You know that saying, "one man's trash is another man's treasure?"

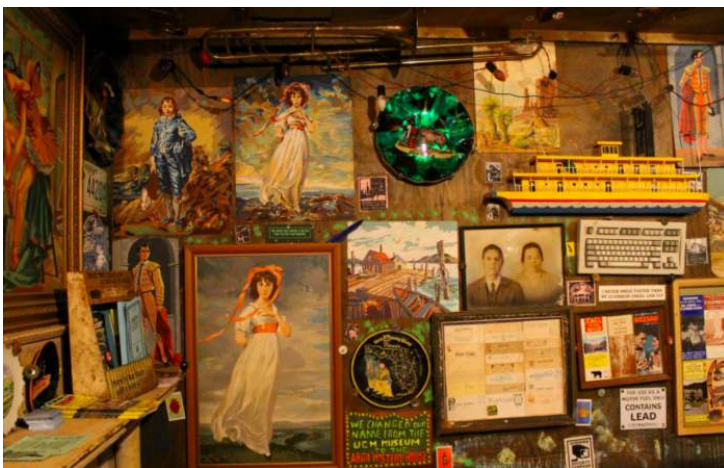




Well, Preble took that to heart and made it his personal motto.
