RCSD Arts in Education Program

Instructions to Apply for Funding

Criteria:

- 1. Any RCSD teacher can apply for any subject, any classroom, any program. We encourage applications from teachers of non-arts subjects, as well as art teachers.
- 2. Projects or programs must have an arts component and take place during regular school hours. Parts of the project can take place after or before school hours (e.g. concerts, public performances, exhibits or presentations).
- 3. Projects should reach out to the maximum number of students to ensure equity of access. Funding is partly based on numbers of students directly served.

Deadlines -- PLEASE NOTE -- Deadlines have changed!!

Applications should be filed as early as possible. Our funds are limited and full funding is not always possible, especially in the second half of the year. We don't want anyone to be disappointed or surprised if full funding is not granted. We can help you find other funding sources should we be unable to fully fund a proposal.

Applications must be filed at least <u>8 – 10 weeks before</u> visit/residency/event. *Please have forms in by the 15th* of the month for consideration in that month's cycle. Applications will be considered once per month, after the 15th of each month. *Please note* – allow more time during school vacation times – Dec/Mar/April. If your event takes place in the first two weeks of a month, allow more time. (e.g., Early March event; file by <u>Dec</u>. 15th; mid-late March event, file by <u>Jan.</u> 15)

Reason for Deadlines: We are now working more closely with the BOCES program. This new two month lead time is necessary to process the paperwork and ensure prompt payment to your teaching artist.

Exceptions: We understand that some artists are available to us on a last-minute notice and we can consider exceptions to this deadline -- under special circumstances only.

Filing Procedures:

- 1. Fill out the attached form, <u>have approved by building principal</u>, and return to: **Curriculum & Instruction Office -- Attention: Mary Ann Bovee** 871-5570 ext. 5560 Please include all information about contractual needs of the artist.
- 2. Notification of approval for funding will be sent to the applicant.
- 3. All negotiations and contracts for payment of services and expenses must be approved by RCSD through this process. Teachers may not make guarantees to or verbal or written contracts with artists about fees, expenses, housing, transportation or other remuneration. All artists will be paid by RCSD, unless otherwise noted.
