Welcome to Immanuel! Welcome to worship. “The Lord is great and worthy of our praise,” said the psalmist (48:1). Therefore let us joyously unite together as we sing, pray, listen to God’s word and share with God and one another. Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Please join us for fellowship after the service.

Guests: Please sign our guest book, or a guest card in the pew and place in the offering plate before leaving.

Scripture Lessons for next Sunday: Isaiah 60:1–6, Ephesians 3:1–12 and Matthew 2:1–12.

Stewardship: Luke 2:38 – “And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.” Notice here how giving thanks to God leads to good works (speaking about Jesus, in this case). Thankfulness toward God for all He has done for us is the foundation of a Christian life lived in godliness. For if we know all that the Lord has done for us, how can we not strive to honor Him with what we think, say, and do?

Communion Statement: As we learn from 1 Corinthians, when we commune together we make a confession of our oneness in doctrine and understanding of God’s Word. Since those who show publicly that they agree with the teachings believed, taught, and confessed by the Pastor and congregation at which the Sacrament is distributed, we ask that those who are not members in good standing of a congregation of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, or one of our sister churches to please refrain from partaking of the Sacrament. Instead, if you would like to receive a blessing, you are more than welcome to come to the altar rail and please indicate you would like to receive a blessing by crossing your arms in front of your chest. A list of church bodies with whom we share Altar and Pulpit fellowship is posted on the bulletin board in the hallway. If you would like to visit about this doctrine and practice, please talk to Pastor or an Elder. For further study on this matter see Matthew 5:23ff, 18:15-35, 26:26-39; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20 and 1 Cor. 11:17-34. Thank you.

Nunc Dimittis

At Christmas, we celebrate the advent of Immanuel, "God with us." Eight days after his birth, Jesus was presented at the temple in Jerusalem. Luke's Gospel records there was a man named Simeon present in the temple when Jesus was brought there. This man had one foot in the Old Testament and the other in the New Testament as the Holy Spirit revealed to him that he would not taste death before seeing the Lord's Christ. Upon holding this baby Messiah in his arms, Simeon exclaimed the well-known words of the Nunc Dimittis, which is Latin for "Depart in peace." Holding his salvation in his very arms, Simeon said, "O Lord, now lettest Thou Thy servant depart in peace, according to Thy Word; for mine eyes have seen Thy salvation." He could now die happy, confident that through this little child redemption was now made his.

This song is not only Simeon's but is our own song. Perhaps even more ours than Simeon's. The timing of this canticle in the Divine Service makes this very clear. It comes just after the distribution of Holy Communion, when this same Christ is presented in the temple of the New Jerusalem, the Church. We have taken this Jesus not only in our arms like Simeon, but we have held him even closer as we have received Him into our very souls through the eating and drinking of His true body and blood. And whereas Simeon was looking forward to the redemption that His Savior would accomplish, we receive that forgiveness, life, and salvation in this Sacrament. Thanks to the Lord's benefits, we may "depart in peace," knowing that even if we were to die on our way home from church that we would be received into the everlasting arms of our heavenly Father. May we ever boldly sing Simeon's song as history repeats itself at an altar near you.
