When looking for things to do, places to eat + drink, where to purchase supplies, etc, we *strongly*
suggest you go to this review site. Yelp.com Be sure to search for “Camden Tn” and “Holladay, Tn”
The local reviews are pretty accurate and made by real customers. (Be sure to check the “filtered”
ones too, at bottom left of the review box). Some of our local business folk, (who do not do their
best, have a tendency to flag everything not connected with them, sadly thinking that will get
them more business).

The closest town is Camden, Tn 38320, 16 miles away (via Hwy 641 or our Hwy191a.k.a. Birdsong
Road). Camden, Tennessee has a Wal-mart, IGA Grocery, Freds, Save-a-lot, Dollar General, Dollar-
Tree, Auto-zone, O'Reilly's, McDonalds, Taco-Bell, Subway, Sonic, Wendy's, Domino's, Pizza Hut, as
well as a few local restaurants.

However, we live so close to the interstate (and depending on your needs), we feel it is just as fast
and easy to hop on the highway and head to Dickson - 41 miles, (37055) or Jackson - 54 miles,
(38305) or Lexington - 35 miles, (38351).

That stated, Birdsong Road is the quintessential winding road with lovely views. So, if you go to New
Johnsonville (21 miles) and/or go a little further onto Waverly (29 miles, with a Wal-mart + a little
more businesses), you will find everything you might need.

Finally! Camden has a few package, Liquor Stores, (wine & hard alcohol) Hillbilly Liquor, 211 hwy 641,
has the better selection to Camden Liquor, 151 Hwy 641. You may only purchase beer and 'malt'
coolers at Gas Stations and Grocery Stores. However, here in Benton County Tn, the “Sunday Blue
Law” sales times are extremely silly, so save yourself the trouble, go to Hurricane Mills (exit 143) or any
larger town. Sadly, still NO Restaurants in our Benton County serve beer, wine or liquor . Also, in
Tennessee, NO Wine/Liquor is sold (packaged) on Sunday, except at Restaurants / Bars.

We **do** have a two screen Drive-in Movie Theatre, each showing a double-feature on Friday and
Saturday nights, starting at dusk. <http://BirdsongDrive-In.com/NowShowing.html> The drive is less than
11 miles away! ☺

Benton County, Tennessee lies along the scenic shores of the nation's largest manmade reservoir. Created in the mid 1900s by the Tennessee Valley Authority, TVA constructed the Kentucky Dam on the Tennessee River creating the Kentucky Lake providing electrical power, transportation, and recreation. Thousands of visitors come to Benton County each year to enjoy the many water related, recreational activities including hunting, fishing, boating, skiing, swimming, sightseeing, viewing of wildlife, heritage, history, and so very much more. The northern point of the Benton County peninsula, where the Big Sandy River and Tennessee River meet, is considered to be one of the top birding locations in the country; especially to the southern portion of the county where the Duck River converges with the Tennessee. Ichthyologists have discovered a greater variety of fish species than any other impoundment in the nation including all of the Great Lakes combined. With shoreline controlled by TVA, The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency and U.S. Fish and Wildlife, visitors enjoy the pristine, natural beauty of this enticing water enthusiast's paradise.

Patsy Cline Memorial - Visit the historic site where country music stars Patsy Cline, Cowboy Copas, Hawkshaw Hawkins, and pilot Randy Hughes tragically lost their lives in a plane crash March 5, 1963. A stone monument, located 2.8 miles north of Camden on Mt. Carmel Rd stands in their honor. I have heard tell that there are also individual stones where each body was recovered, however, we have yet to find any of them. A new walkway project has just been completed at the site. This is the first of several improvements planned for the memorial. (731) 584-8395

Tennessee River Folk-life Museum - Located atop scenic Pilot Knob in Nathan Bedford Forrest State Park. The museum features a collection of artifacts, educational displays, and audio and video recordings depicting the history of life on the Tennessee River from early man to Native American Indians to present day. Displays include early arts and crafts, logging on the river, musseling, the fresh water pearl industry, and much more. The centerpiece of the museum is a brailing boat once used to harvest mussels from the river bed. A must-see during your visit to beautiful Benton County. From I-40 Exit 126 the Nathan Bedford Forrest exit, go north to Camden and follow the signs to the park. For more information contact the park office at (731) 584-6536

Pilot Knob - The highest point in West Tennessee, featuring a scenic overlook area, Pilot Knob overlooks the scene of the Battle of Johnsonville, one of the most distinctive battles in the Civil War. General Nathan Bedford Forrest and his troops defeated a fleet of Union gunboats on the Tennessee River. It is one of a very few occasions in recorded history in which a land based military force ever defeated a naval force. Find out all about this famous battle at a memorial site atop Pilot Knob, located inside scenic Nathan Bedford Forrest State Park on beautiful Kentucky Lake. Duck River Scenic Overlook (link) - (THIS RESERVE STARTS JUST ACROSS THE STREET FROM US!) - Developed in the fall of 2003, this breathtaking new Benton County attraction, located on the Duck River Unit of the Tennessee National Wildlife Refuge, offers a spectacular view of the Tennessee River Valley from high above. Located just a few miles north of exit 133 on Interstate 40 in Tennessee, this overlook also provides visitors with a wonderful vantage point for viewing wildlife such as, deer, migratory ducks, geese and songbirds, squirrels, rabbits and much more. Visitors to the overlook may even get a glimpse of the eagles that nest in the area

Tennessee National Wildlife Refuge - A haven for many species of animals, including bald eagles, this refuge manages for migratory birds and offers unparalleled wildlife viewing year-round. Seasonal quota hunts for whitetail deer, and non-quota hunts for turkey, raccoon and squirrel are popular with sportsmen. The Big Sandy Unit is located in the northern end of the Big Sandy Peninsula. The Tennessee National Wildlife Refuge consists of three units, the Big Sandy Unit, the Duck River Unit, and the Busseltown Unit. The Duck River Unit covers an area along the southern shore of the Tennessee River in Benton County as well as an area across the river in Humphreys County. Call (731) 642-2091 or [e-mail them](#)

The Benton/Houston Ferry – (this is a blast, real "old school") - More than just a practical mode of transportation, the Benton/Houston Ferry is also a great scenic diversion. It is one of only two ferries currently operating in the State of Tennessee and it reduces a one and a half hour trip by road to approximately seven minutes connecting Benton and Houston Counties. Hours of operation: 5:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. 6:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Saturday and Sunday. All day pass: 75 cents for area- residents and \$2.00 for non-residents.

Big Sandy Waterfowl Festival & DUCK BLIND DRAWING - First Saturday in August - This popular festival features hunting oriented displays and merchandise. TWRA draws for duck blind usage for the upcoming year on the wildlife management areas.

Carroll County Fair - August

Benton County Fair - Late August - Held in early August, this traditional county fair includes judging of produce and livestock, beauty pageants, live grandstand entertainment, a wide variety of food and refreshments, games and giveaways, fireworks, exhibits and much more as well as the popular carnival midway. On Wednesday evening, the fair hosts the popular Colgate Country Showdown singing competition sponsored by WFWL/WRJB Radio.

Benton County Bargain Highway / Thirty-Mile Yard Sale - Labor Day weekend. Residents set up yard sales in front yards, garages, open fields, and parking lots along the official 30-mile route stretching through Big Sandy, Camden and Holladay. In just a few short years, Benton County Bargain Highway has become one of the premier events in the region

drawing thousands of visitors from all parts of the country. Traditionally, the event consists of approximately 200 yard sales along the official 30-mile route with additional sales throughout the county. Benton County Bargain Highway is a bargain hunter's paradise. In 2011, the Benton County/Camden Chamber of Commerce will again sponsor a \$1,000 giveaway. Shoppers register at official yard sale sites for a chance to win prize.

Big Sandy Christmas Parade - Big Sandy Chamber of Commerce will host the fourth annual Big Sandy Christmas Parade. Scheduled for Saturday, December 3, 2011, the parade will begin at 2:00 with related Christmas festivities throughout the day.

Lighting of the Knob - Early December – Nathan Bedford Forrest State Park lights up the area atop Pilot Knob and the Tennessee River Folk-life Museum in a breathtaking display of holiday splendor. In addition to the museum stands a memorial to the Civil War Battle of New Johnsonville.

Magic Valley Christmas Parade - Scheduled for Saturday, December 10, 2011 in Camden. This year's parade will begin at 3:30 p.m. and will be followed by a Christmas Walk and a Festival on the Square. The Christmas Walk will consist of open houses by many of the local businesses designed to allow last minute shoppers an opportunity to pick up those final gifts and help boost Christmas sales for local merchants.

2013 - March - Patsy Cline Memorial/Tribute Weekend - Construction of a new, more accessible walkway at the site has been completed. Plans include benches along the walk. A second walkway is planned along with a new memorial sign at the entrance recognizing all four victims of the crash. In time, the Chamber of Commerce hopes to create a new monument at the site. The Chamber's Patsy Cline Memorial Committee is considering several ideas aimed at reviving the memorial weekend in March with an eye forward to a huge 50th anniversary tribute and memorial in March of 2013. Organizers are looking for additional ways to recognize not only Patsy Cline, but also the other victims of the crash, Hawkshaw Hawkins, Cowboy Copas and Randy Hughes.

The Duck River winds through the south-central part of the Volunteer State. The flowing water of the Duck River lends itself to a canoe trip or a float in a flat bottom- jon boat while casting your cares away.

Native fish are many. Crappie, Bass and Pan-fish along with some rainbow trout all present prospective targets for the visitors to this spot. Small artificial lures like in line spinners, small soft plastic grubs and some topwater baits all entice fish.
