Both were then given the task of planning the logistics of moving nearly 200 employees along with their desks and computers to the new headquarters.

Due to their work, a significant portion of the sheriff's office workforce is housed under one roof, greatly improving the efficiency of operations. For the first time in 30 years, all science-related units are now located in one area. This includes Property and Evidence, Forensics, drug and digital forensics labs, Automated Fingerprint Identification System unit, and detectives. In addition to streamlined operations, the new headquarters provide four separate break areas, a fully equipped fitness center with

showers, and ample conference room space for employees to conduct daily meetings.
