DON'T BE AFRAID, HE IS RISEN!

(Rom. 6:3-11; Matt. 28:1-10; Acts 10:34, 37-43; Col. 3:1-4; John 20:1-9)



In the Apostles' Creed we say, I believe in Jesus Christ...He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. What did He descend to the dead to do? Why did He descend to the dead in the first

place? He descended to the dead to go and wake Adam and Eve from their sleep. He descended to the dead to free all those who were held captive by the clutches of death. He descended to the dead in order to lock the gates of Hell, and thus prevent you and I from its imprisonment. "On the third day He rose again."

ALLELUIA! Rejoice, the Lord has indeed risen, alleluia! This is one of the ancient acclamations at Easter. Apostle Paul, writing to the Corinthians in A.D 56 about the living tradition of the Resurrection which he had learned after his conversion at the gates of Damascus, said: "In the first place, I have passed on to you what I myself received: that Christ died for our sins, as Scripture says; that He was buried; that He was raised on the third day, according to the Scriptures; that He appeared to Cephas and then to the Twelve...This is what we preach and this is what you believe" (1Cor. 15: 3-11). The mystery of Christ's resurrection is a real event with manifestations that were historically verified, as the New Testament bears witness. Indeed, this is what was preached to us and it is truly what we believe. Hence the Apostle further contends, "if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is empty and our belief comes to nothing...And if Christ has not been raised, your faith gives you nothing, and you are still in sin. Also those who fall asleep in Christ are lost."

Surely, you and I are not lost! Easter is the feast of life. This is the day that reveals, "Our belief has not been futile." Christ has risen from the dead! At the Easter Vigil we lit the Paschal Candle and our little candles symbolizing Christ as Light of the universe. The ceremony draws on the symbolism of light versus darkness – truth versus falsehood – hope versus despair – life versus death. The fire that we lit at Easter Vigil burns out the works of darkness in us and restores us to a new life in Christ. Darkness has been overcome and those who were dead in sin are raised to new life in Christ Jesus. Christ Who descended to the dead has risen and has brought us to new life in Him! Christ, our light has risen from the dead, let us rejoice and be glad!

For the people who walk in the darkness of sin, ignorance and insecurity, Christ's light is shone upon them. Alleluia, Christ is risen! You and I have been raised with Him, therefore, we must "seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth." In other words, you and I must not become captivated by the glitter of life nor be infected with contemporary commercialism so that we lose sight of the things of heaven. God has raised Christ our light from the dead, hence let no part of you remain in darkness. During these tough economic times, do all that you can to bring the light of the risen Christ to those who are less fortunate.

We have witnessed Him Who rose from the dead; we must proclaim Him to all men and women. "Do not be afraid! Go and tell My brothers (and sisters)..." about the good news and help bring the risen Christ to them to heal their sickness and give relief to their pains.
