University of Missouri/OFA Hip Dysplasia Biomarker Study

In partnership with the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA), the University of Missouri's Thompson Laboratory for Regenerative Orthopedics is researching a new way to predict Canine Hip Dysplasia (CHD) by looking at blood and urine samples in puppies between 4 and 6 months old. Participants are currently being recruited for this study.

Study Goal

Validate the Mizzou Canine Hip Dysplasia Biomarker Panel as a predictor of Canine Hip Dysplasia in client-owned dogs.

Purpose

While the traditional pelvic X-ray screening method is very accurate for diagnosing and grading CHD in mature dogs, an accurate predictive tool of CHD in puppies would be beneficial for owners to make earlier and more informed decisions regarding the future health, care, performance, and breeding decisions of their dogs.

At the University of Missouri's Thompson Lab, a team of veterinarians and researchers have developed a method using blood and urine proteins such as those associated with join inflammation and cartilage deterioration to predict if young puppies would develop hip dysplasia or not.

The panel, named the Mizzou Canine Hip Dysplasia Biomarker Panel, proved successful in a small cohort of puppies when they were only 5 months old. Now, the research team is partnering with the OFA to continue to research to fully validate this biomarker panel by testing fluid samples from up to 500 puppies between the ages of 4 and 6 months. Later, the dogs will be radiographed at 1 and 2 years of age through the standard OFA hip dysplasia screen process, and the team will see if the biomarker panel accurately predicted the presence or absence of CHD.

NEW All-Breed BIS RECORD

Most probably remember when "Conrad" –MBIS MBISS Am GCHP2 Syringa-Akadia The Corsair CC AOM – won Group 1st at the Westminster Kennel Club Dog Show last February, in 2020.

Last December, Conrad broke the All-Breed Best In Show record and officially becomes the Top BIS Winning Sheltie in the history of the breed! The record was held for over 30 years by "Acey" - Ch Karelane Royal Flush o'Kismet ROM. Acey was bred by D. Rockwell and Guy Mauldin. He was handled by Guy and Thelma Mauldin and Lloyd Graser Jr.
