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## “Best Practices Regarding Opioid Prescribing: CME Event Part 2”

Opioid abuse/misuse is a public health crisis in Rhode Island. Over the last 5 years, more than 1,000 people have died due to drug overdoses. In an effort to prevent opioid addiction and dependence, the Medical Society is sponsoring this

second of two educational activities to inform Rhode Island practitioners about the new 8-hour CME pain management requirements of the *Rules and Regulations for Pain Management, Opioid Use and the Registration of Distributors of Controlled Substances [R21-28-CSD]*.
