How to Enter

STEP 1: GO TO <https://nemo.fairwire.com/>

STEP 2: REGISTER FOR SHOWWORKS ACCOUNT.

STEP 3: SELECT YOUR DEPARTMENT

STEP 4: SELECT YOUR DIVISION

STEP 5: SELECT YOUR CLASS

STEP 6: ADD ENTRY TO CART or ADD ANOTHER ENTRY.

STEP 10: UPLOAD PICTURES, ANSWER THE 3 QUESTIONS FOR RESPECTIVE CLASSES AND UPLOAD AS A .PDF AND/OR VIDEOS REQUIRED TO SUBMIT ENTRY.

VIRTUAL SHOW RULES

1. All entries must be turned in online. No exceptions. All requirements are detailed on online registration.
2. The exhibitor must be a current Adair County 4-H or FFA Member.
3. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the exhibit is shown in its current condition. Photos and videos MUST NOT be taken before July 14, 2020. Where an exhibit is an animal, the exhibit must be alive and in the hands of occupancy of the exhibitor on the date of entry submission.
4. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the media used for the entry is a true representation of the condition of the exhibit and has not been enhanced or altered in any way.
5. By entering this competition, the Exhibitor undertake that the content submitted for entry can be used by The NEMO Fair for promotional media and educational material.
6. Virtual Ribbons only will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd Places.
7. ALL exhibits maybe displayed on the NEMO Fair Facebook page. Judging results and comments will also be displayed. Winning entries will be acknowledged at the completion of the Online Show and winning exhibitors identified in Facebook posts.
8. The exhibitor and exhibit photos may be SHARED on NEMO Fair Facebook page as part of the competition advertising campaign.
9. Any entry maybe featured in the Online Show Grand Parade.
10. Always remember, the soul objective of this event is to provide a friendly competition that celebrates exhibition and encourages participation in agricultural shows.
11. The judging panel's decision is FINAL, and no correspondence will be entered into.
12. The Participant acknowledges that due to the nature of the activities required in support of an online entry, it would be unreasonable for the Group to be in any way responsible for any injury to or death of the Participant. SHOWMANSHIP

Beef, Sheep, Goats & Swine

Entries to the Showmanship for Beef, Sheep, Goats & Swine are to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor leading the exhibit and standing with the animal for assessment. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

Poultry

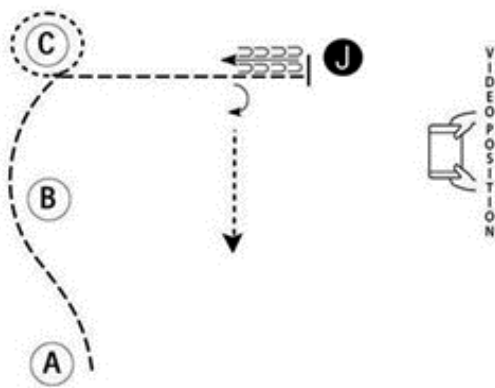
Entry to contain a 60 second video of the exhibitor handling their bird, showing the audience the main features of the breed and of their bird. The Judge will be looking for the exhibitor to identify three main features of the breed, two strong characteristics of their bird and two weaknesses of their bird.

Rabbit

Entry to contain a 60 second video of the handling their rabbit, showing the audience the main features of the breed and of their rabbit. The Judge will be looking for the exhibitor to identify three main features of the breed, two strong characteristics of their rabbit and two weaknesses of their rabbit.

Horse Showmanship

Entry to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor and horse following the pattern found below.



1. Be ready at cone A
2. Trot from cone A, around cone B to cone C
3. Walk a tight circle around cone C
4. Trot to judge
5. Stop and set up for inspection
6. When dismissed, back 5 steps
7. Execute a 90-degree haunch turn to the right, walk away
8. Pet your horse to signal completion

Horsemanship

Entry to contain a 60 to 90 second video of the Exhibitor and horse following the pattern found below. (**Novice Exhibitors trot instead of lope.**)

Begin before A at a jog.

1. Jog from A to B.
2. At B, lope on the left lead and circle at B as shown. Stop facing B.
3. Turn 1/4 turn to the left.
4. Back one horse length.
5. Jog to C. Stop at C.

Follow the instructions of your ring steward.

Sheep showmanship questions

- 1.) What is the oil in the fleece (wool) of a sheep called?
- 2.) Name a meat breed of sheep.
- 3.) What is the average daily weight gain of a market lamb?

Market Goat showmanship questions

- 1.) What is the ideal age for a market goat to be shown?
- 2.) What is the average daily weight gain of a market goat?
- 3.) How long is the gestation period for a goat?

Beef Showmanship

- 1.) What is the normal temperature for a cow?
- 2.) How many stomachs does a cow have?
- 3.) How long is the gestation period for a cow?

Swine Showmanship

- 1.) What is a gilt?
- 2.) What is the normal temperature of a hog?
- 3.) How long is the gestation length of a sow?

Rabbit Showmanship

- 1.) How much should you feed your rabbit per day?
- 2.) What do you call a spotted rabbit?
- 3.) What is a baby rabbit called?

Poultry Showmanship

- 1.) What is the difference between a hen and a pullet?
- 2.) What are the most common feed ingredients for poultry in the United States?
- 3.) Why should birds be removed from and placed into cages head first?

ALL LIVESTOCK SHOW CLASSES

Entries to the above classes to contain a 60 to 90 second video to include (1) side profile of the animal standing for assessment, (2) from the rear of the animal standing for assessment and (3) the exhibitor and exhibit side on, in a staging pose. The Judge will be looking for the Exhibitor to show control of the animal and ability to display the animal to its greatest potential.

BUILDING EXHIBITS

Entries to the above classes to contain a photo of the exhibitor with the exhibit and 1 photo of the exhibit showing the detail of the entry.

For example: Foods add 1 photo of recipe used. Sewing add 1 photo of the seam.

BUILDING EXHIBIT QUESTIONS

Answer the 5 questions and upload as a .pdf.

1. Describe how you did your project and any challenges you may have experienced.
2. Tell me about some of the things you like best about your project.
3. Describe the instruction and help you received from others.
4. Describe three things you learned from completing this project.
5. Tell me what you would do to improve this project if you were to do it again.

JUDGING PANEL

Each Division will be judged by a judge or panel of judges who are experienced in the Division and have been invited to judge due to their involvement and expertise in this area.

GRAND PARADE

Following the close of entries, and waiting on the judge's decision, a series of videos will be made compiling all the entries received to showcase the diversity of the Show Movement and all the wonderful stories that go behind these fabulous exhibits. To fulfill this, it is important a picture of the Exhibitor and Exhibit is sent in as part of your entry.

PRESENTATION

Starting on July 29, 2020 the Judges results will be released, and the winning entries will be published in a series of posts.
