The Foundation provides the facility and helps with transport and equipment. A great effort from the volunteers.

This has been a busy time for the administration of the Murray DeYoung Scholarship Fund. Jenny and Trinity have been in constant touch over award details and making sure that our students are properly registered at The College. The Scholarship Fund pays tuition costs for Exuma Students who qualify. The award is ongoing as long as the students maintain at least a 3.0 grade point average.

We have received a letter from the Ministry of Education stating that when a new school is built they will release George Town Primary School to The Exuma Foundation so that it could be converted into a museum and Regatta Hall of Fame. Such a development would require funds being raised to make the conversion and for ongoing operational costs. Lester Smith has offered to head a fundraising effort to this end.

A preliminary meeting with other interested groups is planned to discuss how we might move forward.
